Due to limited resources, major surgery cannot be carried out on the Showgrounds, duty veterinarians can only provide first aid and treat medical conditions which do not require surgery.

REGULATIONS OF DAIRY CATTLE COMPETITION

101. The Regulations appearing in this Schedule form part of the General Regulations and conditions of entry to an Event at the Royal Melbourne Show. In the event of any inconsistency between the General Regulations and these Regulations, the General Regulations shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless the General Regulations provide otherwise.

CLOSE OF ENTRIES AND NOMINATIONS

102. Applications for the number of spaces (animals) and section(s) each Exhibitor will be exhibiting, must be made on the Official Entry Form and must be received at the RAS's Administration Office, located at Melbourne Showgrounds, Gate 5, Langs Road, Ascot Vale, 3032, by 5:00pm on Friday 6 July 2007.

103. All associated fees, (i.e.: Bedding, Feed Shed, Catalogues, Clipping Frame Space, Truck Parking) must be paid at the time of entry.

104. A completed Cattle Herd Health Status Declaration for Shows and Sales must accompany the Official Entry Form.

105. Upon receipt of the Official Entry Form, Exhibitors will be forwarded an Official Nomination Form, to be completed with the name/s of animals, registration numbers, copies of registration certificates and classes to be entered. The Official Nomination Form must be returned to The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria Limited by 5:00pm on Friday 17 August 2007.

106. Only Exhibitors who have entered with the Official Entry Form by Friday 6 July 2007 will be eligible to submit an Official Nomination Form.

107. There will be no late Official Entry Forms or Official Nomination Forms accepted under any circumstances. The onus is entirely on the Exhibitor to submit particulars on time. There will be no reminder from the RAS.

108. Exhibitors may nominate up to, and not exceeding, 150% of the spaces entered.

109. Exhibitors must notify the RAS Cattle Section of their final team selection no later than 5:00pm on Friday 7 September 2007. Team selection can only be made from those officially entered and cannot exceed the number of spaces nominated. One space will be provided to each Exhibit.

110. There is no restriction on the number of Exhibits entered in each class.

ENTRY FEES AND BEDDING FEES

111. Entry fees for Dairy Cattle breeds are as follows:

\$60.00 each (GST Free) for Members

\$90.00 each (GST Free) for Non-members

112. Bedding fees for Dairy Cattle breeds are as follows:

\$55.00 per head (GST inc.)

STORAGE LOCKERS

113. Storage Locker prices are \$55.00 (GST inc.) of which \$20.00 is a key deposit which will be refunded on return of locker key. Refund will be issued on return of key. Due to limited Storage Lockers, we reserve the right to limit allocation in an effort to accommodate all Exhibitors.

TRUCK PARKING

114. Parking for Trucks and Floats will be available. Apply by completing the relevant section on the Entry Form, and forward the fee with the competition entry fee.

115. Truck Parking fees for 2007 will be:

116. There is to be no camping in the Truck Park under any circumstances.

117. Any vehicle, including trucks, stock transports, trailers, and horse floats, located on the Showgrounds, or any area leased by the RAS, shall be at the sole risk of the owner. The RAS accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage, including loss or damage caused by negligence of the RAS, its officers, employees, or agents to any vehicle, or the contents of any vehicle, located on the RAS's property or any area leased by the RAS.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF EXHIBITS

118. There is strictly no access to the Showgrounds for Dairy Cattle Exhibitors prior to 6:00pm Thursday 20 September 2007.

119. Dairy Cattle Exhibits can arrive from 6:00pm to 11:00pm Thursday 20 September 2007.

120. All Dairy Cattle Exhibits will depart between 5:30pm and 8:30pm on Tuesday 25 September 2007. All Exhibits, together with equipment and personal belongings, must be off grounds no later than 8:30pm on Tuesday 25 September 2007.

121. Priority may be given to those that have considerable distance to travel.

ELIGIBILITY OF EXHIBITS

122. An animal shall not be admitted to the Showgrounds, unless it is entered for exhibition.

123. Bull Classes are not offered at the Royal Melbourne Show. Dairy breed bulls shall not be admitted to the Showgrounds.

STANDARD OF EXHIBITS AND INSPECTIONS

124. The standard of Exhibits shall be subject to the Rules and Regulations pertaining to the Breed Standards as accepted by the relevant Breed Society and as approved by the RAS.

125. Every animal exhibited in the Dairy Cattle section at the Royal Melbourne Show will be subject to an inspection, carried out by an Inspector appointed by the RAS.

126. Each Breed Society or Association shall put forward nominations for these appointments for their breed, and these nominations will be considered by the RAS.

127. Exhibitors are required to have their stock attended and clean in readiness for inspection by not later than 8:00am on the relevant day. The Inspector(s) shall on the relevant day make every effort to submit their report by 1:00pm to the RAS.

128. No Exhibitor shall be permitted to exhibit any cattle bearing marking brands or tattoos not consistent with those shown on the relevant entry form or Breed Society records.

129. Exhibitors are strongly advised to inspect marking brands and tattoos prior to lodging entry forms and before departure for the show.

130. Without prejudice to any other applicable rules, if the relevant Inspector determines that any animal entered for exhibition:

- is not true to type; or
- is not of sufficient merit as to be worthy of exhibit in the class or classes for which it is entered; or
- has not been adequately prepared for the Show; or
- bears any marking brand or tattoo inconsistent with the markings brand or tattoo disclosed in the relevant entry form or Breed Society Records or whose tattoo is not clearly legible; or
- is in breach of the rules under the heading "Tampering of Exhibits";

then such animal shall be deemed to be ineligible for exhibition at the Show

131. Any animal infected by ringworm or warts shall be deemed to be ineligible for exhibition at the Show. The Inspectors shall report any animal which they believe to be infected by ringworm or warts and the RAS's Veterinary Surgeon shall inspect such animal for the purpose of determining whether the animal is so infected.

132. Without prejudice to the General Regulations, the determinations of the Inspectors or of the Veterinary Surgeons on any matter shall be subject only to appeal to the Chief Steward in the Dairy Cattle Section who shall make such determinations and directions as they deem appropriate. Such appeal shall be accompanied with a deposit of \$50 which may be forfeited to the RAS if in the sole opinion of the Chief Steward the appeal is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious.

133. The Inspectors, Veterinary Surgeons, Chief Stewards, or their assistants shall not be required to furnish to the Exhibitor any reasons for their determinations or directions nor to give the Exhibitor any right to be heard on any matter in question.

134. Notwithstanding any other provision in the regulations, where the RAS determines that any animal entered in the Dairy Cattle Section has received hormones, then such animal shall be deemed to be ineligible for exhibition at the Show. Any determination made by the RAS pursuant to this regulation shall be final.

135. The RAS may make or cause to be made, at any time during the period of exhibition, an inspection or any test of an Exhibit to determine whether a breach of the regulations under the heading of Standard of Exhibits and Inspections has occurred. If, as a result of a breach of any of these regulations, an animal is deemed to be ineligible for exhibition at the Show, the RAS may by notice to the Exhibitor require the animal be forthwith removed from the Showgrounds. The Exhibitor, upon receipt of such notice, shall forthwith remove such animal and, failing such removal by him within the time prescribed by the RAS, the RAS may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed and all costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the Exhibitor and shall be refunded to the RAS. Any determination made by the RAS pursuant to this regulation shall be final.

136. If an award has been made to an Exhibit deemed to be ineligible under these regulations, any prize awarded will be forfeited and, subject to General Regulation 10.5, Exhibits in the next order may be promoted to that prize.

TAMPERING OF EXHIBITS

137. Notwithstanding General Regulation 7.4, no Exhibitor shall be permitted to exhibit any cattle which, in the opinion of the RAS, displays evidence of being tampered with or, in the definition of the class in which it is entered, an animal entered for exhibition or competition is not presented in its natural conformation and has no preparation other than normal feeding and fitting with the exception of normal dressing of hair, hoofs and horns.

The following practices are strictly prohibited.

- a) An operation or any kind of surgery materially altering the structure or the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body.
- b) The infusion or injection of any drugs or any other substance or the insertion of any object into the teats, blood vessels, muscles or under the skin of any animal to alter its natural physical attributes. This includes the transfer of milk between quarters.
- c) The setting of the teats of an animal with any form of glue or other setting substance or any other action which alters the natural teat placement of an animal.

Evidence of such practices renders an Exhibit liable to instant disqualification and the Exhibitor or his/her agent liable to a suspension ranging from 5 years to lifetime.

138. Teat sealing in order to create a physical barrier which assists to prevent environmental invasion and milk leakage is permitted, provided that:

- a) the teat is disinfected and sterilised prior to application; and
- b) application is to the external teat end with an approved sealant or registered veterinary product to form the seal which must not enter or breach the teat sphincter; and
- c) the seal is removed prior to milking without damaging the tissue.

139. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to ensure the animal is not subject to prohibited practices, prior to and whilst on the Showgrounds.

140. The RAS may make or cause to be made, any test of any Exhibit to determine whether any drug or other substance has been administered to the Exhibit and may take possession of any such Exhibit for any of the aforesaid purposes and detain such Exhibit for such period as the RAS deems necessary. Procedures for the testing of prohibited substances may include random tests on Exhibits.

141. Should a positive test to a prohibited substance or practice result, any costs associated with testing will be borne by the Exhibitor.

TINTING AND/OR COLOURING OF COAT

142. Should the RAS or appointed Inspector, be of the opinion that the coat of any Exhibit has been tinted and/or coloured in any way, then such an animal shall be deemed to be ineligible for exhibition at the Show.

HEALTH DECLARATION

143. All exhibits must be declared free of T.B., Brucellosis, Johne's Disease and other notifiable diseases.

144. As a condition of entry, all cattle exhibitors are to provide a fully correct Cattle Herd Health Status Declaration completed and signed at time of entry by:

- a) The exhibitor or agent of the exhibitor, and
- b) a Government Veterinary Officer/Stock Inspector also acting as a qualified witness.

145. Cattle entered from any State or Territory of the Commonwealth of Australia are eligible for entry provided that they originate from herds or properties that are:

- a) not known or suspected to have had Johne's disease; or
- b) Currently participating in the National Johne's Disease Market Assurance Program (Cattle MAP) or are from a Protected or Free Zone (currently Western Australia, Northern Territory, Queensland and some of New South Wales); or
- c) under strict regulatory control and;
- d) under strict regulatory control and;
 - i. have been enrolled in official, audited test and control programs for a minimum of 2 years; and
 - ii. at least 2 consecutive annual whole herd tests have been conducted with a reactor rate not exceeding 1.5% at the latest herd test; and
 - iii. the cattle to be exhibited, or their dams, have been tested with negative results as part of at least the last 2 annual herd tests; and
 - iv. the cattle to be exhibited are not officially listed as "at risk" cattle for the particular herd; and
 - v. the cattle to be exhibited have been tested negative within 3 months of entry to the Show.

Exhibitors may also need additional certification to move between Zones or between States. Please check with the local Veterinary authority

146. Cattle entered must not be subject to quarantine or restriction with respect to any other notifiable disease.

147. All Exhibitors must provide the tail tag number for the property/properties where the cattle originate from.

REGISTRATION

148. Legible copies of registration papers must be forwarded to the RAS at the time of submitting entries.

149. No pending registrations will be accepted.

150. Registration papers forwarded by facsimile transmission will not be accepted.

151. All exhibits must be entered in the name of the registered owner.

NECK NUMBERS

152. Neck numbers corresponding to the Exhibit numbers in the catalogue must be worn by the Exhibits when entering the ring to appear before the Judge or when otherwise required.

153. Neck numbers must be obtained by the Exhibitor from the Cattle Superintendent's Office.

ABSENCE OF EXHIBIT

154. Notwithstanding Regulations 5.1 and 5.2 Exhibitors may withdraw exhibits provided that written notification is given to the RAS by 5:00pm, Friday 7 September 2007. The full bedding fee will be refunded for each head of cattle withdrawn in writing by this time.

155. Where any Exhibitor fails to show any exhibit entered in the show, and it has not been withdrawn in writing by 5:00pm Friday 7 September 2007, the Exhibitor will be required to pay a fine of \$50 per exhibit not shown, unless the failure to exhibit is due to one of the reasons specified in General Regulation 5.1 and such reason is accepted by the RAS. Any such late notification of withdrawal must be in writing, and delivered to the Cattle Superintendent's Office on the day of arrival.

156. If an Exhibitor fails to show any Exhibit entered in the Show without having given notice in accordance with these Regulations, that Exhibitor may be prohibited from showing any exhibit in any section of the Show.

HOURS OF OPENING OF PAVILIONS AND CLEANING

157. All cattle pavilions will be opened to the public from 8:30am to 8:30pm daily, unless closed by the Cattle Superintendent or RAS staff.

158. Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Cattle Superintendent;

- a) Keep each stall allotted to them and their stock in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
- b) Clean out their stalls each day, no later than the times specified in circular advice to Exhibitors.
- c) Clean their area regularly. Refuse must be deposited in the manure bins provided.
- d) Manure must not be deposited in the alleyways or general purpose rubbish bins.
- e) General purpose rubbish must not be deposited in manure bins.
- f) To assist in the transfer of manure to the bins provided, please bring own cleaning tools.
- g) Stock must not be left unattended outside pavilions at any time.

159. Dairy Cattle must not be rugged between the hours of 10:00am and 6:00pm.

BEDDING

160. The following regulations apply to bedding costs and bedding materials.

- a) Sawdust will be provided for Dairy Cattle on the Showgrounds.
- b) Exhibitors are required to pay a bedding fee at the time of submitting Official Entry Forms.
- c) Bedding straw is permissible for Dairy Cattle only, but can only be used if 50mm of sawdust is maintained underneath the bedding straw at all times. Failure to adhere to this rule will result in the Exhibitor being disallowed to further bed their animals on straw for the remainder of the Show.
- d) Bedding straw will not be provided by the RAS.

SAWDUST BEDDING FOR CATTLE - PRINCIPLES FOR GOOD MANAGEMENT

161. To achieve the best results from bedding cattle on sawdust, the following system of management is recommended:

- a) Pick up manure at every opportunity.
- b) Place hay in feeders and avoid feeding excessive amounts.
- c) Avoid water spillage in stalls.
- d) Regularly smooth out the bed with the aim of assisting drying.
- e) Consider using rubber matting for front half of bed.
- f) Do not dig out the wet patches.
- g) Do not disturb the bedding base.
- h) Keep the top of the bed loose.

Experience has shown that properly managed bed will last a full Show with little need for top up bedding, particularly with some classes of livestock.

FODDER STORAGE

162. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Livestock Pavilion except in the designated fodder aisles. Stock requisites can be obtained from the Fodder Merchant who will be situated on the Showgrounds.

CLIPPING OF EXHIBITS

163. A limited number of clipping frame spaces will be available, provided an application for space and a \$35.00 fee (inc. GST) accompanies the Official Entry Form.

164. Each Exhibitor is restricted to one clipping frame only.

8 DAIRY CATTLE

165. All clipping frames must have secure flooring and face the front of the stall only.
166. Clipping frames must only be kept in their designated area. Failure to adhere to this rule will result in automatic removal of the clipping frame.

SECURITY OF ANIMALS

167. All Exhibits must be provided with effective halters and be thoroughly broken to lead.
168. All calves must be securely tethered at all times.
169. Each Exhibitor shall ensure that each of their Exhibits is securely tethered in its stall.
170. All Exhibitors shall ensure that their Exhibits are not left unattended.

171. If in its absolute discretion the RAS determines any Exhibit or Exhibits of stock to be dangerous for any reason whatsoever, the RAS may by notice to the Exhibitor require the animal or animals concerned to be forthwith removed from the Showgrounds. The Exhibitor upon receipt of such notice, shall forthwith remove such animal and failing such removal by the Exhibitor within the time prescribed by the RAS, the RAS may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed and all costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the Exhibitor and shall be refunded to the RAS.

GRAND PARADE

172. All Exhibitors of Junior, Intermediate and Senior Champion and Reserve Champion Exhibits must participate in the Grand Parade in accordance with the timetabled program. No ribbons will be permitted on Exhibits except those won during the 2007 Royal Melbourne Show.

173. All Exhibits in the Grand Parade must wear leather halters.

SALES AND NOTICES

174. Exhibitors are permitted to display cards over the stalls stating that an animal is for sale provided such cards do not exceed 30cm x 25cm in size. No other advertisements or notices (except by permission of the RAS) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings.

STUD IDENTIFICATION NOTICE

175. Each Exhibitor is permitted to display one sign 60cm x 120cm in size provided that such sign carries only the stud name, address, telephone number, facsimile number and e-mail address.

JUDGING

176. The following regulations shall be read subject to General Regulations 10.1 to 10.6 and 11.1 to 11.7 of the General Regulations.

- Exhibits shall be present at the appropriate judging ring and ready to enter the judging ring at the time specified in the Timetable for the event to take place. Exhibits shall enter the judging ring immediately upon request by the appropriate Steward.
- Persons in charge of Exhibits must in no circumstances leave their Exhibits unattended at or in the judging ring.
- Persons in charge of Exhibits at or in the judging ring shall not address the Judge unless authorised by the Chief Steward or the Judge.
- Judges shall have the right to order that a cow be milked dry before awarding a prize.
- All attendants leading stock in the judging ring or on Grand Parade shall wear uniform white coats or approved breed uniform. Such white coat or uniform must in no way show any insignia or any descriptive markings indicating the Exhibitor's name and/or stud name or prefix.

FIRE REGULATIONS

177. Persons who breach General Regulations 13.1 to 13.3 (Fire Regulations) may be required by notice from the RAS to forthwith remove themselves and their Exhibits from the Showgrounds. The Exhibitor and Exhibits concerned may be prohibited from entry to one or more future Shows. The determination of the RAS in this regard shall be final and not be called into question in any manner or in any proceedings whatsoever.

178. An Exhibitor, upon receipt of a notice pursuant to this Regulation, shall forthwith remove all his Exhibits and failing such removal by the Exhibitor within the time prescribed by the RAS, the RAS may remove or cause to be removed all the animals concerned and all costs and expenses of such removal shall be borne by the Exhibitor and shall be refunded to the RAS.

179. Smoking is at all times prohibited in the Pavilions and in the Feed Lockers or any buildings on the Showgrounds.

PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY

180. The prize money advice slip issued by the RAS will denote each cash prize won by either class number or special prize number viz, (S123)

181. The RAS reserves the right to increase, alter or delete special prizes or prize money.

PRIZE RIBBONS

182. Ribbons may be awarded throughout the dairy section in accordance with the following table:

Up to 8 exhibits	4 ribbons
9 or more exhibits	6 ribbons

INTERBREED CLASSES

183. Conditions for judging all Interbreed Classes are as follows.

- All Judges of the represented breeds will take part in the judging and will place the six animals in order of their selection.
- Each Judge will allocate points to all breeds regardless of whether they have judged them already.
- Judges shall refrain from conferring on the Exhibits before the winner is named or during judging.
- Stewards appointed by the RAS will assess the points on the basis of 8 points for first, 5 points for second, 3 points for third, 2 points for fourth, 1 point for fifth and the group or individual animal gaining the greatest number of points shall be the winner.
- In the event of a tie it shall be decided on a count back.

MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR AWARDS

184. Points will be accrued by the Steward during the judging of each breed, based on the allocation below.

185. Points are not accrued for Group Classes.

- Ordinary Classes Point Allocation:
 - First Prize 3 points
 - Second Prize 2 points
 - Third Prize 1 point
- Championship Point Allocation:
 - Junior Champion 3 points
 - Reserve Junior Champion 2 points
 - Intermediate Champion 3 points
 - Reserve Intermediate Champion 2 points
 - Senior Champion 3 points
 - Reserve Senior Champion 2 points
 - Supreme Exhibit 2 points
- In the event of two or more Exhibitors securing an equal number of points, the Exhibitor gaining the greatest number of first prizes shall be the winner.
- A special sash will be presented to the winner.

REGULATIONS FOR PRODUCTION CLASSES

186. The production figures used in judging will be the weight of butterfat and protein (expressed in kilograms) and volume of milk (expressed in litres) from the lactation begun 1st September, 2005, or later to production as at 1st August, 2007 with a maximum limit of 305 days.

187. Certificates of Production must be from recognised Recording Facilities, and entered animals clearly identified.

188. Such certificates must accompany the Official Nomination Form and be forwarded to the RAS Offices by Friday, 17 August 2007. If certificates are not received by this date, the entries so affected will not be eligible for Production Awards.

189. All records will be verified prior to commencement of the Show, with the appropriate Recording Facility.
