#### GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR ALL COMPETITIONS

#### 1. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

#### 1.1 Definitions

The following definitions apply unless the context requires otherwise.

Agent includes any person, agent, association or corporation engaged by or on behalf of the Exhibitor and any person acting or purporting to act on the Exhibitor's behalf (whether remunerated or not).

**Body** includes any society, organisation or body within or outside Australia having similar objects to the Society and, without limitation, includes:

- Royal Agricultural Society of the Northern Territory Inc;
- Royal National Agricultural & Industrial Association of Queensland;
- Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia;
- Royal Agricultural Society of NSW;
- Royal Agricultural Society of Tasmania;
- Royal National Capital Agricultural Society;
- Royal Agricultural Society of WA; and
- any breed association or society recognised by the Society.

Business Day means a week day on which banks in Melbourne are open for business.

Chief Executive means a person occupying or acting in the position of Chief Executive of the Society.

Closing Date means the date and time set out in the Relevant Schedule after which entries for the Event will not be accepted by the Society.

Councillor means a person occupying or acting in the position of Councillor of the Society.

Drug has the meaning set out in the Relevant Schedule.

Entry Form means an entry form supplied by the Society.

Event includes competition and class and without limitation includes any event listed in a Schedule.

Exhibit means the item entered into an Event by an Exhibitor.

**Exhibitor** means the competitor, and if the competitor is less than 18 years of age, the parent or guardian of the competitor who signs the Entry Form.

Judge means a person appointed by the Society to judge an Event

Motor Vehicle includes a truck, trailer, horse float and stock transporter but does not include a caravan.

President means a person occupying or acting in the position of President of the Society.

Regulation means the Society's General Regulations For All Competitions, together with the rules set out in any Relevant Schedule, together with the rules, regulations and conditions set out on the Entry Form.

Relevant Schedule means the Schedule which applies to the particular Event in which the Exhibitor has submitted or proposes to submit an entry in accordance with these Regulations.

Schedule means a Schedule of Events and Prizes issued by the Society and without limitation, a reference to a Schedule includes a reference to the rules, regulations and conditions set out in the schedule of Events and Prizes.

Show means the Royal Melbourne Show.

Showgrounds means the Royal Showgrounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, Victoria and includes without limitation all areas owned, used, rented or leased by the Society in connection with the Show.

Society means The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria Limited (ACN 006 728 785).

Steward means a person occupying or acting in the position of steward

Veterinary Surgeon means a veterinary surgeon appointed by the Society.

Vice-President means a person occupying or acting in the position of Vice-President of the Society.

#### 1.2 Interpretation

Headings are for convenience only and do not affect interpretation. The following rules apply unless the context requires otherwise.

- (a) The singular includes the plural and conversely.
- (b) A gender includes all genders.
- (c) If a word or phrase is defined, its other grammatical forms have a corresponding meaning.
- (d) A reference to a person, corporation, trust, partnership, unincorporated body or other entity includes any of them.
- (e) A reference to a Regulation is a reference to a regulation of these Regulations.
- (f) A reference to a regulation, rule or condition of entry is to the regulation, rule or condition of entry as amended, varied, supplemented, novated or replaced, except to the extent prohibited by these regulations.
- (g) A reference to a right or obligation of any two or more persons confers that right, or imposes that obligation, as the case may be, jointly and severally.

In the event of an inconsistency between the Regulations and a Schedule, the Regulations prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless otherwise provided.

#### 1.3 Exemptions

The Society may, by notice in writing, exempt an Exhibit or an Exhibitor from one or more of the obligations or requirements contained in these Regulations.

#### 1.4 Consents or Approvals

Where the doing of any act, matter or thing under these Regulations is dependent upon the consent or approval of a party or is within the discretion of a party, the consent or approval may be given or discretion may be exercised conditionally or unconditionally or withheld by the party in its absolute discretion.

#### 2. ENTRIES

#### 2.1 Requirements for entering an Event

An entry to an Event must be:

- a) in writing;
- b) on an Entry Form;
- signed by the Exhibitor or, if the Exhibitor is less than 18 years of age, signed by the Exhibitor's parent or guardian;
- d) accompanied by the entry fee set out in the Relevant Schedule; and
- submitted before the Closing Date to the Society's Registered Office.

#### 2.2 Warranty

The Exhibitor represents and warrants to the Society that the information set out on the Entry Form is complete, accurate and not misleading in any way.

#### 2.3 Rules and Regulations

An entry is subject to:

- (a) the Regulations;
- (b) the Relevant Schedule; and
- (c) the rules, regulations and conditions set out on the Entry Form.

#### 2.4 Entries subject to Rules and Regulations

Upon submission of an entry in accordance to Regulation 2.1, the Exhibitor agrees to be bound by the rules and regulations referred to in Regulation 2.3.

#### 2.5 Altered entries

Subject to the Relevant Schedule, an entry may not be altered after the Closing Date.

#### 2.6 Number of Entries

The Society may restrict the number of entries in any Event.

#### 2.7 Limit on entry into multiple Ordinary Classes

Subject to the Relevant Schedule, an Exhibit must not be entered in more than one Ordinary Class. Should any Exhibit be sought to be entered in more than one Ordinary Class, the Exhibit will only compete in the first Ordinary Class in which the Exhibit's or the Exhibitor's name appears in the Society's Catalogue unless the Society otherwise directs. For the purposes of this Regulation, Sweepstakes, Special Classes, Trophy Classes and Championships do not count as Ordinary Classes. 'Ordinary Class', 'Sweepstakes', 'Special Class', 'Trophy Class' and 'Championship' have the meaning given in the Relevant Schedule.

#### 3. ENTRY FEE

The entry fee becomes the property of the Society on receipt by the Society and, without limitation, the fee paid in respect of withdrawn entries or entries which do not satisfy the conditions of eligibility will not be refunded.

#### 4. OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS

#### 4.1 Ownership on entry

At the time the Society receives the Entry Form, an Exhibit must be the property of the Exhibitor or held by the Exhibitor under a written lease in existence at that time.

4.2 Ownership on judging

At the time of judging, an Exhibit must be the property of the Exhibitor or be held by the Exhibitor under a written lease in existence at that time. An Exhibit which is not the property of the Exhibitor or held by the Exhibitor under a written lease in existence at the time of judging will be ineligible for the Event.

#### 5. ABSENCE OF EXHIBIT

#### 5.1 Prior to admission to the Showgrounds

An Exhibit must be exhibited unless a certificate signed by the Exhibitor is lodged with the Society prior to the date for admitting the Exhibit to the Showgrounds (as set out in the Relevant Schedule). The certificate must state that the Exhibit is unable to compete for one or more of the following reasons:

- (a) the Exhibit, being an animal, has died;
- (b) the Exhibit, being an animal, is unfit to be exhibited due to injury or disease;
- (c) the Exhibit is ineligible for the Event; or
- (d) some other cause the Society considers reasonable.

#### 5.2 After admission to the Showgrounds

Where an Exhibit has been admitted to the Showgrounds, the Exhibitor may only withdraw the Exhibit from an Event if it has become unable to compete for the reasons set out in Regulation 5.1.

#### 6. EXHIBIT TICKET

Subject to the Relevant Schedule, the Society will issue an exhibit ticket for an Exhibit unless it otherwise determines. The exhibit ticket must be produced upon a request from the Society or a Steward.

#### 7. CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS

#### 7.1 Compliance with rules and regulations

Where the Exhibit and/or Exhibitor fails to comply with any of the Regulations the Society may impose one or more of the following penalties on the Exhibit or Exhibitor or both of them:

- (a) disqualification;
- (b) suspension;
- (c) a fine;
- (d) order the Exhibit or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents be removed from the Showgrounds; or
- (e) any other penalty.

Without limiting the above, the Society may forfeit an award, and upon forfeiture, the Exhibitor must return any ribbon, money, prize card or other evidence of that award to the Society within seven days of receiving notification of the forfeiture.

Nothing in this Regulation limits Regulation 8.

#### 7.2 Compliance by family, invitees and Agents

An Exhibitor must ensure that his or her family, invitees and Agents are familiar with and comply with the rules and regulations referred to in Regulation 2.3.

#### 7.3 Default by family invitees and Agents

Any act or omission by the Exhibitor's family, invitees and Agents or any of them which contravenes the Regulations may be deemed by the Society to be the act or omission of the Exhibitor.

#### 7.4 Compliance with directions

- (a) The Exhibitor must fully comply with the directions and requests of the Society. Without limitation, directions and requests of the Society may apply to the entry of the Exhibit, the Exhibitor himself or herself, the conditions of the Event, the conduct of the Exhibitor, the conduct of the Event, the decision of the Judge, or the award of prizes.
- (b) Without limiting sub-regulation (a), upon a request from the Society, an Exhibitor must make a statutory

declaration in the form and with respect to matters the Society in its discretion requires.

(c) Without limiting sub-regulation (a), upon a request from the Society, an Exhibitor must submit his or her Exhibit for inspection by a Veterinary Surgeon.

#### 7.5 Statements

The Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents must not make a statement regarding an Exhibit, which in the opinion of the Society, is fraudulent, false, erroneous, misleading or deceptive or likely to mislead or deceive.

#### 7.6 Tampering

An Exhibit must not be or have been tampered with or otherwise improperly dealt with.

#### 7.7 Animals and livestock

Unless the Society gives prior written approval, pets, animals or livestock other than Exhibits will not be permitted to enter or remain on the Showgrounds.

#### 7.8 Mutual Recognition

The Society may recognise, act upon and enforce any penalty imposed by a Body on an Exhibit or Exhibitors at any time.

#### 7.9 Further Proceedings

The Society may conduct further proceedings in relation to any matter concerning an Exhibitor, an Exhibit, a potential Exhibitor, or a potential Exhibit, and impose any suspension, fine, disqualification, withdrawal of an award, handicap, reprimand, warning or any other penalty, irrespective of whether a Body has already imposed a penalty.

#### 7.10 Reciprocal Arrangements

The Society may enter into reciprocal arrangements with a Body in relation to any matter concerning an Exhibit or an Exhibitor.

### 8. POWERS OF SOCIETY IN RESPECT TO CONTROL OF THE SHOW

## 8.1 Power to refuse to accept an Entry, Exhibit or Exhibitor The Society may, in its discretion, refuse to accept an entry, an Exhibit, and an Exhibitor or any of them.

#### 8.2 Power to cancel or alter

The Society may, without assigning a reason:

- (a) alter the Closing Date for an Event, or the Closing Date for receipt of any particular entry;
- remove any Exhibit from the Showgrounds or cause any Exhibit to be removed from the Showgrounds;
- (c) amend an entry to, without limitation, substitute an alternate competition or class for the competition or class in which the Exhibit was entered;
- (d) alter the conditions of any Event;
- (e) refuse to display an Exhibit;
- (f) rule that an Exhibit or Exhibitor may not compete or is ineligible to compete;
- (g) alter the date, time or place on or at which any Event is scheduled to take place;
- (h) alter the Judge scheduled to judge any Event; or
- (i) cancel any Event.

The rights set out above apply notwithstanding:

- (a) the Society's acceptance of an entry;
- (b) inclusion of an entry in the Show Catalogue;
- (c) the issue of an exhibit ticket; or
- (d) the issue of any other document.

#### 9. VETERINARY SERVICE

#### 9.1 Treatment upon illness or injury

If an Exhibit, being an animal, is ill or injured, a Veterinary Surgeon may in his or her discretion attend to or treat the Exhibit in the absence of authority from the Exhibitor, or contrary to that authority.

#### 9.2 Destruction or Removal

Where, in the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon, an Exhibit, being an animal, should be destroyed or removed from the Showgrounds, the Veterinary Surgeon or the Society may destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds, or both. Alternately, the Society may require the Exhibitor to immediately destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds or both. Any costs incurred by the Society pursuant to this Regulation must be reimbursed by the Exhibitor. Nothing in this Regulation limits Regulation 8.2.

#### 9.3 Veterinary Surgeons

Where an Exhibitor wishes to employ a private Veterinary Surgeon not appointed by the Society, he must first inform the superintendent of the stock concerned. The opinion of this private veterinary surgeon will not be considered in any decisions made by:

the Vetennary Surgeon appointed by the Society; or

2. by the Society itself; or

3. the judge of the Event in which the Exhibit is entered, unless such a supplementary opinion is officially requested by the Veterinary Surgeon, Society or Judge.

#### 9.4 Decision of Veterinary Surgeon

The decision of a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Society, a decision of the Society itself, and a decision of the Judge of an Event are final;

 in the inspection or competition process of an Exhibit; and

2. regarding the age of an Exhibit,

regardless of whether or not the opinion of a private veterinary surgeon has been obtained and considered.

#### 10. LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

#### 10.1 Release

Entry to and remaining on the Showgrounds is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases the Society (which term includes in this clause the Society's officers, employees, members and agents), from all claims and demands of every kind resulting from any accident, damage or injury occurring at the Showgrounds, and without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges:

(a) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibit;

 the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to or caused by any Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents;

(c) the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is located on the Showgrounds; and

(d) without limiting sub-regulations (a) and (b) above, the Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage or injury resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showgrounds.

#### 10.2 Indemnity

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor must indemnify and keep indemnified the Society and its officers, employees, members and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which the Society is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:

 loss, damage or injury to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;

(b) without limiting sub-regulation (a), loss, damage or injury to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, Agents, or to the property of the Society, or its members, or to the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents; and

(c) without limiting sub-regulation (a), loss, damage or injury to the Exhibit, or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees, or Agents caused or contributed by an act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the transportation, feeding or housing of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor.

#### 10.3 Removal from Showgrounds

Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where the Society, its officers, employees members or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showgrounds, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.

#### 11. INSURANCE

The Society will arrange compulsory Owner's Liability insurance cover for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals. The Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by Statutory Duties under the Insurance

Contracts Act. Details of the Compulsory Owner's Liability insurance are set out in the Relevant Schedule.

#### 12. ACCOMMODATION

### 12.1 No obligation to provide Exhibit space or accommodation

The Society is not obliged to provide space for an Exhibit or accommodation for an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents. For the purposes of these Regulations, "accommodation" includes provision of a space for a person to sleep.

Where the Society, in its discretion, allocates space for an Exhibit or accommodation for an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents, only the allocated areas may be used, and only for the purpose designated by the Society.

#### 12.2 Personal effects

The Society has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showgrounds by an Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents.

#### 13. FIRE REGULATIONS

#### 13.1 Flames

Smoking, cooking, or heating water by any means whatsoever and the use of any device involving naked flames is strictly prohibited in or near any animal pavilion, stall, pen or locker.

#### 13.2 Electrical Interference

It is strictly prohibited to:

- (a) subject to 13.3, use mains powered electrical devices in or near any animal pavilion, stall, pen or locker; and
- alter or interfere with any electrical wiring, switch, plug or socket whatsoever on the Showgrounds.

#### 13.3 Exceptions

Nothing in Regulation 13.2(a) shall prohibits the use of main powered electrical appliances which are, in the opinion of the Society, essential to animal care, or the use of a light-bulb in a locker if the light-bulb is fitted in the socket provided.

#### 14. VEHICLE PARKING

#### 14.1 Loading and Unloading

With the Society's permission, Motor Vehicles may enter the Showgrounds for the purpose of loading or unloading only. Motor Vehicles must not remain on the Showgrounds, and must be removed immediately upon completion of loading or unloading.

#### 14.2 Caravans

Unless the Society gives prior written approval, caravans will not be permitted to enter or remain on the Showgrounds.

#### 14.3 Tow Away

Any Motor Vehicle located on the Showgrounds in contravention of the rules and regulations referred to in Regulation 2.3 or of any other parking rules and restrictions, may be removed from the Showgrounds by the Society and stored. Any costs incurred by the Society pursuant to this Regulation must be paid by the owner of the Motor Vehicle, or by the Exhibitor who caused or contributed to the contravention.

#### 15. JUDGING

#### 15.1 Interference

An Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees or Agents must not consult, influence or interfere with a Judge or attempt to consult, influence or interfere with a Judge or do any other thing which may interfere with the Judge's freedom of choice or judgement.

#### 15.2 Indications of Ownership

Before or during judging, an Exhibit, the Exhibitor and the person in charge of the Exhibit must not be equipped with or wear or display anything indicating the ownership of the Exhibit unless it is expressly authorised by the Relevant Schedule.

#### 15.3 Decision

Except as otherwise provided in the Regulations, the decision of a Judge as to the merits of the Exhibit and the Exhibitor or either of them will be final, and the Exhibitor may not protest or appeal the decision.

#### **GENERAL REGULATIONS**

#### 15.4 Prizes

Subject to the Relevant Schedule, a Judge may:

- (a) award a second or third prize in place of a first prize;
- (b) withhold a prize where, in his or her opinion a prize should not be awarded;
- (c) where there is a tie for any placing in an Event, award subsequent placings so that the next placing will be the number of Exhibits already placed plus one (for example, if two Exhibits tie for first place, award a third for the next placing);
- (d) where all the prizes offered in an Event have been awarded and a further Exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize, a Judge may make a reserve number of the further Exhibit;
- (e) give commendations where in his or her opinion, they are deserved.

#### 15.5 Disqualifications

Where an Exhibit or an Exhibitor is disqualified and his or her prize is forfeited, the Society may (but is not obliged to) promote the Exhibit next in order to that prize, whether the Exhibit was awarded a prize or a reserve number. Exhibits next in order, whether awarded a prize or reserve number, may also be promoted to the prize next in order.

#### 15.6 Prize Cards

Prize Cards awarded at the Show must be exhibited with the Exhibit whilst the Exhibit is on exhibition.

#### 16. PROTESTS AND APPEALS

For the purposes of this Regulation: a "Review Committee" will be comprised of three people, being the Chief Executive and two councillors who are independent of the committee or personnel involved in making the original decision.

#### 16.1 Protest to Stewards

An Exhibitor may protest to either the Chief Steward or Assistant Chief Steward of the relevant section in relation to conduct, judging or any other matter relating to an Event. The protest must be made in accordance with this Regulation and the procedures set out in the Relevant Schedule, and be received within 24 hours of the Event's conclusion.

#### 16.2 Appeal

The Exhibitor may appeal against:

- (a) a decision made by the Society pursuant to the rules and regulations referred to in Regulation 2.3; or
- (b) a decision of the Chief Steward or Assistant Chief Steward.

#### 16.3 Form of Appeal

Each appeal made by the Exhibitor pursuant to Regulation 16.2 must be:

- (a) in writing setting out the grounds for the appeal;
- (b) addressed to:

the Chief Executive,

Administration Building,

Cnr Degraves Street and Plummer Avenue,

Royal Showgrounds, Ascot Vale, Victoria;

(c) accompanied by a deposit of \$200.00; and

(d) submitted by 5 p.m. on the Business Day which is 10 Business Days after the day on which the relevant decision was made.

If the Exhibitor's appeal does not comply with these requirements the Exhibitor will have no right of appeal against a decision referred to in Regulation 16.2.

#### 16.4 Review Committee

Within a reasonable time of receipt of an appeal, the Review Committee will meet to consider the appeal. In determining what is a 'reasonable time' for the purposes of this Regulation, regard can be had to any Event deadlines and the corresponding additional time required.

#### 16.5 Proceedings of the Review Committee

At the meeting of the Review Committee convened in accordance with Regulation 16.4, the Review Committee

- (a) give due consideration to the grounds of appeal submitted by the Exhibitor, and to any other documentary evidence submitted by the Exhibitor;
- (b) give the Exhibitor an opportunity to make oral representations; and
- (c) in its discretion call for and hear expert opinion.

#### 16.6 Notification of Review Committee's decision

The Chief Executive will notify the Exhibitor of the Review Committee's decision within 48 hours of that decision. The decision of the Review Committee is final and the Exhibitor will not have any right of appeal in respect of the Review Committee's decision.

#### 16.7 Forfeiture of deposit

Where, in the opinion of the Review Committee an appeal is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious, the deposit referred to in Regulation 16.3 may be forfeited to the Society.

#### 17. INFORMATION HANDLING

The Society is bound by the National Privacy Principles of the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) and other applicable laws governing privacy.

#### 17.1 Collection of Personal Information

- The Society may collect, hold and use personal information about Exhibitors, their family members, invitees or Agents.
- b) The types of information that may be collected include names, addresses, e-mail addresses, phone numbers, credit card details, qualifications, results of the Exhibitor's entry into the relevant Event and any warning, reprimand, suspension, fine, disqualification, dismissal, withdrawal of an award or penalty imposed on the Exhibitor in connection with entry of the Exhibit in the relevant Event. Information may also be collected from other Bodies relating to the Exhibitor's entry into events held by that Body including, without limitation, warnings, reprimands, suspensions, fines, disqualifications, withdrawals of awards or penalties imposed on the Exhibitor by that Body.
- c) Personal information is collected for the purpose of administration of Events, including, without limitation, processing Entry Forms, managing the Events, awarding prizes, assessing compliance with the Regulations and standards expected of Exhibitors participating in an Event, assessing protests and appeals made under Regulation 16 and providing services to the Exhibitor during the Event.
- Personal information may also be collected for purposes related to the administration of Events including, without limitation:
  - publication of winners' information in Society publications;
  - maintenance of records of information relevant to qualifications for future events such as warnings, reprimands, suspensions, fines, disqualifications or penalties issued in connection with the Exhibitor's entry in an Event or issued by another Body in relation to the Exhibitor's entry into an event held by that Body;
  - iii) maintenance of health and safety records in relation to Events;
  - iv) applicable insurance cover for Events including for Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals; and
  - v) making claims under the Society's insurance for incidents which involve an Exhibitor and occur during an Event.
- e) Personal information may also be collected for the purpose of informing Exhibitors about future events organised by the Society. Except in limited circumstances, in general, the Society will seek the consent of the Exhibitor to use personal information for this purpose.

#### 17.2 Sharing Personal Information

- The Society may share personal information with cosponsors of Events.
- b) The Society may share information with health service providers including medical practitioners and St John's Ambulance officers engaged or required to provide services during the Events.
- c) The Society may also share information with service providers, such as telecommunications suppliers who are providing services to Exhibitor during the Event.
- d) The Society will share personal information with providers of insurance and indemnity services for the purpose of providing relevant insurance cover to Events, including for all Exhibitors of Exhibits being animals, or for the purposes of making a claim under insurance held

- by the Society in connection with an incident involving the Exhibitor.
- e) The Society may also share personal information with other Bodies.
- f) If legal, health or safety issues arise, the Society may be required to disclose information to relevant organisations to deal with these matters.

#### 17.3 Access And Correction

- An Exhibitor may contact the Society if the Exhibitor has a complaint or a query about the information handling practices of the Society.
- b) An Exhibitor may request that the Society remove any personal information about that Exhibitor published in connection with an Exhibit or an Event from the Society's publications. The Society will, to the extent that it can reasonably do so and as soon as is reasonably practical, remove such information from the relevant publications.
- c) An Exhibitor may request the Society to provide access to any personal information held by the Society about the Exhibitor, to the extent authorised by the Privacy Act and all other applicable laws. Those laws may not give rise to a right of access to all information or in all circumstances.
- d) An access request must be made in writing, addressed to:

#### 18. AGENTS

Any person purporting to act as an agent of an Exhibitor is deemed to have given the Society a warranty of his or her authority, and the Society is not required to make any inquiry as to that authority.

#### GOVERNING LAW

These Regulations are governed by the laws of Victoria.

#### **ENTRY FEE**

1 to 10 Birds - \$1.50 per bird 11 Birds upwards - \$1.00 per bird Plus 50 cents per entry in excess of 15.

EXHIBITORS ARE ADVISED TO READ BOTH THE REGULATIONS AT THE FRONT OF THIS SCHEDULE, AND THE GENERAL REGULATIONS, AS BOTH APPLY TO SECTIONS 140 to 143.

#### **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY**

The accuracy of entries is the sole responsibility of the Exhibitor.

Exhibitors of birds which are protected or kept under permit, must produce their permit when called upon to do so by the Society or his agent. The Society does not accept any responsibility in this matter. Entries can only be accepted on this condition.

#### **BEGINNER EXHIBITORS**

An Exhibitor in the Budgerigar Beginner Section must be registered as a Beginner with the Budgerigar Council of Victoria.

#### INTERMEDIATE EXHIBITORS

An Exhibitor in the Budgerigar Intermediate Section must be registered as an Intermediate with the Budgerigar Council of Victoria.

Unless otherwise provided, judging will commence at 9.00 a.m. on Thursday, 19th September. Centenary Hall will be open to the public from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. on Thursday 19th September, and 10 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on Friday, 20th September.

#### **PRIZES**

Unless otherwise stated prizes in the Cage Bird Section will be First, Spoon, Second and Third, Card, provided there are more than 3 entries in the class.

### TRANSPORT, PENNING AND CARE OF EXHIBITS

Budgerigars, Canaries, Finches and other Cage Birds must be delivered to the Pavilion, previously known as **CENTENARY HALL** between 5.00 p.m. and 8.30 p.m. on Wednesday, 18th September, 2002.

All birds will be benched by Stewards only.

Exhibitors must provide "standard" cages with "standard" drinkers for their birds. Gummed labels to be affixed thereto will be supplied by the Society, and no addition shall be made to these labels by Exhibitors. In the event of an Exhibitor adding to the information included on the label provided by the Society, the bird to whose cage this label is attached will be disqualified. Any decision or determination to disqualify an exhibit on this ground is entirely within the discretion of the Superintendent and shall not be challenged or called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

#### **EXHIBITS FOR SALE AND NOTICES**

The prices of all Canaries, Finches, Budgerigars and other Cage Bird exhibits may be displayed on coops. When pair exhibits are on offer for sale all two (2) birds must be sold as a unit, no substitute birds being permissable.

Cards will be supplied free on application to the Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by Exhibitors who are unable to attend in person. Written authority of the Exhibitor for the disposal of exhibits by sale stating catalogue number, breed and price must be given to the Superintendent. A commission of 25 per cent, will be charged on all sales effected by the Superintendent on behalf of Exhibitors. Whilst the Superintendent will take all reasonable care in the disposal of exhibits, neither he nor the Society take any responsibility whatsoever to complete disposals of exhibits to the satisfaction of Exhibitors.

#### REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

Exhibitors will be permitted to remove their birds between 5.30 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. on Friday, 20th September, 2002.

The Society will arrange for a competent person to feed and otherwise attend to the birds, and caretakers will be on duty in the Pavilion night and day during the currency of the Show.
