

ART & CRAFT SPECIAL REGULATIONS

ONE ENTRY IN EACH CLASS BY AN EXHIBITOR UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED AT THE HEAD OF THE SECTION.

1. CLASSES AND ENTRY FEES

An exhibitor submitting 10 or more entries is entitled to 1 (one) free pass to the Show. An exhibitor submitting more than 20 entries will pay for the first 20 entries, thereafter Il ho free

2. CLOSING DATES - ENTRY FORMS.

Entry forms and fees must be received at the Office of the Society by 4.30 p.m. on Friday, 20th July, 2001.

3. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY.

Entries must have been made by the one exhibitor unless entered in a Group class.

Entries must have been completed within two years of the current Show.

Entries must not have been entered at a previous Royal Melbourne Show.\$P Entries must not have been worn, used or marked.

Except for the Weaving classes, entries that have been washed or dry cleaned will be disgualified from winning a prize.

2. DISPLAY

All exhibits which are eligible for entry will be judged, but will only be displayed if space permits.

Entry fees will not be refunded for those entries not on display.

3. EXHIBIT TICKETS

Exhibit tickets and relevant information will be forwarded to each entrant following the close and processing of entries.

The larger portion of the ticket to be retained by you for collection of goods.

ONE small tear off ticket should be attached to your exhibit, unless exhibit comprises a set, then duplicate tickets are to be attached to each piece of the set.

Framed pieces - Exhibit ticket to be attached by hanging ticket from the bottom right hand corner of the frame or by taping ticket onto the bottom right hand corner of the glass. Do not stick to frame as this may cause damage to the frame.

Cookery - On delivery, pins are provided for insertion into cakes.

Solid items - Exhibit ticket must be suitably attached to the front right hand of the exhibit. Textiles - Exhibit ticket must be attached to the front right hand of each exhibit with a small gold safety pin. Duplicate numbers must be attached to all articles comprising a collection or set.

4. DELIVERY OF EXHIBITS

Exhibit ticket must be attached.

NOTE: Exhibits must be delivered at the following times, or if posted/railed, must arrive NO LATER THAN Thursday, 13th September, 2001. Please allow sufficient time for parcels to arrive by the due date.

xhibits will NOT be accepted on Friday, 14th or Saturday, 15th September, 2001.

5. FREIGHT OF EXHIBITS

Parcels must show the name and address of exhibitor, and Class number entered. When exhibits are sent by carrier OR post, despatch notices listing exhibits and instructions

for return, must be included in the parcel. Freight on exhibits sent by carrier must be prepaid.

NOTE: The Society's carrier will only collect exhibits from the Rail if notified prior to Friday 14th September, 2001.

6. FRAMING OF EXHIBITS

ALL FRAMED EXHIBITS MUST BE PRESENTED READY TO HANG.

All painting and graphic exhibits must be framed with suitable hanging devices attached to take the weight of the painting. Wire, when tight, must be positioned 5cm from the centre top of the paintings. Copper wire not to be used.

No responsibility will be taken for any work which falls due to faulty attachments. Paintings will not be accepted unless correctly presented.

7. IDENTIFICATION

CRAFT COMPETITION - Entries to have signatures covered or be unsigned.

Labels may be used in those Sections which ask for labels, however, Commercial or Company labelling is not allowed.

8. INSURANCE

The Society shall not be liable to take out a policy of insurance effectively protecting any exhibitor or exhibitors against any claim. Exhibitors are advised to insure their own exhibits against theft, fire or loss.

9. JUDGING

Other than framed pieces, protective covering fitted to an article must be removed before judging.

With the exception of those engaged by the Society, no person, whether an Exhibitor or otherwise, will be permitted to enter the Pavilion whilst judging is in progress

The Judges decision is final, unless the winning exhibit does not meet with the criteria as set out in the Schedule. The Society may, at its discretion, overrule the decision with the prize winner to forfeit the prize and other winners being upgraded or downgraded accordingly. 10. LIABILITY FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE

So far as the law permits the Society or any Official Judge, Steward, Officer or employee will not be liable in any way for any direct, indirect or consequential loss of an exhibit, or the diminution in the value of an exhibit by reason of:

the sale, delivery, disposal or other dealing with an exhibit.

any damage or injury occasioned to or by an exhibit.

the negligence or any act or matter or thing done, permitted or omitted by the Society, or any loss, damage or injury occasioned to or by any exhibitor or person acting on his or her behalf.

11. NOTES

Criteria as set out at the beginning of each Section under NOTES, applies to the whole Section unless otherwise stated in the individual classes.

12. REPRODUCTION

The Society may allow the reproduction of any work to the press and television stations, during the period of the Show.

13. RETURN OF EXHIBITS

Exhibitors or their agent, collecting any exhibit following the Show, MUST first present the large portion of the exhibit ticket to the staff in the pavilion where the exhibit was housed. If exhibitors or their agents are unable to present this ticket, a notification form MUST be completed before collection of exhibits can take place. These will be available in pavilions on collection days.

Exhibitors wishing their items returned by rail, post or courier **MUST** complete the Dispatch Form and return it with their exhibits. A \$5.00 flat rate handling fee PLUS return payment is required for ALL exhibits not collected by hand.

Please print Name, Address and Telephone Number clearly. Large or heavy items MUST be picked up.

NOTE: EXHIBITS NOT COLLECTED WITHIN THE SPECIFIED TIMES WILL BE DISPOSED OF 14 DAYS AFTER COLLECTION DATE.

14. SALE OF EXHIBITS

All exhibits (except Cookery and Preserve competitions) may be offered for sale.

No sale will take place unless the exhibitor has completed the correct sale forms.

The exhibitor should clearly indicate the price of the exhibit in the space provided on the exhibit ticket. The letters NFS should be used if the work is not for sale. The Society will encourage the sale of work while the exhibition is in progress.

Art Sales - Full price must be paid at the time of purchase. Holding deposits will not be accepted. Miniatures entered as a pair must be sold as a pair.

Cheques covering the sale less 25% Commission, plus GST, will be mailed to Art Exhibitors after the conclusion and clean up of the Show.

Decorated Cake Sales - A Deposit of 20% being Commission, plus GST, will be accepted from the purchaser. It is the responsibility of the purchaser to contact the exhibitor to pay the balance and to arrange collection of cake.

Craft Sales - Cheques covering the sale Less 20% Commission plus GST, will be mailed to Exhibitors after the conclusion and clean up of the Show.

Sales of exhibits are made by the Society solely as the agents of the exhibitor. Subject to the right of the exhibitor to withdraw the exhibit from Sale prior to the opening of the Show and the Society to withdraw the exhibit from sale at any time (whether or not the exhibitor, the Society still has possession of the exhibit).

Purchase subject to Terms and Conditions

The receipt must be presented by the purchaser as proof of purchase before collection of the exhibit.

Implied Terms - All conditions and warranties expressed or implied by statute, the common law, equity, trade, custom or usage or otherwise are expressly excluded to the maximum extent permitted by the law.

While the Society has endeavoured to ensure that all exhibits are the bona fide property of the exhibitor, or held by the exhibitor under written lease in existence at time of entry, the purchaser acknowledges that the Society has made any representation as to the bona fide ownership of the exhibit or that clear title to the exhibit will pass to the purchaser on purchase of the exhibit.

15. TRANSFER OF EXHIBITS

The Society may transfer any exhibit to another class if it considers that the exhibit has been entered in an incorrect class, or may, at its discretion, remove the exhibit from the Show altogether.

GST

ENTRY FEES AND OTHER CHARGES

All entry fees in individual sections include GST - all exhibitors, whether they are registered or not, are to pay the full amount as stated in the relevant Prize Schedule and/or entry form. Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes may be able to claim an input tax credit for GST. A tax invoice/receipt of entry fees and other charges will be provided on notification of your ABN number in the space provided on your entry form.

Prices for catalogues, lockers, parking and all other services provided include GST.

PRIZEMONEY

Prizemoney as stated in the relevant Prize Schedule does not include GST.

GST will be added to the Prizemoney for Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes and have provided an ABN number.

PHOTOGRAPHY

The Victorian Association of Photographic Societies Inc. competition for photography is housed at the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria Limited, PB Ronald Pavilion, Lower Floor, throughout the Show.

PREPAID CATALOGUES

A Catalogue lists: Judges and Stewards, Exhibitors and Sponsors.

PrePaid Catalogues can be collected from the pavilion when delivering your exhibit on presentation of the bottom tear off portion of your exhibit ticket.

Pre Paid Catalogue and Postage Paid tear off portion will be removed to allow for postage of catalogues prior to the commencement of the Show.

PRIZE CARDS AND RIBBONS

Equal places will not be awarded.

First, Second, Third prize cards and ribbons will be issued in accordance with the judges awards. Commended awards may be issued at the discretion of the judge.

Where no first prize is awarded, second and third prizes will be withheld; only very highly commended, highly commended and commended certificates may be awarded.

PRIZEMONEY

Prizemoney will be awarded according to particulars set out within the Prize Schedule.

Cheques covering prize money will be mailed to exhibitors after the conclusion and clean up of the Show.

Combine peeled, cored and finely chopped apples, combined dates, bicarbonate of soda and boiling water. Allow to cool to lukewarm. Cream butter and sugar until light and creamy. Add egg and vanilla and beat well. Sift flour and salt together and beat into butter mixture alternately with cooled mixture.

Line a 20cm square cake tin with non stick baking paper. Pour mixture into prepared tin and bake in moderate oven (180°C) for 1 hour or until cake is cooked when tested with a skewer.

#### For the topping:

Combine sugar, butter, milk and coconut in a small saucepan, stir over low heat until butter and sugar has melted. Spread topping over hot cake and cook for a further 20 minutes until topping is golden.
