How to use the Preview Schedule

Welcome to the Schools and Youth Preview Schedule for the 2025 Melbourne Royal Art, Craft, and Cookery Competition. This guide is designed to help you prepare and submit your entry or entries successfully. Please read all instructions carefully to ensure your work meets the competition guidelines and can be judged and displayed.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Each entry must adhere to specific requirements, including size limitations, mounting instructions, recipes, and materials. These details are outlined within the relevant sections of this schedule.

Entries that do not comply with the stated guidelines may not be judged or displayed.

LEGAL RIGHTS AND PERMISSIONS

By completing the entry form, the exhibitor declares they have the legal rights to present the work and its content. For privacy reasons, any photograph depicting a person must have that person's permission. Proof of permission may be required.

SUBMITTING YOUR ENTRY

The full 2025 ACC Schedule will be released when entries open in June 2025. This will include details of how to enter, how delivery and collection works, and everything else you need to enter your exhibit(s).

TERMINOLOGY

Exhibit - The item you wish to enter i.e. a painting, a cake etc.

Exhibitor – You! As the person who is entering an exhibit, you are the exhibitor.

Class – The category you wish to enter your exhibit into. I.e. if you are in Grade 2 and entering a painting, your class would be JNR5

Decorated Cakes

Free-standing cakes must have a common base board, not exceeding 40cm in any direction. Elevated tiers must not overlap the base board.

No wires must penetrate icing or cake. Ribbon, tulle, wire, non-synthetic stamens, edible colouring, edible glitter (minimum amount), cachous, piping gel, coconut, posy picks and manufactured pillars may be used. Raffia and cord are permitted in presentation. No manufactured ornaments, diamantes, dry gyp, lace or inedible glitter allowed. Dummy cakes are permitted if the same shape can be constructed in cake.
