CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The General Regulations appearing in the Sheep Schedule form part of the conditions of entry. In the event of any inconsistency between the General Regulations and these conditions, the General Regulations shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless the General Regulations provide otherwise.

ENTRIES CLOSE AND MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE ASSOCIATION AT THE ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING AT THE ROYAL SHOW GROUNDS, EPSOM ROAD, ASCOT VALE, 3032, BY NOT LATER THAN 4.30pm ON WEDNESDAY 30th JULY, 1997 WHETHER SUCH ENTRIES ARE DELIVERED IN PERSON OR BY POST. A COPY OF EACH EXHIBITS REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE MUST BE INCLUDED WHEN ENTRIES ARE LODGED. ALL ENTRIES MUST ACCOMPANIED BY THE APPLICABLE FEE, WHICH IS \$15.00 PER ENTRY IN EACH CLASS FOR ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY OF VICTORIA LTD (RASV) MEMBERS AND \$20.00 PER ENTRY IN EACH CLASS FOR NON-MEMBERS (STRAW INCLUSIVE). **ENTRY FEE FOR FLEECES IS \$5.00 PER ENTRY FOR** RASV MEMBERS AND \$10.00 FOR NON-MEMBERS.

This show will be conducted under the current Australian Alpaca Association rules as set out in the AAA showing guideline manual.

PERIOD OF EXHIBITION

ALPACAS MUST BE PENNED BY 2.00pm ON THURSDAY, 25th SEPTEMBER AND MAY NOT BE REMOVED FROM THE SHOWGROUNDS UNTIL 4.00pm ON SUNDAY 28th SEPTEMBER.

PHYSICAL SOUNDNESS AND DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS

All exhibitors must sign a statutory declaration to the effect that to the best of their knowledge, no Alpaca exhibited by them show any signs or symptoms of disease at time of exhibition.

Failure to sign a statutory declaration will render all Alpacas of an exhibitor ineligible to be exhibited.

All male animals must be completely entire and deemed physically sound. Any male animal not deemed to be completely entire (other than wether) and physically sound by the Chief Steward shall not compete. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing.

The owner or exhibitor of any exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Chief Steward must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit from the Showgrounds. Subject to Rules of the General Regulations, the Association reserves absolute the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not in the opinion of the Association, up to a satisfactory standard, is not exhibited in reasonable show condition and that is not given proper attention during the Show.

Such a decision or determination is entirely within the discretion of the Association and shall not be questioned or challenged in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

The owner or exhibitor disapproved of as an exhibit by the Chief Steward must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit if required.

All wethers must be physically sound and must be castrated. Any wether entry may be either a registered or unregistered alpaca.

FEED SHED, BEDDING AND FODDER ARRANGEMENTS

Alpaca Feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Section. On application to the Company, a shed will be reserved for the currency of the Show at a charge of \$25. Exhibitors must provide their own locks for feed lockers. No bedding other than straw may be used in any pens. For the convenience of exhibitors, fodder merchants will attend the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc. Delivery of food stocks must be made before 9.00am each day during the Show. EXHIBITORS MUST TEND THEIR ANIMALS OR ARRANGE FOR THEIR DAILY FOOD AND WATER NEEDS TO BE MET.

PREPARATION OF EXHIBITS AND CLEANLINESS OF STALLS

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock throughout the Show.

EXERCISING OF ANIMALS

Alpacas are to remain in their pens during the day and exercising is only allowed at specified times (out of public hours).

ADVERTISING

No advertisements of notices (except by permission of the Chief Steward) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings. Sale signs are not permitted. Stud names are permitted but must be continued to the bounds of the pen and to the height of 1800 mm.

INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS

All Alpacas entered (other than wethers) must be registered with the Australian Alpaca Association and carry an approved brass ear tag showing the animal's IAR number and must be shown in the name of the registered owner or leasee.

The Australian Alpaca Association shall appoint a person or persons as an inspector or inspectors who shall inspect all Alpacas for genetic faults, colour class and IAR number.

The inspection of all Alpacas will take place at 3.00 pm on Thursday, 25th September.

Alpacas not in their allotted pens and available for inspection at the official times may be disqualified by the Chief Steward. Exhibitors must be in attendance at time of inspection.

Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward and shall not be challenged or called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

INSPECTION APPEALS

An exhibitor or competitor may appeal against an Inspectors decision.

Subject to the regulations in the relevant Prize Schedule, appeals shall be addressed to the Chairman, Sheep Committee, and be lodged at the Sheep Superintendents' Office in Lennon Avenue, before 6pm on the day the decision in question has been made. Such appeals shall be accompanied with a deposit of \$50.00 which may be forfeited to the Company if in the sole opinion of the Chief Steward the appeal is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious.

The appeal and all matters arising therefrom shall be determined conclusively as to all matters by the Association and shall not be the subject of any appeal to any court or any order for review or of a similar nature.

JUDGING

A competitor may not discuss with the Judge their Alpacas, or proposed exhibits with him/her prior to, or during the Show.

The Judge's decision shall be final, and has the power of withholding prizes from any exhibitor not deemed worthy of that prize.

All attendants leading stock in the Judging Ring or on Parade shall wear a white coat and neat attire.

The Chief Steward may disqualify an exhibitor for incorrect attire.

All exhibitors shall on the day of the show obtain from the Sheep Superintendent their pen position and class numbers. Class numbers of the exhibit must be worn and clearly displayed by the handler whilst in the Show Ring.

The animals must not be moved from their allotted pen whilst judging is in progress except by the order of the Chief Steward.

Judging of Alpacas may commence at 3.00 pm on Friday, 26th September.

HANDLING

All Handlers showing animals must be competent in handling of their exhibit, or removal from the ring may be requested by the judge.

FLEECES

All fleeces shown are to be from Alpacas which are the bona fide property of the exhibitors.

All animals must carry a minimum fleece length of 5cm and no more than 18 months of fleece growth.

Exhibitors when submitting fleeces at the Show must attach to the fleece the number supplied for that class (no names).

Fleece judging may commence at 10.00 am on Friday, 26th September.

ALPACA SHOW SCHEDULE

The Inspector or Chief Steward will classify all entries for colour and has the power to transfer an exhibit to the class, which in their opinion, should have been entered. The Chief Steward will combine or split classes as he/she sees fit.

An exhibitor may enter up to two animals in any one class and the age of the animal is based on the first day of the Show (viz-18th September).

All animals must show the full registered name of the exhibit on the entry form accompanied by a copy of the registration certificate.

Suris are not eligible for Huacrya Championship classes.



201. The General Regulations appearing in this Schedule form part of the conditions of entry. In the event of any inconsistency between the General Regulations and these conditions, the General Regulations shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless the General Regulations provide otherwise.

202. ENTRIES IN THE GOAT SECTION OF THE SHOW CLOSE AND MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE COMPANY BY NOT LATER THAN 4.30pm ON WEDNESDAY, 30th JULY, 1997 WHETHER SUCH ENTRIES ARE DELIVERED IN PERSON OR BY POST.

DAIRY GOAT ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE APPLICABLE FEE, WHICH IS \$40.00 PER ANIMAL FOR ENTRIES IN THE SENIOR GROUPS AND \$20.00 PER ANIMAL FOR ENTRIES IN THE JUNIOR GROUPS FOR MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY AND \$50.00 PER ANIMAL FOR ENTRIES IN THE SENIOR GROUPS AND \$30.00 PER ANIMAL FOR ENTRIES IN THE JUNIOR GROUPS FOR NON-MEMBERS (strawing of pens inclusive).

THE ENTRY FEE FOR CLASSES 402,405, 408, 411 (DRY DOE) IS \$10.00 PER HEAD FOR MEMBERS AND \$15.00 PER HEAD FOR NON-MEMBERS. IF THESE ANIMALS KID BEFORE JUDGING DAY, THEY CAN BE TRANSFERRED TO THE APPROPRIATE MILK CLASSES AND THE BALANCE OF THE FEES PAID BEFORE JUDGING COMMENCES.

BOER GOATS

ALL BOER GOATS ARE REQUIRED TO BE IN THEIR CORRECT PENS BY 10.00 am ON WEDNESDAY, 24TH SEPTEMBER.

BOER GOATS WILL REMAIN ON EXHIBITION UNTIL 4.00 pm ON SUNDAY, 28TH SEPTEMBER

* DENOTES SPECIAL CLASS.

AN EXHIBIT CANNOT BE ENTERED IN A SPECIAL CLASS UNLESS IT HAS BEEN ENTERED IN THE ORDINARY CLASSES.

PRIZES: A ribbon and prizecard may be awarded, at the judges discretion, to placegetters in all classes.

203. All goats entered in this Section must be registered in a herd book recognised by the Company or recorded in the appendix sections of a herd book recognised by the Company.

For particulars of registration of Dairy Goats in the Goat Herd Book of Australia, apply to The Secretary, P.O. Box 189, Kiama, NSW, 2533.

For particulars of registration of Angora Goats in the Herd Book, apply to The Secretary, Mohair Australia, 4 Somers Rd. Malvern Vic. 3144.

For particulars of registration in the Angora Goat Breeders (Regd.) Herd Book, apply to The Secretary, Box 232, Berwick, Vic., 3806.

For particulars of registration in the Australian Boer Goat Breeders Association Inc, apply to the Secretary, RMB 4554, Newry, Vic, 3859.

204. If, in its absolute discretion the Company determines any exhibit or exhibits to be dangerous, for any reason whatsoever, the Company may by notice to the Exhibitor require the animal or animals concerned to be forthwith removed from the Show Grounds. The Exhibitor, upon receipt of such notice, shall forthwith remove such animals and failing such removal by him within the time prescribed by the Company, the Company may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed and all costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the exhibitor and shall be refunded to the Company.

205. Entries are accepted on the condition that stock must not be removed from the Show Grounds before 4.00pm on Sunday 28th September, 1997, unless authorised by the Company.

"IN MILK" AND "DRY" CLASSES AND SUCKLED KIDS

206. A Doe entered as "in milk" can be transferred to a "dry" or un-kidded class, whichever is applicable, if she has not kidded prior to judging day, and vice versa.

207. Does in milk must be at the Grounds on Wednesday, 24th September. They will be fully milked out and stripped dry between 8pm and 9pm on Wednesday, 24th September in the presence of the Stewards or whomever they may appoint. The owner or his representative must be in attendance when females are being stripped out.

208. The procedures for conducting the 24 hour Milk Production Tests are as recommended by the Dairy Goat Society of Australia.

Exhibitors in the 24 hour milk production classes are required to advise the Company before Monday, 15th September, 1997, of the following:

- (a) The number of lactations completed by each doe.
- (b) Last date of kidding or abortion.
- 209. Judges have the absolute right to order any Doe competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.
- 210. Notwithstanding Regulation 24 kids not entered for competition will be permitted in the Show Grounds if they are actually being suckled by mothers entered for competition.

Exhibitors may provide their own mesh or similar, to create their own kid areas within their penning areas, prior to the 24 hour milk test and judging day, if required, for kids brought in suckling their dams.

PAVILIONS OPEN TO PUBLIC

- 211. The Goat Pavilion will be open to the public each day animals are on exhibition.
- 212. The following regulations shall be read subject to Rules 27 through to 39 inclusive of the General Regulations.

JUDGING AND PARADES

213. UNLESS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THESE REGULATIONS, JUDGING OF DAIRY GOATS MAY TAKE PLACE ON. SATURDAY, 27TH SEPTEMBER.

JUDGING OF ANGORA GOATS MAY TAKE PLACE ON THURSDAY 25TH SEPTEMBER. JUDGING OF THE BOER GOATS MAY TAKE PLACE ON THURSDAY, 25TH SEPTEMBER.

- 214. Exhibitors of goats shall be present at the appropriate judging ring at least 15 minutes prior to the time specified in the Time Table for judging to take place. They must have their exhibits ready for judging, and enter the judging ring immediately upon request by the appropriate steward(s).
- 215. ATTENDANTS LEADING GOATS IN THE JUDGING RING OR ON PARADE MUST WEAR UNIFORM WHITE COATS (which may be procured from the Company) and the exhibit number of the goat. These numbers must be collected by the Exhibitors from the Superintendent's Office situated in the Sheep Pavilion.
- 216. After judging is completed, only prize-winning goats are permitted to take part in parades. All prize-winning dairy goats must be taken out on parade, in accordance with the printed programme. Prize-winning Angoras may also be paraded provided they can be suitably led. In any parade prior to judging, goats are to be paraded according to the following formula:

1-3 head exhibited - 1 head paraded 4-6 head exhibited - 2 head paraded over 6 head exhibited - 3 head paraded

No ribbons will be permitted on the exhibits on parade, except those won during the Show.

- 217. Persons in charge of exhibits must in no circumstance leave their exhibits unattended at or in the judging ring.
- 218. Persons in charge of exhibits at or in the judging ring shall not address the judge unless authorised by the Steward in Charge or the Judge himself.

CAPRINE ARTHRITIS ENCEPHALITIS (CAE)

- 219. DAIRY GOATS will not be permitted to enter the Show Grounds unless Exhibitors provide a veterinary certificate to the effect that the goats to be exhibited:
- (i) are from a CAE accredited free herd, or
- (ii) have had a least one negative ELISA test after January 1st, 1997, and show no clinical signs of the virus
- (iii) have had at least one (1) negative test after January 1st, 1997 for Johnes Disease and show no clinical signs (for goats over 12 months).

THESE CERTIFICATES MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE COMPANY'S OFFICE BY 30TH JULY, 1997, OR THE RELEVANT ENTRIES WILL BE CANCELLED.

Dairy goats will be housed separately from other goats.

STANDARD OF EXHIBITS

- 220. The Dairy Goat Society of Australia (Victorian Branch) shall recommend to the Company an inspector or inspectors of goats entered for exhibition.
- 221. The Company shall then appoint a person or persons as an inspector or inspectors who shall inspect each animal entered. The inspection of Goats unless otherwise provided by these Regulations shall be carried out by 7.00pm on Thursday, 25th September. Exhibitors are required to have their stock attended and in readiness for inspection on request. The inspector(s) shall make every effort to submit a report before 8.00am on Friday, 26th September. The requirement to participate in parades (Regulation 216) applies notwithstanding this Regulation.
- 222. Without prejudice to any other applicable regulations, if the relevant inspector determines, or the relevant inspectors unanimously determine that any animal entered for competition:
- (a) is not true to type; or
- (b) is not of sufficient merit as to be worthy of exhibition in the class or classes for which it is entered; or
- (c) has not been adequately prepared for the Show; or
- (d) bears any marking brand or tattoo inconsistent with either the markings brand or tattoo disclosed in the relevant entry form or any marking brand or tattoo not in accordance with the records of the relevant Breed Society.

then such animal shall be deemed to be ineligible for exhibition at the Show and the Company may by notice to the exhibitor, require the animal to be forthwith removed from the Show Grounds. The Exhibitor, upon receipt of such notice, shall forthwith remove such animal and failing such removal by him within the time prescribed by the Company, the Company may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed and all costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the exhibitor and shall be refunded to the Company.

- 223. Without prejudice, the determination of the inspectors or of the Veterinary Surgeons on any matter shall be subject only to appeal to the Chief Steward in the Goat Section, who shall make such determinations and directions as he thinks fit, which determinations and directions shall be final and shall not be called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever. The inspector, Veterinary Surgeons or Chief Steward shall not be required to furnish to the Exhibitor any reasons for their determination or directions or to give to the Exhibitor any right to be heard on any matter in question.
- 224. Any animal entered which can be proved to the satisfaction of the Company to have received hormones shall be disqualified. The decision or determination of the Company shall be final and shall not be called into question in any proceeding or in any manner whatsoever.

RUGGING

225. Exhibits must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public.

CLEANLINESS OF PENS

226. Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show. Cleaning of pens occupied by exhibits must be completed before 8am each day.

NOTICES

227. Exhibitors are permitted to display cards over the stalls allotted to them stating that an animal is for private sale. These cards are not to exceed 304.0 mm x 254.0 mm. No other advertisement or notices (except by permission of the Company) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings.

FEED SHEDS, BEDDING AND FODDER ARRANGEMENTS

228. In all Sections feed sheds are available for use by exhibitors at a charge of \$25.00 during the currency of the Show. For the convenience of exhibitors fodder merchants will visit the Show Grounds to accept orders for stock foods, etc. Deliveries of stock foods must be made before 9.00 am each day during the currency of the Show.

No bedding other than straw or hay may be used in any box or stall.

EXHIBIT TICKETS

229. All reasonable effort will be made to issue exhibitor tickets about a week before the Show opens. The exhibit ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen or stand, as the case may be. This number shall correspond with the exhibits' number in the official catalogue. If the box, stall or pen is not occupied by the relevant exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show, the accommodation shall revert to the Company.

The exhibit ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the grounds. Attendants' passes may be issued by the Superintendent at his office on the Show Grounds.
