

CONDITIONS OF EXHIBITION AND ENTRY

101. The General Regulations appearing in this Schedule form part of the conditions of entry. In the event of any inconsistency between the General Regulations and these conditions, the General Regulations shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless the General Regulations provide otherwise.

102. ENTRIES CLOSE AND MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE COMPANY AT THE ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING AT THE ROYAL SHOW GROUNDS, EPSOM ROAD, ASCOT VALE, 3032, BY NOT LATER THAN 4.30pm ON WEDNESDAY 31ST JULY, 1996. WHETHER SUCH ENTRIES ARE DELIVERED IN PERSON OR BY POST. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE APPLICABLE FEE, WHICH IS:-

\$15.00 PER ENTRY IN EACH CLASS FOR MEMBERS OF THE SOCIETY AND \$20.00 PER ENTRY IN EACH CLASS FOR NON-MEMBERS (STRAW INCLUSIVE).

FOR TROPHY CLASSES ONLY THE FEE IS \$7.50 PER ENTRY FOR MEMBERS AND \$10.00 FOR NON-MEMBERS. FLEECE CLASSES ARE \$5.00 PER ENTRY.

SCAN FEES

SCAN FEES HAVE BEEN SET AT \$6.00 PER ANIMAL AND THIS AMOUNT MUST BE SHOWN SEPARATELY ON YOUR ENTRY FORM AND THE AMOUNT INCLUDED WITH YOUR TOTAL ENTRY PAYMENT.

- 103. Entries are limited to two in each Single Class and one in each Pair Class from any one Exhibitor.
- 104. No exhibit in the Pair Classes can compete in Single Classes and vice versa.
- 105. Sheep need not be entered by name or tag number and no particulars other than the breeders' name and date of shearing will be published in the Show Catalogue.

EWES IN LAMB

106. A ewe entered as "with lamb of her own breed at foot" may be transferred to the Class provided for ewes of her age if she has not lambed prior to judging day, and vice versa.

PERIOD OF EXHIBITION

107. ALL SHEEP MUST BE PENNED BY 6.00am ON WEDNESDAY, 25TH SEPTEMBER AND MAY NOT BE REMOVED FROM THE SHOW GROUNDS UNTIL 6.00pm ON SUNDAY 29TH SEPTEMBER.

BLACK & COLOURED SHEEP MUST BE PENNED BY 6.00 P.M. ON FRIDAY 20TH SEPTEMBER, AND DEPART AT 6.00 P.M., SUNDAY 22ND SEPTEMBER.

ONCE THE SHOW COMMENCES, SHEEP CAN ONLY BE BROUGHT ONTO THE SHOWGROUNDS BETWEEN 6.00pm AND 6.00am.

Sheep Pavilions will be open to the public on Saturday 21st September, from 9.00am to 10.00pm Sunday 22nd September, from 9.00am to 9.00pm Monday 23rd

September, to Saturday 28th from 9.00am to 10.00pm Sunday, 29th from 9.00am to 6.00pm

OVINE BRUCELLOSIS

108. RAM ENTRIES WILL ONLY BE ACCEPTED FROM OVINE BRUCELLOSIS ACCREDITED FREE FLOCKS.

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN EXHIBITORS

109. South Australian sheep may return to their place of origin without restriction on Form 2 provided the owner submits a written statement to the Chief Inspector of Stock, Adelaide within seven (7) days of return, that throughout the absence from South Australia the sheep have been treated at 3-day intervals against foot-rot by immersion of each foot in 10% formalin solution and that at unloading on return a further immersion has taken place.

PHYSICAL SOUNDNESS AND DISAPPROVED EXHIBIT

110. All exhibitors must sign a statutory declaration to the effect that to the best of their knowledge no sheep exhibited by them are affected by foot-rot, or show any signs or symptoms of the disease at time of exhibition and Johne's Disease has not been known or suspected or known to exist, on the property from which each animal was derived, during the period five (5) years immediately prior to movement. Failure to sign a statutory declaration will render all sheep of an exhibitor ineligible to be exhibited, or to be offered for sale on the Showgrounds.

All male animals must be completely entire and deemed physically sound. Any male animal not deemed to be completely entire and physically sound by the Company's Veterinary Surgeon shall not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing.

111. The owner or exhibitor of any exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Company or a Veterinary Surgeon of the Company must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit from the Company's Grounds. Subject to Rules 18 and 19 of the General Regulations, the Company reserves the absolute right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not in the opinion of the Company, up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show. Such a decision or determination is entirely within the discretion of the Company and shall not be questioned or challenged in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

112. Exhibits must not be rugged after judging day during the hours the Show is open to the Public. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of \$50.00 for every infringement of this regulation.

PREPARATION OF SHEEP AND CLEANLINESS OF STALLS

113. Exhibitors or their employees are not permitted to prepare (i.e., trim, etc.) Exhibits in any passageway or in any judging area in the Pavilion after 5pm on the day prior to judging day.

No preparation (including trimming) of SHORN sheep will be permitted after the commencement of inspection unless extenuating circumstances exist and permission is granted by the Chief Steward. The grant of permission is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward.

No trimming will be permitted after judging except with the permission of the Chief Steward.

No tattooing of sheep is permitted on the Showgrounds.

The washing of legs of Poll Dorset Sheep is not permitted on the Showgrounds.

Exhibitors are not permitted to use powders or other substances on the face and/or colour on legs and feet in the preparation of sheep for showing.

114. Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show. They must complete cleaning of pens occupied by their exhibits before 6am each day on which sheep are at the Show.

ADVERTISING

115. No advertisements of notices (except by permission of the Chief Steward) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings.

REGISTRATION

116. All sheep entered in Sections 61 - 82 inclusive must be recorded in flocks which are registered in the name of the exhibitor in the flock book of a Breed Society recognised by the Company.

INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS (TATTOOS, ETC.)

117. Each Breed Society in the Sheep Sections shall recommend to the Company an Inspector or Inspectors of sheep entered as exhibits in the breed of that particular Breed Society. The Company shall then appoint a person or persons as an Inspector or Inspectors who shall then examine all sheep entered in the relevant breed and discard any not up to standard and those not shorn in accordance with the Regulations.

The inspection of sheep may commence at 10.00am Wednesday 25th September. YELLOW INSPECTION CARDS MUST BE HANDED INTO THE SHEEP SUPERINTENDENTS OFFICE BY 8.00am IF THESE CARDS ARE NOT HANDED IN, SHEEP WILL NOT BE INSPECTED AND ARE THEREFORE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR JUDGING.

Poll Dorset sheep may be inspected at 10.00am on Thursday 26th September.

SHEEP NOT IN THEIR ALLOTTED PENS AT THE TIME OF THE OFFICIAL INSPECTION MAY BE DISQUALIFIED BY THE CHIEF STEWARD. Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward and shall not be challenged or called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

118. All British Breeds of Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock book of the country of origin) must be visibly and legibly tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade

mark of the Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep Ltd. in accordance with the Rules of that Society.

All Poll Dorset Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Book of the county of origin) must be tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Poll Dorset Association Inc. in accordance with the rules of that Association.

All Corriedale, Merino, Perendale, White Suffolk, Drysdale and Polwarth Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be visibly and legibly tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Book of the country of origin) must be tattooed in accordance with the Rules of their Associations.

All Texel Sheep exhibited must be tattooed with their breeders' registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Texel Stud Breeders Association Inc in accordance with the Rules of that Association (except imported sheep which must be tattooed in accordance with the Regulations of the recognised Flock Register of the country of origin).

119. Any sheep found to be not visibly and legibly tattooed may be liable to be disqualified by the Company. Any decision or determination by the Company to disqualify is entirely within its discretion and shall not be called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

120. Exhibits over 2 1/2 years old may not have their teeth filed or ground. Any decision or determination by the Chief Steward to disqualify is entirely within his discretion and shall not be called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.

ALL SHEEP ENTERED IN THE 1 1/2 YEARS OLD CLASSES MUST NOT BE SHOWING MORE THAN TWO TEETH. IF THERE ARE SIGNS OF FOUR TEETH ERUPTING, AN ANIMAL IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR EXHIBITION.

LAMBS AT FOOT ARE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE IN LAMB CLASSES AND MUST BE TATTOOED.

THE DAMS OF SHEEP ENTERED IN THE LAMB CLASSES MUST NOT BE BROUGHT ON TO THE SHOW GROUNDS UNLESS THEY ARE ENTERED FOR EXHIBITION IN ANOTHER CLASS.

121. Disqualified sheep shall not be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Exhibitors of disqualified sheep may remove them from the Show Grounds.

SHORN AND UNSHORN SHEEP

122. All sheep in the British Breeds, Perendale and Poll Dorset Classes (except shorn sheep) over 18 months old must have been fairly and evenly shorn between 1st August 1995 and 31st January 1996. Date of shearing to be given on entry form. Corriedales must be shorn on or after 1st July, 1995. Merinos must be shorn on or after 15th August 1995 and/or 15th March, 1996. The minimum wool length for Poll Dorsets in all woolly classes shall be 4cm.

Exhibits of shorn sheep, except those entered in Romney Classes 53, 54, 59 and 60 must be closely and evenly shorn on or before the 1st September, 1996.

Corriedale sheep entered in shorn classes may not have more than 5cm of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection.

Polwarth sheep must be fairly and evenly shorn and must not carry more than 13mm (1/2") of wool as at 15th August, 1995.

Drysdale sheep must be shorn between the 1st and the 31st March, 1996.

No Longwool sheep (except Romney and Border Leicester) entered in a shorn Class may have more than 4cm of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection and no Shortwool sheep entered in a shorn Class may have more than 2cm of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection.

Sheep entered in the six Romney Classes 53, 54, 59 and 60 must be machine shorn with standard thickness combs on or after 1st June of the year of the Show. Exhibitors are required to advise the Company before 27th May, 1996 that they intend exhibiting in such Classes, so that shearing inspections can be completed by 10th June, 1996.

Sheep entered in the under 1 1/2 years old classes may be shorn or unshorn. If shorn this must have been carried out prior to 31st January, 1996, except Corriedales which are permitted to be shorn prior to the 31st March, 1996.

Sheep not shorn in accordance with the above regulations will be disqualified.

Exhibits in the wool are not eligible to be entered in the Classes provided for shorn sheep, and if found to be so entered shall be removed from the grounds.

INSPECTION APPEALS

123. An Exhibitor or competitor may appeal against an Inspectors decision.

Subject to the regulations in the relevant Prize Schedule appeals shall be addressed to THE CHAIRMAN, SHEEP COMMITTEE, AND BE LODGED AT THE SHEEP SUPERINTENDENTS' OFFICE IN LENNON AVENUE, SHOWGROUNDS, before 6pm on the day the decision in question has been made. SUCH APPEALS SHALL BE ACCOMPANIED WITH A DEPOSIT OF \$50.00 which may be forfeited to the Company if in the sole opinion of the Chief Steward the appeal is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious.

The appeal and all matters arising therefrom shall be determined conclusively as to all matters by the Company and shall not be the subject of any appeal to any court or any order for review or of a similar nature.

FEED SHEDS, BEDDING AND FODDER ARRANGEMENTS

124. Feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Sheep Sections. On application to the Company, a shed will be reserved for the currency of the Show at a charge of \$25. Exhibitors must provide their own locks for feed lockers. No bedding other than straw maybe used in any pens. For the convenience of exhibitors, fodder merchants will attend the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc. Delivery of food stocks must be made before 9.00am each day during the Show.

JUDGING

125. The following regulations shall be read subject to Regulations 27 through to 39 inclusive of the General Regulations.

Judges may, if they so desire, commence the judging on the sheep under 1 1/2 years.

126. Any animal entered which can be proved to the satisfaction of the Chief Steward to have received hormones shall be disqualified. The decision or determination of the Chief Steward shall be final and shall not be called into question in any proceeding or in any manner whatsoever.

127. All attendants leading stock in the judging ring or on parade shall wear the approved uniform and the exhibit numbers of the Sheep. These numbers must be collected by the exhibitor from the Superintendents' Office.

128. Persons in charge of exhibits at or in the judging ring shall not address the judge unless authorised by the Steward in Charge or the Judge himself.

STRAWING AND CLEANING OF PENS

129. The Company will arrange for the strawing of all pens prior to the Show. The charge for each pen is included in the entry fee.

MUCKING OUT TIMES ARE BETWEEN 6pm AND 6am AND THESE TIMES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

SHEEP SALES

130. SHEEP NOT PARADED BEFORE THE JUDGE SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR SALE. THIS REGULATION DOES NOT APPLY WHERE ONE OF A PAIR IS REJECTED BY THE INSPECTORS.

Exhibitors who sell sheep during the period of the Show must make arrangements for the Exhibit Entry Tickets to be transferred to the purchaser or his agents to enable the sheep to be removed from the pavilion at the conclusion of the exhibition.

SMOKING

131. Smoking and naked flames are at all times prohibited in Lockers and Pavilions.

132. Ribbons and prize cards may be awarded to placegetters according to the table below.

Judging is subject to Regulations 30 - 33. The Judge is under no obligation to award the prizes listed in the table where he considers in his absolute discretion that such prize or prizes are not to be awarded.

MOST SUCCESSFUL EXHIBITOR AWARDS

133. The Most Successful Exhibitor Awards in all breeds will be calculated as follows:

Classes with 1 to 10 entries: First 3 points, second 2 points, third 1 point.

Classes with 11 to 30 entries: First 4 points, second 3 points, third 2 points, fourth 1 point.

Classes with over 30 entries: First 5 points, second 4 points, third 3 points, fourth 2 points, fifth 1 point. Placings in trophy and group classes will not be taken into consideration when deciding these awards.

In the event of a tie, two points will be allotted for Champion awards and one point for Reserve Champion awards. If a tie still exists a count back, approved by the Company, will be made to determine the winner.

In the British Breed Section, there must be a minimum of 2 exhibitors in each section, before the awards can be made.

EXCESS ENTRIES

134. In the event of more entries being received than can be accommodated, ewe entries will be reduced to one in each Class from any one Exhibitor. If necessary the number of sheep of each breed from any one Exhibitor may also be reduced to a figure determined by the Company. The Exhibitors will have the right to nominate the sheep to be withdrawn should this reduction be necessary.

135. OBJECTIVE MEASUREMENT CLASSES,

Points will be allocated for:
Weight - maximum 30 points
Below 80kgs - 10 points
For every additional 2kgs - 1 point will be awarded up to a maximum of 120kgs, which will receive 30 points.

Ultrasound Measurement - maximum 30 points.




