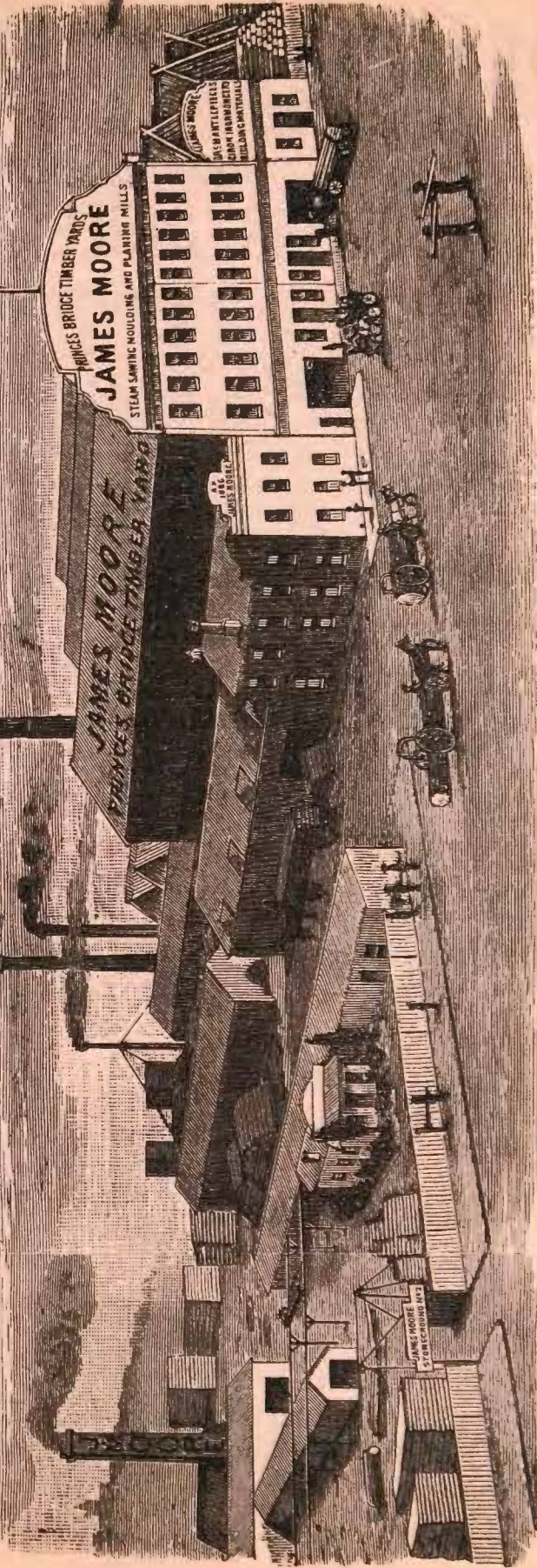

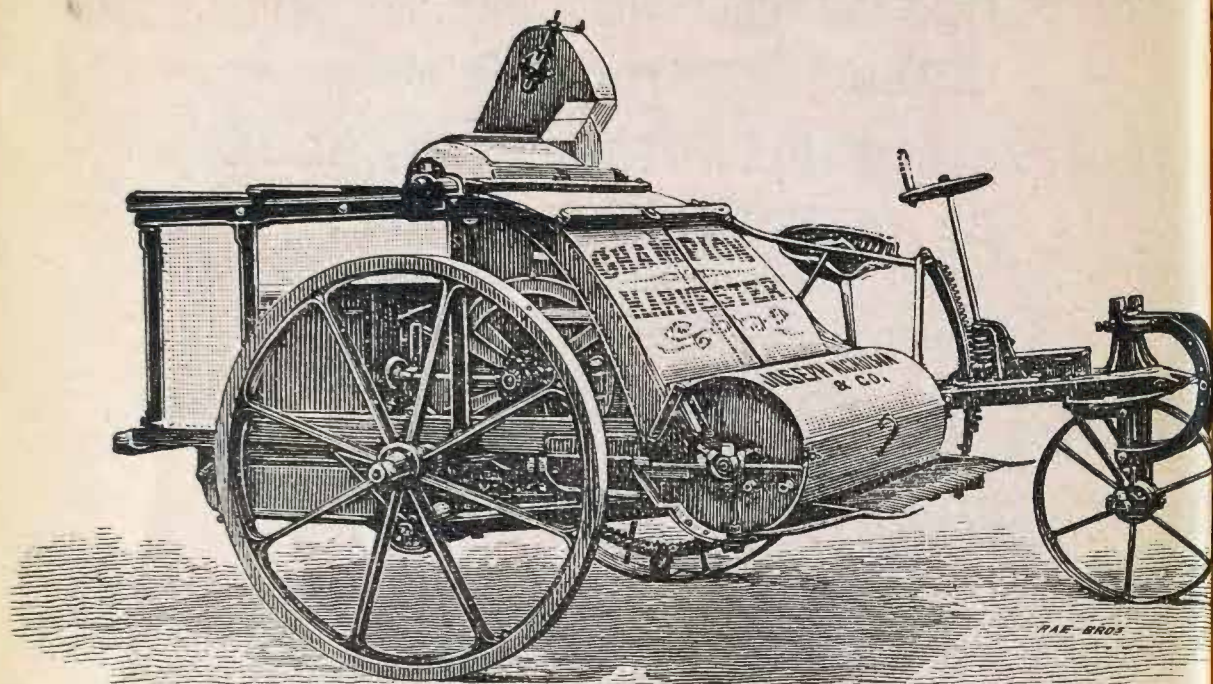

“The economical harvesting of grain has become such an important factor in the production of cereals throughout Victoria and Southern Riverina that the late trial of Combined Harvesters at Berrigan will be regarded with interest by agriculturists generally. Only three machines competed, which were from the following makers—Messrs. J. Nicholson and Co., Mr. J. Munro, and Messrs. T. Robinson and Co. The trial took place on the farm of Mr. Gregory, and the awards were afterwards made by ballot among the farmers present. There were 36 papers issued, and of these 30 were in favour of Messrs. J. Nicholson and Co.’s machine. Mr. J. Munro received four votes, Messrs. T. Robinson and Co. got one vote, and one vote was informal. The result of the ballot was received with much cheering, and was evidently in accord with the opinions of the spectators. The winning machine was driven by Mr. J. Beveridge, a farmer who has this year harvested 410 acres of grain with it. He has taken off in a 6½ bag to the acre crop 96 bags of wheat in one day, using two teams of horses to do the work.”—*The Argus*, January 13, 1894.

## RULES.

[As the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria has resolved to hold their Shows under the rules of the English Kennel Club, as adopted by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, and has recognized that Society as the local custodian of a Stud Register kept in accordance with the Kennel Club Rules, the following code is published for the guidance of the Society's Dog Shows.]

1. Every dog exhibited at the Show must, at or before the time of entry for such Show, be entered in a registry of names kept by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, at their offices, 195 Collins-street, Melbourne. A charge of 1s. each dog will be made for registration. A name that has been already assumed and duly registered in the *Victorian Poultry and Dog Society's Stud Book*, or entered in any published number of the *Kennel Club Calendar* or *Stud Book*, by the owner of a

dog of the same breed, cannot be registered except by a distinguishing name or number. If the name of a dog be changed, or an old name be reassumed, such name shall be required to be registered previous to the time of entry.

NOTE.—Any dog not previously registered in accordance with Rule 1 may be registered at this Society's office at the time of entry for Show on payment of the registration fee of one shilling.

2. Dogs that are already entered in the *Victorian Poultry and Dog Society's Stud Book*, or in any published number of the *Kennel Club Calendar* or *Stud Book*, are exempt from the above rule, provided their names remain unchanged. Puppies exhibited in classes exclusively for litters of puppies are also exempt.

3. Any dog which is to be exhibited at a Show held under the Rules must be the *bonâ-fide* property of the exhibitor in whose name he is entered, and must have been so fourteen clear days before the first day of the Show. Each dog must, on the entry form, be clearly identified by name, by date of birth, and by the name of his sire or dam, and of the breeder, each and every one of them, if known (as registered in accordance with Rule 1); and if the dam was covered by more than one dog, the names of all must be given. If the age, pedigree, or breeder's name be not known, the dog must be entered at each Show as breeder, age, or pedigree unknown, any or all, as the case may be.

4. The *bonâ-fide* owner of the dam at the time she whelps shall be considered to be the breeder of the litter. In cases, however, where a bitch is lent for breeding purposes, the person to whom the bitch is lent shall be considered the breeder of the puppies born during the period of such loan, provided he or she, before the litter is born, send to the Secretary of this Society, or to the Secretary of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, a statement of the facts, signed by himself or herself and the owner of the bitch.

5. If the name of the dog which has won a prize has been changed, it is necessary in entering the said dog to give his old name as well as his new name every time he is exhibited until the change has been duly published in the *Victorian Poultry and Dog Society's Stud Book*; and if his name be changed again all his names must be repeated for a like period.

6. If a dog shall be entered except as before directed by Rules 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 he shall forfeit any prize that may have been awarded him; and if the omission be detected in time he shall not be allowed to compete, and shall in either case forfeit all entrance fees and subscriptions.

7. The Council or authorities may reserve to themselves the right of refusing any entries they may think fit to exclude.

8. A castrated dog or speyed bitch shall be disqualified from competing or receiving a prize if awarded.

9. Total blindness shall absolutely disqualify; partial blindness shall have great weight against a dog. Should a dog appear to be deaf or lame it shall be in the power of the judge to disqualify, unless he is satisfied that such defects are temporary.

10. No dog shall be qualified to compete who shall be declared by the duly qualified and appointed Veterinary Inspector during the Show to exhibit any form of any contagious or infectious disease, neither shall such dog be entitled, if in that condition, to receive a prize if awarded, unless the Council shall consider that the owner of the dog was not to blame in the matter. The Veterinary Inspector shall give his decision in writing, duly signed, to the Secretary or Committee of the Show before its close, and such opinion shall be final as regards the condition of the dog.

11. Any person who is proved to the satisfaction of the Council to have been guilty of any fraudulent or discreditable conduct in connection with dogs, dog shows, or field trials, may, in addition to any pecuniary penalty to which he may be liable, be declared incapable of competing for or winning a prize at any Show or field trial held under these Rules, for such period as the Council may decide upon.

12. An equal (champion) or first prize shall be counted as a win to both dogs. In estimating the number of prizes a dog has won, the number of prizes won shall be calculated up to 12 noon of the day previous to the original day of closing entries for the Show.

13. No dog shall be allowed to compete in a novice class that has won a first prize up to the time of judging such class, but in the event of a winner being barred his entry money shall be returned.



14. The Committee of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society shall, from time to time, forward to the governing bodies of all Shows held under the Society's Rules a list of Shows selected by them as being worthy to rank as two-point Shows. A first prize at any one of such Shows shall, for all purposes of a champion class qualification, count two points; a first prize at any other Show held under the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society's Rules shall count one point. In calculating the points necessary to qualify for a champion class a prize won in a novice class shall not count. No dog shall be qualified to compete in a champion class that has won less than six points at Shows held under the Rules of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, or at Shows registered in and for the *Kennel Club Calendar and Stud Book*; and no dog shall compete in an open class that is qualified to compete in a champion class at any Show where champion classes are provided for that breed. The prizes must be won in open classes, or in classes provided for colonial-bred dogs of any breed, or in varieties of the same breed, divided by weight, colour, sex, or age in adult classes; and one of the prizes must be won at a Show held by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, or at a two-point Show held under the Rules of the Kennel Club. This Society's Shows, and the Shows of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, shall rank as two-point Shows. All other Shows held under the Rules of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society shall rank as one-point Shows.

15. No dog shall be entitled to be called a champion that has not won a first prize in a champion class at a Show held under these Rules, or in a challenge class at a Show held under Kennel Club Rules. No dog entitled to be called a champion shall be allowed to compete in an open class at any Show held under these Rules, whether a champion class be provided at the Show or not.

N.B. to Rules 14 and 15.—These Rules shall come into operation upon 1st July, 1890, and any dog which shall have qualified previously to that date for competition in a champion class must compete in a champion class where such class is provided. Any dog entitled to be called a champion before that date shall not be deprived of his title. A first prize won at any Show under these Rules previous to 1st July, 1890, by any dog not fully qualified to compete in a champion class under the old Rules, will score one or two points as provided in the new Rules.

16. If any dog be disqualified by the Judge, or formally objected to during the Show, for being improperly tampered with, the Veterinary Inspector shall examine the dog, and give his opinion to the Secretary in writing before the close of the Show.

17. Any objection to a dog may be made by any person; it must be made to the Council or Secretary of the Society not later than the Friday preceding the close of the Show. The objection must be in writing, and the objector must (unless in cases where the objection is laid by the Council or by the regularly constituted Committee of a show, in which cases a deposit shall not be necessary) at the same time lodge a sum of £1 in the hands of the Council or Secretary, which deposit shall, if the objection be proved frivolous, be forfeited.

18. In the foregoing Rules, the word "dog" shall be interpreted to include both sexes.

### SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. All dogs must have chains and collars, without names, attached, to enable them to be taken out if required.

2. Any dog wearing a collar with its owner's name thereon will be disqualified from receiving a prize.

3. Exhibitors will, on personal application to one of the Stewards, be permitted to loose their dogs for exercise for a short time each day—in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, after the closing of the Exhibition; but they will on no account be permitted to remove the same from the Yards without a written order from the Secretary, and a deposit of £2. (See General Regulations, Clause 30.)

4. Dogs considered by the Stewards and Hon. Veterinary Surgeon unfit for exhibition, either from disease, vice, or other causes, will not be received, or removed if found necessary.

5. Dogs to be in their places in the Yards on Wednesday by ten o'clock.

NOTE.—The Society will engage a thoroughly practical man to take charge of the Dogs.

**SPECIAL REGULATIONS re CHAMPION PRIZES of AUSTRALIA.**

(The gift of the Parliament of Victoria, through the Department of Agriculture).

1. All exhibits to be the *bonâ-fide* property of exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being Exhibitors.

2. Unless three entries at least have been made, and unless there are not less than two exhibits, prizes shall not be awarded if the Judges do not report the exhibits to be of exceptional merit and worthy of the prizes.

3. The prizes to be awarded by Judges appointed by the Society.

4. In any case where, in the opinion of the Secretary for Agriculture, any misstatement has been made regarding any exhibit, the prize shall not be paid.

5. All exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

NOTE.—Separate entries are not required for Champion Prizes of Australia.

**GENERAL REGULATIONS.**

1. All exhibits must be *bonâ fide* the property of the exhibitor, and produce, which must be the growth of the present year, must be grown or made by the exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being exhibitors.

2. No exhibit will be allowed to enter in more than one class, except for a sweepstake, or for a special or champion prize.

3. General entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society, and must be in the hands of the Secretary, at the office, The Rialto, 497 Collins-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, the 4th day of August, 1894, at 12 o'clock noon. On payment of an extra entry fee, double-fee entries will be received till 5 p.m. on Tuesday, 7th August, when all entries close. Entry fees, in accordance with next regulation, to accompany each entry.

4. Members of the Society (subscription, £1) will be charged a fee of five shillings on each entry, except for Poultry and Wines, in which Sections the entry fee in each Class is 2s. 6d. Non-members will be charged ten per cent. on the money value of the first prize in each Class in which they enter, provided always that no entry fee in any Class (except for Poultry and Wines) shall be less than five shillings, which amount covers entries in Classes in which medals are offered for first prizes. Entry fees must accompany entries. N.B.—Special entry fee in Classes 30, 31, and 32.

5. Separate entries (with entry fees) must be made for Special Prizes in cases in which the prizes have Class numbers. When the Special Prize is not in a numbered Class, a separate entry is not required.

6. The correct age of exhibits of Live Stock must be set forth in each entry. Any infringement of this rule will disqualify the exhibit.

7. In addition to other particulars, the date on which sheep were shorn must be stated on the entry form.

8. The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year for horses, and 1st July in each year for cattle. Colonial-bred shall mean bred in any of the Australasian colonies.

9. After the entries close an entry ticket will be issued, stating the number of each exhibit's box, stall, pen, or stand, as the case may be, which will correspond with the number of the exhibit in the official catalogue. This ticket will admit the exhibit and attendant to the yards. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the Show Grounds. Attendants' passes will be issued by the Secretary on the Grounds.

10. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense, and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse entry not exhibited, of £1 for each entry of cattle not exhibited, and of 10s. for each entry of sheep or pigs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the exhibitor or his authorized agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by—(1) The death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the Class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at the future meetings of the Society.

11. Persons or firms intending to exhibit stands of Machinery and Implements, single exhibits, or articles or goods for exhibition only (Section 43), must apply for space on or before Saturday, 30th June, 1894. After the applications close positions will be allotted, and a charge will be made in proportion to frontage and position granted. Entries of this description of exhibits must afterwards be duly made on the Society's forms, and properly described for insertion in the Catalogue.

12. All exhibits of Carriages, Buggies, &c. (Section 36), and Machinery, Implements, and Miscellaneous Exhibits (Section 43), must be in their places in the Yards on Tuesday night, 28th August. All other exhibits, except Hunters, Ladies' Hunters, Jumpers, Carriage Pairs, and Wines, &c. (see foot of this regulation), must be in their places in the yards by 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 29th August, when the Judges will commence adjudication. Hunters, Ladies' Hunters, High Jumpers, and Carriage Pairs will only be required to be in the Yards on the day or days on which they perform. Boxes will not be allotted to horses in these



Classes. Wines, &c. (Section 40), must be lodged in the cellars of the Exhibition Building, Carlton Gardens, on or before Tuesday, 31st July, 1894, at 5 p.m.

13. Exhibits will not be received in the Yards after the date and hour specified. No animal or article, whether for competition or not, will be admitted to the Show Grounds unless duly entered.

14. All Exhibits must be placed where directed by the Secretary, and (except live stock, in accordance with regulations) must not be removed from their Classes during the Exhibition.

15. The owner or exhibitor of any exhibit or stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

16. As many men will be allowed into the Yards free as the Council may deem necessary to take charge of exhibits, and passes will be issued to all such on application to the Secretary at the Show Grounds.

17. Exhibits must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public, without the consent of the Stewards of the Class.

18. When ordered by the Stewards, attendants on horses and cattle must take the exhibits out on parade. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of 10s. in each case in which the order of the Stewards to parade is not obeyed, and shall be liable to forfeit any prize awarded to their exhibit or exhibits.

19. No exhibitor or manager of an exhibiting company (except in the case of an owner riding or driving his exhibit) will be allowed in that Section of the yard in which his exhibit is placed during the adjudication of the Judges; and it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judges, and if necessary to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective lots, or address the Judges, unless authorized by the Stewards of the Section in which they are exhibiting.

20. The Judges may award a Second or a Third Prize instead of a First one, or may withhold a Prize altogether, where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit. Any exhibit (for which no Class is provided) likely to benefit the colony, if entered as an extra in a competing section, may be recommended a Prize or Certificate if considered meritorious.

21. The Judges are requested to make a reserve number of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which prizes are awarded in every Class where the number of entries exceeds the number of prizes offered if, in their opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; they are also requested to give commendations when deserved.

22. No prize can be recommended by the Judges for extra exhibits if the Prize List contains a Class in which the same can compete.

23. The Council may withhold any Prize when statements have been erroneously or fraudulently made regarding an exhibit; and exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements may be debarred from again exhibiting, and, if Members, will be liable to expulsion from the Society.

24. Any person insulting or interfering with the Judges during the Show will be subject to removal from the yards, and the Prizes, if any, awarded to them forfeited.

25. Any exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any exhibit to which a Prize is awarded, and to keep the same on during the hours of exhibition, will, on proof thereof to the Council, be disqualified from receiving all prizes awarded to the said exhibit during the Show, and no exhibitor will be allowed to display any Prize Card in addition to those issued by the Society for the year.

26. Should any exhibit, having gained a Prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judges, shall decide the question.

27. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society, and in the case of protests the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

28. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Secretary, *in writing*, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of £1 sterling, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.

29. No exhibit (except Live Stock) can be removed from the Exhibition until 5 p.m. on Saturday, when all exhibits may leave the yard.

30. Live Stock may be removed from the yards each day of the exhibition after 5 p.m. on depositing with the Secretary an approved cheque for £10 (or for dogs, £2—see Special Regulation under Section 35, Clause 3) as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the yards next morning before 10 a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned before the time specified, the cheque, together with all prize-money (if any) it has won, will be forfeited; but on the animal's return each day the cheque will be refunded to the exhibitor.

31. Water will be provided in the yards for Live Stock and the working of machinery.

32. Exhibitors of stock will be required to provide their own forage (which can be purchased in the yards at Melbourne prices); and exhibitors of machinery, fuel (which must be coke or wood, no coal being allowed), and materials necessary to enable them to comply with the Regulations.

33. No person will be permitted to make drawings or photographs of any exhibit without the written consent of the exhibitor.

34. The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements, or other documents is restricted exclusively to exhibitors at their respective stands. Any person infringing this regulation will incur expulsion from the yards.

35. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.



36. All exhibits of Live Stock must be removed from the Show Grounds within one week after the last day of sales, or a charge will be made for boxes.

37. The Exhibition will be open to the public on Wednesday from 10 a.m. (during adjudication by the Judges), admission 2s. 6d.; on Thursday (vice-regal day), from 9 a.m., admission 2s. 6d.; and on Friday and Saturday from 9 a.m., admission 1s. Admission to grandstand on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, 2s. 6d.

38. Members, on presentation of their badges, will be admitted, with one lady, free to the grounds and grandstand.

39. Cheques for prizes awarded at the Show will be passed for payment on Tuesday, 11th September, 1894, after which date they will be payable on application to the Secretary.

40. Any prize or prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for six months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

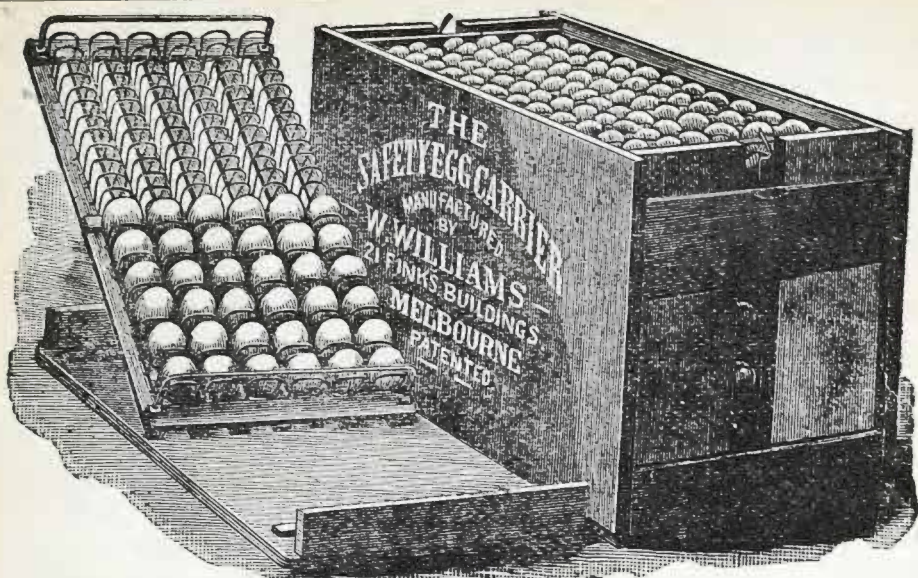

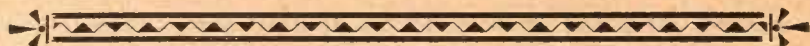

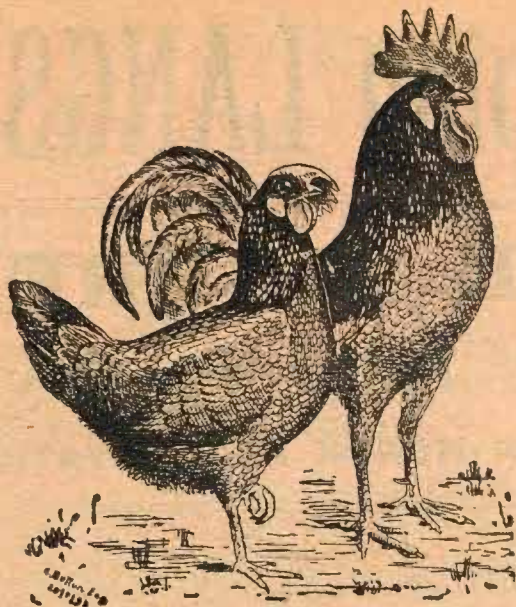

“Langshans were the largest classes in the show, eighty-two birds being entered in the four classes. Mr. G. E. Andrew, of Caulfield, had quite a field day, scoring 1 in cocks, 1 in hens, 1 and 2 in cockerels, and 1 and 3 in pullets. There was much enthusiasm displayed amongst those present in the result of the Langshan competition, the cockerel class being the largest in the show, containing thirty-eight birds. The judge's decisions were well received, and seldom have I seen so large a body of exhibitors so well satisfied, the unanimous verdict being that the awards could not be altered in any particular. “Langshans—thirty-seven cockerels, twenty-two pullets, seven cocks, and fifteen hens—a fair lot of classes for a judge to tackle and come out safe, which we think the judge, Mr. W. T. Wright, did; and at any rate the majority of exhibitors agreed upon the verdict. G. E. Andrew opened the ball by winning first in cocks—the bird won well in class, good body, good colour, neat head for a cock, and well shown. In hens, G. E. Andrew won with a grand bodied bird, close in feather, with grand head and eye, one of the best hens in the show. The Langshan cockerel class caused the greatest excitement, and the grand entry of thirty-seven made some work for the judge, who took off his coat and went to work in a free style. This class took over forty minutes to judge, and nearly all the time was taken up with five birds. This will prove how hot the competition was. G. E. Andrew won first and second, a clear win, the Essendon winner not being able to hold his own in such company. In the pullets, Andrew again won with a tight feathered, good coloured pullet, with neat head, fine in bone, and nice shape.”
