THE ANNUAL EXHIBITION will be opened on THURSDAY, 21st SEPTEMBER.

Members of the Society, on presentation of their badges, will be admitted to the Grounds and Grand Stands free.

The public will be admitted on Thursday, 21st September (Judging Day), on payment of 2/6, and on the remaining days of the Show, till Saturday, 30th September (inclusive), from 9 a.m., on payment of 2/6. Admission to Public Grand Stand, 3/- extra; to the "Chirnside" and "Cliff" Stands, 2/- extra; and "Gibsonia" and "Cumming" Stands, 1/- extra. Children under 14 will be admitted to the grounds on a payment of 6d., and to all Grand Stands at half-price.

All horses and ponies entered in Sections 1 to 11 inclusive are required to be at the grounds from 9 a.m. on Thursday, 21st September, until 1 p.m. on Friday, 29th September, unless otherwise specified.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 1 p.m. on Friday, 29th September.

The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year.

Any prize awarded to a mare exhibited as being in foal may be withheld until the production of a certificate that she has produced a foal after the exhibition and previous to the 1st January next ensuing.

All Stallions over 2 years of age, owned in Victoria, must be registered as required by the provisions of the Horse Breeding (Victoria) Act 1928.

Stallions over two years of age exhibited from States other than Victoria, need not be registered under the Act, but must be examined and passed by a Government Veterinary Officer in respect of both soundness and type.

All Stallions and Mares over two years of age entered in Sections 1 to 9 (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 4) must, after examination by a Government Veterinary Officer, have their Entry Tickets stamped "Pass to Ring" before entering the judging ring.

Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 20th September, commencing at 10 a.m.

Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct class. The official measurer will be in attendance on the Grounds on Tuesday, 19th, and Wednesday, 20th September, at 10 a.m.; on Thursday, 21st September, at 8 a.m., and on each remaining day of the Show from 9.30 a.m. to 10 a.m., and horses and ponies must be there to obtain their certificates, which must be produced to the Steward when entering the judging ring.

When measuring a horse, galloway or pony, an allowance of three-eighths ($\frac{3}{8}$) of an inch for shoes will be made. Should an exhibit be measured with shoes on and the exhibitor disagree with the Official Measurer's decision as to the height of the animal, he may, should he desire, have it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, in his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any horse, galloway, or pony, prior to measurement.

If the judge entertains a doubt as to the correctness of a height certificate, he has the power to order the exhibit to be re-measured. In such case the Steward shall accompany the exhibit to the Measurer's Stand and supervise the re-measuring.

Exhibits in classes in which an age certificate from the Society's Veterinary Surgeon is required must be paraded for examination at 4 p.m. on Wednesday, 20th September.

All entrants in light horse, pony and contest sections must state performances of horse or pony on entry form. Immediately after the close of entries the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. In this connection first preference will be given to approved animals from other States. All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded. In all Hunting and Jumping Contests, competitors will be limited to 30.

The upper portion of the door of the Horse Boxes outside the Pavilion must remain open during the hours the Show is open to the public. The Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

Horses are not permitted to enter the Judging Ring if fitted with bearing reins.

Any Exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of one pound.

Several feed stalls are available for Exhibitors. Charge, 12/6 during the currency of the Show. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Horse Pavilions. The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Regulations 14 and 15. These will be strictly enforced.

Exhibits of horses which, in the opinion of the Society, are not in reasonable Show condition, shall be removed from the grounds and shall not be eligible to be offered for sale on the Show Grounds.

Exhibitors are advised to study the timetable, showing times at which judging in the various Classes is to be commenced. Judging in any Class will not commence before the time specified. No warning will be given, and any competitor not present when the Judge is ready to commence will miss the opportunity to compete.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS.

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 12 noon on Friday, 29th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.

PARADES.

Prize-winning horses and cattle ONLY will be permitted to take part in Parades.

All prize-winning horses and cattle must be taken out on parade, in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of ten shillings in each case in which this regulation is not complied with, and shall also be liable to forfeit the prize or prizes awarded to their exhibit or exhibits.

All horses and cattle parading must wear exhibit numbers.

No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

EXERCISING HORSES.

The exercising of Clydesdales and Trotters will be allowed on the arena track only before 8.0 a.m. on any day of the Show, and one week prior thereto, by permission of the Superintendent. No light horses (other than Trotters) may be exercised on the arena or track at any time.

Females recorded in the Appendices to the C.C.S.B. will not be eligible to compete in this Section.

GENERAL REMARKS.

The Test is to be performed from memory. All entries must be lodged with the Secretary by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 20th September, on the special entry form which will be supplied on application.

The Novice test (Section 1) will be introduced in the Royal Agricultural Society's programme commencing in September 1950. The Novice Test will be included in the succeeding years, and by the year 1951, the Novice Test will be com-

plete in its entirety Section 2 being included. In addition to the Novice Test, a Medium and Advanced Test, will be incepted in due course. In the year 1951, two dressage tests will become a popular feature in the Arena Events, mainly, the Novice and Medium Tests.

SADDLERY.

Type of saddle and bridle to be used in these tests is optional, but Martingales and bearing reins of ANY KIND as well as riding whips or riding canes are PROHIBITED.

SPURS.

The choice in the type of spurs is optional. Spurs must be worn, but NOT USED in these tests. If any attempt is made to use a Spur or Spurs during the tests, the rider will be DISQUALIFIED.

NOVICE TEST (Section 1.)

The Novice Test is open to riders of any age, riding horses of any size or age, neither rider nor the horse having won a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd prize in Dressage Tests.

First Prize — £10. Second Prize — £5.
Third Prize — £2.

Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Prizes — Ribbons.
Entry Fee: 10/-, Members 7/-.

DEFINITION OF PACES.

(In accordance with the Statutes and General Regulations of the Federation Equestre Internationale).

HALT: At the Halt, the horse, standing square on his four legs and immobile, must be ready to move forward at the least pressure of the riders legs.

EXTENDED WALK: At the extended walk, the horse should cover as much ground as quickly as possible WITHOUT haste and without breaking. The hind-legs passing clearly beyond the tracks of the fore legs. The rider gives freedom to the head and neck of the horse without, however, losing contact, so as to be able at any moment to make the horse change his pace, his speed, or his direction.

EXTENDED TROT: At the extended trot, the horse extends his action, his neck is stretched, his shoulders vigorously driven on by the haunches, gains ground forward without noticeably increasing height.

ORDINARY WALK: The ordinary walk is a free, regular and unrestrained walk. The horse walks briskly, but with a calm, deliberate and even step, each clearly marked, distinct and equally spaced. The rider keeps a light and steady contact on the reins.

ORDINARY TROT: The ordinary trot is a pace between an extended and a collected trot. The horse goes forward freely and quite straight, engages his haunches which remain very active, pulls gently at the reins with a balanced and even bearing. His strides should be as far as possible equal; the hind legs follow exactly in the tracks of the fore-legs.

ORDINARY CANTER: The Ordinary Canter is a pace between an extended and collected Canter. The horse, perfectly straight from the poll to the tail, goes freely with a natural balance.

REIN-BACK: The rein-back is the walk backwards of the horse. It is correct when the horse lifts his feet and brings them down in pairs diagonally almost simultaneously, the haunches remaining well in line. The horse walks back step by step, constantly ready, at the wish of the rider, either to halt or to advance without halting.

POINTS TO BE JUDGED.

1. Smooth, supple and free action of the horse with good impulsion.
2. Obedience to the aids of the legs and reins, especially during change of pace and tempo.
3. Seat and influence of the rider of the horse.

NOTE: Whilst trotting, the rider must "sit down" in the saddle except where otherwise stated in the syllabus of the Novice Test.

4. No intermediate steps at the walk from the Halt into an Ordinary Trot are permitted. The horse must show his obedience to the aids of the legs and reins. The horse must go immediately into the pace stated in the schedule.
5. An increase in pace, at the trot, no matter how slight from the ordinary trot into the Ordinary Canter constitutes a fault. The horse must show his obedience to the aids, and his response to the rider's command, and go quietly into the Ordinary Canter from an ORDINARY trot.

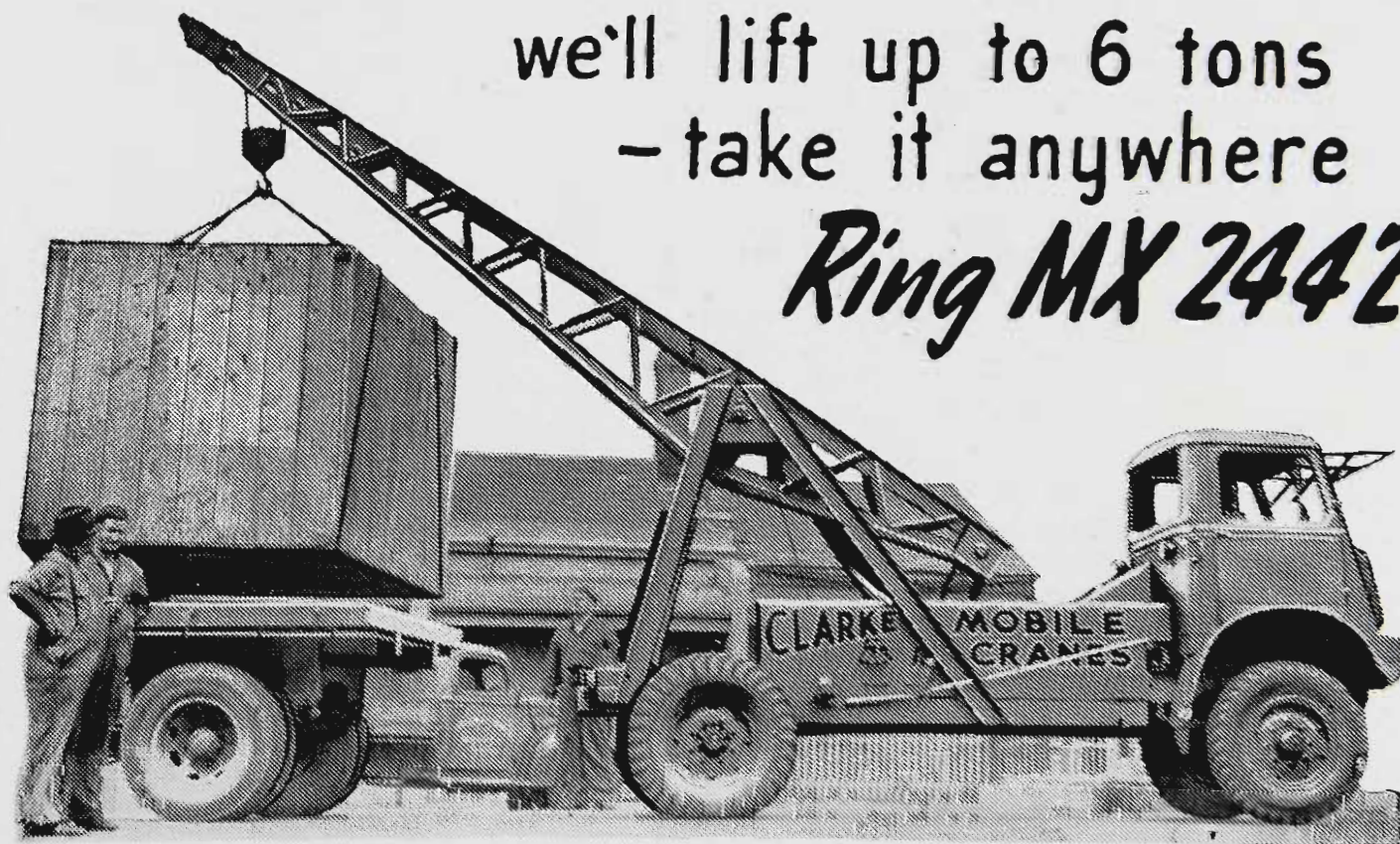

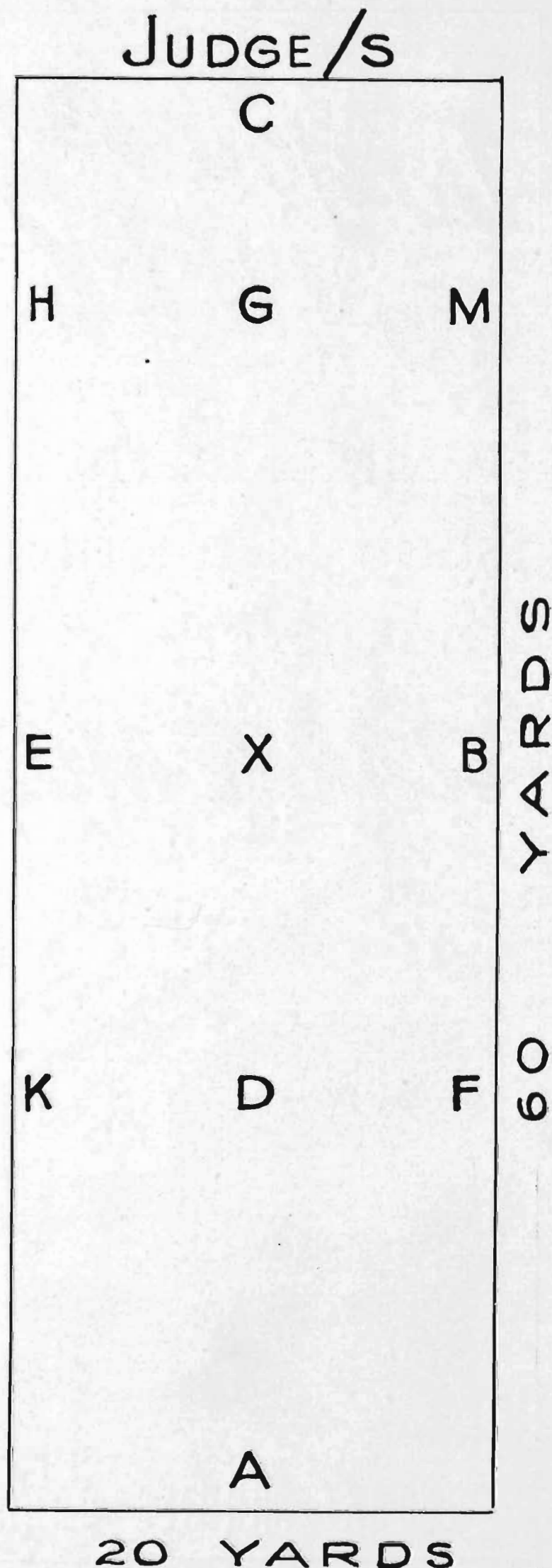

When measuring a horse, galloway or pony, an allowance of three-eighths ($\frac{3}{8}$) of an inch for shoes will be made. Should an exhibit be measured with shoes on and the exhibitor disagree with the Official Measurer's decision as to the height of the animal, he may, should he desire, have it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, in his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any horse, galloway, or pony, prior to measurement.

Please state on entry form the name, colour and correct age of exhibit, also pedigree (if known).

In all light harness Classes the judge may try the best four horses on the trotting track before making his final awards.

All prize-winning horses must be paraded. (See Regulation at head of Horse Section.)

All entrants in light horse, pony and contest sections must state performances of horse or pony on the entry form. Immediately after the close of entries, the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. The Steward in charge has been authorised to scratch any horse if it is not ready to compete at the proper time.

Owners desirous of scratching their horses for any event must notify the Hunter's Shed Steward at least two hours before the advertised time of starting. Failure to comply with this regulation will render exhibitors liable to a penalty of 10/- for each offence.

Stallions are not eligible to compete in any arena event except hunting, jumping and trotting contests.

As an indication of what is meant by "fair hunting pace," it has been ascertained that horses should complete the course not slower than 1 min. 55 secs., and not faster than 1 min. 35 seconds.

All entrants in light horse, pony and contest sections must state performances of horse or pony on the entry form. Immediately after the close of entries, the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. In this connection, first preference will be given to approved animals from other States. All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded. In all Hunting and Jumping Contests, competitors will be limited to 30.

The dates at the head of each Class indicate the days on which the various events are to be conducted. The Council reserves the right to make any alteration in the programme which it may deem necessary.

JUMPING COMPETITIONS.

Colours to be worn by riders must be stated on entry form.

In all hunting events, the stewards will insist on correct costume being worn. The Council has laid down that for lady riders the correct costume is bowler hat, black coat, yellow or light-coloured vest, fawn or light-coloured breeches, hunting stock, black boots, spurs.

Riders to be weighed after as well as before contests.

Animals 14 hands 2 inches and under are not eligible to compete in Classes 159 to 175 and 178 to 180.

In all events over fences, unless otherwise specified, riders must be 15 years of age or over.

CHAMPION PRIZES.—Champion Sashes will be presented as under: Best mare or gelding, competing singly, in Classes 159 to 179. Best mare or gelding, competing singly, in Classes 181 to 186. In making the awards, the judge will take conformation and soundness into consideration, as well as the performances during the Show, and it shall be at his discretion whether he again puts the horses over the fences before making his final decision.

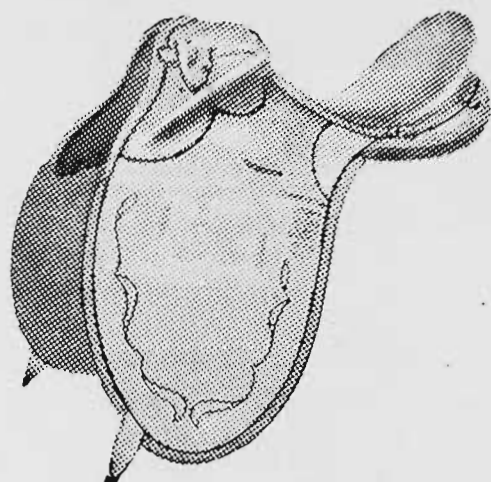

- (b) An elected honorary member residing not less than twenty miles from the kennels of the Club hunting;
- (c) A paid Hunt servant of a recognised Hunt Club, riding a horse the property of a paid-up member of the same Club.

3. The recognised Hunt Clubs shall consist of the following, viz.—Melbourne, Findon, Oaklands and Yarra Glen and Lilydale, with power to include any duly constituted Hunt Club.

PLAN OF COURSE FOR INTERNATIONAL TRIALS.

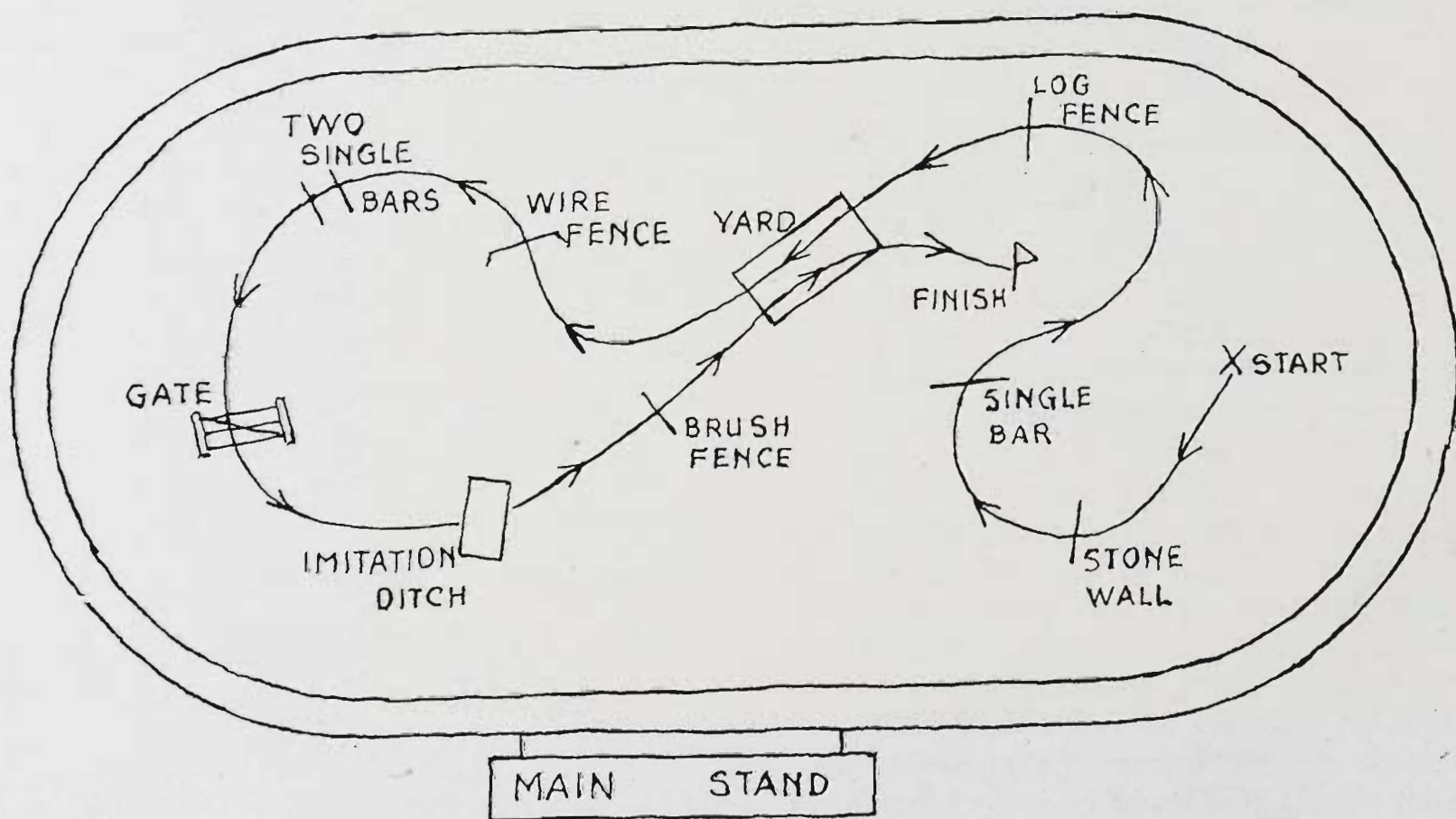
HANDY HUNTERS' TRIAL.

The following is a description of the course decided upon for the Handy Hunters' Trial (see sketch below).

Starting from the opposite end of the arena to the Result Board, the first obstacle will be a stone wall; the second obstacle a single bar, 18 feet wide and 4 feet high, without wings; obstacle three is a log fence without wings, thence to the yard (which will be 30 feet long by 20 feet wide), the gate of which must be opened, and closed after entering.

After jumping out of the yard, competitors will negotiate a wire fence, 18 feet wide and 3 feet 6 inches high, with wings, and two single bars, 3 feet 6 inches high and 30 feet apart.

The next obstacle will be a gate, 3 feet 9 inches high, without wings, and the next an obstacle made to appear as an open ditch, 10 feet by 12 feet, by laying canvas or tin on the ground, which will be held in place by two spars, 18 feet long. The next obstacle is a brush fence, 18 feet long. The fence to be 3 feet 6 inches high, with brush 6 feet 6 inches high, and with a 3-foot opening in the middle, through which the horses must jump. Competitors must then jump into the yard, open and close the gate, and proceed to the finishing point.

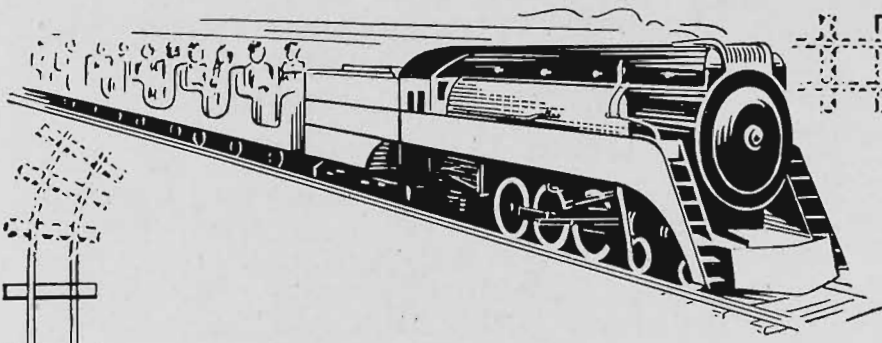

5. The competitors shall be judged solely on their riding ability—mount, saddlery or costume will not be taken into account, but special attention will be paid to hands and seat, general management and control of the horse or pony.

CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION.

6. Only holders of qualifying certificates won during the preceding twelve months will be eligible to compete for the Challenge Trophies at the Royal Melbourne Show. No entry fee will be charged.

7. The Championship Competitions shall be judged on the same basis as the qualifying competitions, but the Judge, before finally making his award, shall require his six finalists to change mounts and to execute a figure 8 on a canter, ride away from the Judge, return at a slow canter, stop at the Judge's signal and back.

8. The names of the winners will be engraved on the Challenge Trophies, and they will be entitled to hold them until 31st August in the year following their success.

9. Suitably inscribed Championship Sashes will be presented to each successive winner of the Challenge Trophies.

10. The winners of the Challenge Trophies will be eligible to compete in future years, subject to age.

11. The Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria may, at its discretion, vary the conditions governing the qualifying and Championship Competitions.

12. All entries must be lodged with the Secretary by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 20th September.

FLAG AND BENDING RACES, MUSICAL CHAIRS, ETC.

Stallions are not eligible to compete in any Arena event except Hunting, Jumping and Trotting Contests.

FLAG RACE CONDITIONS.

1. Generally conducted in heats of four.
2. Same mount not to be used by more than one competitor.
3. No person shall ride more than one animal in the same race.
4. Six flags placed 10 yards apart — from starting line to first flag 20 yards—barrel for each row (on starting line).
5. Competitors can either take first or last flag first.
6. Competitors must place each flag in barrel before picking up next flag.
7. All flags must be placed in barrels with competitors mounted. If flag misses barrel, competitor can dismount, pick up flag, remount and then place flag in barrel.
8. If barrel is knocked over, it must be placed upright before any more flags are placed in it.
9. Height of flags—4 feet.
10. Knocking down flag does not disqualify. Competitors knocking flags over can dismount, pick up flag, remount and continue.
11. Only dummy or taped spurs permitted.

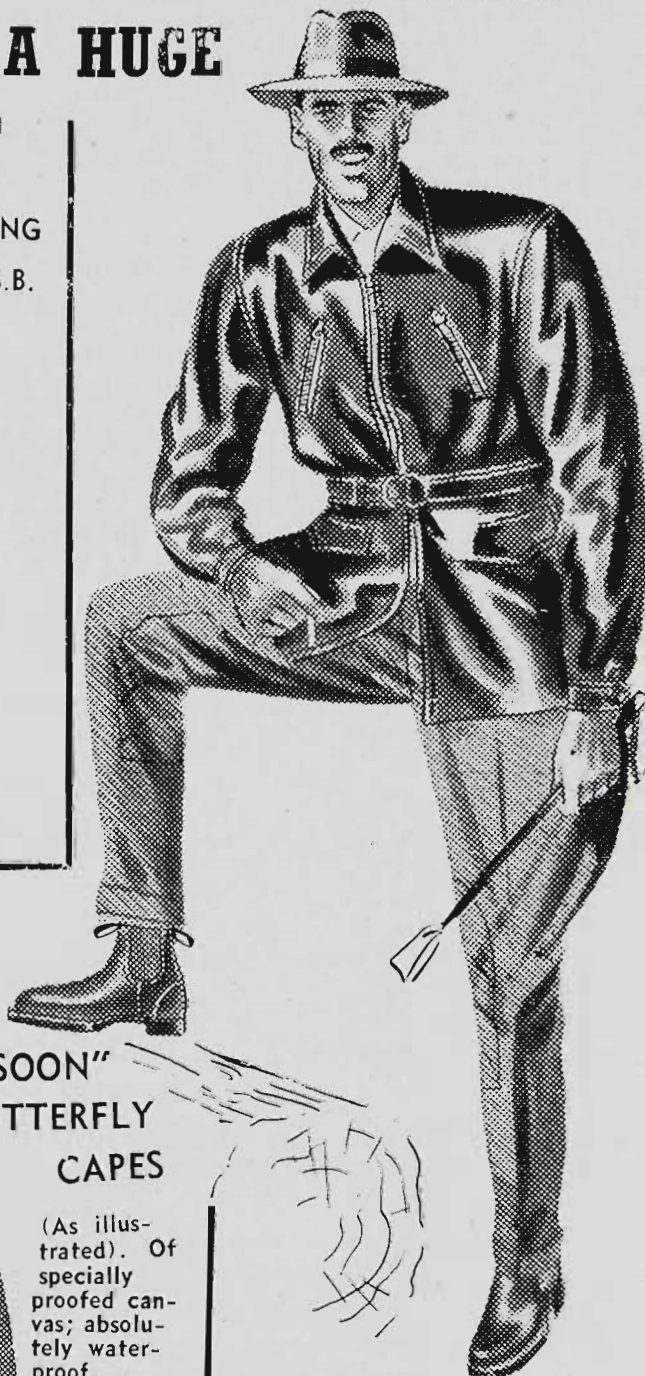

ACCEPTANCES (10/- EACH) WILL BE DECLARED AT THE TRACK OFFICE OF THE TROTTING CONTROL BOARD, AT THE REAR OF THE RESULT BOARD ON THE ROYAL SHOW GROUNDS, ASCOT VALE, W.2, at 3 p.m. ON THE DAY PREVIOUS TO THAT ON WHICH THE PARTICULAR RACE IS TO BE HELD. HORSES NOT SCRATCHED BY THEN SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE STARTERS, AND THEIR OWNERS SHALL BE LIABLE FOR THE ACCEPTANCE FEES. SCRATCHINGS SHOULD NOT BE NOTIFIED TO THE SOCIETY, BUT TO THE TROTTING CONTROL BOARD AT ITS MAIN OFFICE IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING ON THE SHOWGROUNDS.

Between 90 and 45 minutes before the stipulated time for the start of a race, every person having a horse still engaged in that race shall either scratch it or notify the name of its driver at the Office of the Trotting Control Board, at rear of Result Board on the Royal Show Grounds. All outstanding acceptance fees must be paid at the same time. Failure to comply with this regulation will make owners subject to a fine by the Stewards of £2 per horse.

Nominations will be confined to horses registered with the Trotting Control Board, Royal Show Grounds, Ascot Vale, W.2.

No horse disqualified under the Rules of the Trotting Control Board, or owned or trained by any person disqualified or suspended under those Rules, may enter for or compete in any of the races in the programme, and no person disqualified or suspended under those Rules may drive in any race in the programme.

WINS AT THIS SHOW WILL CARRY PENALTIES ONLY AT AGRICULTURAL SHOWS.

Horses may be nominated for races having faster fronts than their assessed marks. No horse shall incur a penalty merely because it is nominated for such a race, but if it wins it must take the faster mark. All races shall be run in harness.

The Stewards reserve the right to ensure a field of not fewer than six in each final. The finalists, therefore, will be:—Two heats: Firsts,

seconds and thirds. Three heats: Firsts and seconds. Four heats: Firsts and the two fastest seconds. Five heats: Firsts and the fastest second. Six to fourteen heats: Firsts only. In the event of a dead heat, both horses may be permitted to start in the final.

The minimum weight for drivers shall be 10st. 10lb. (including cushion). Weight 1lb. may be claimed for the bridle.

All trainers nominating, and drivers competing, must hold current licences issued by the Trotting Control Board.

The registered colours of the trainer or the owner (or, if the horse is leased, then the registered colours of the trainer or lessee) must be stated on the nomination form, and be worn by the driver.

All drivers injured whilst participating in registered trotting races are covered by the Trotting Control Board's non-contributory Driver's Provident Fund.

Stallions and Mares are eligible for Champion Prizes, and if competing in Classes 244 to 267 only, and intending to compete for those Champion Prizes, they must be in attendance when judging in Section 7 takes place.

Exercise on the track will be permitted daily during the Show, between 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. only.

The Society reserves the right to alter the conditions of any races, or to delete them from the programmes, if the acceptors are considered to be lacking in number or quality, or for any other reason.

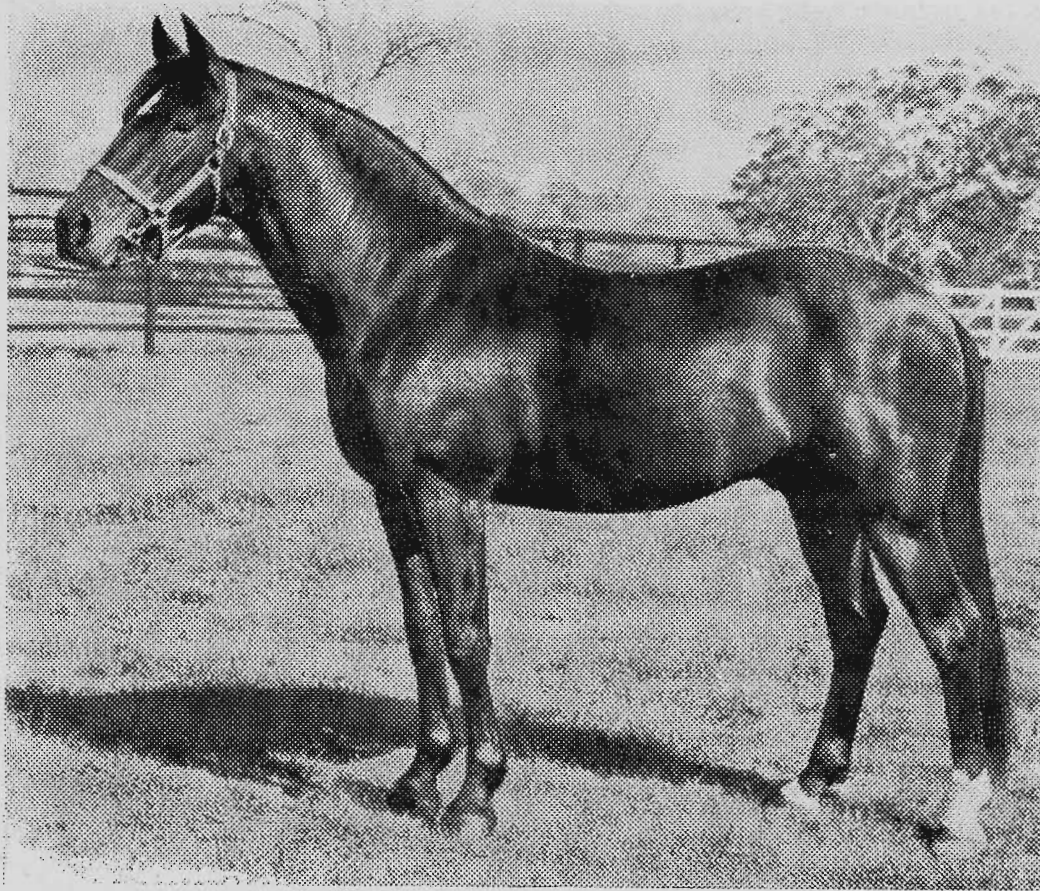

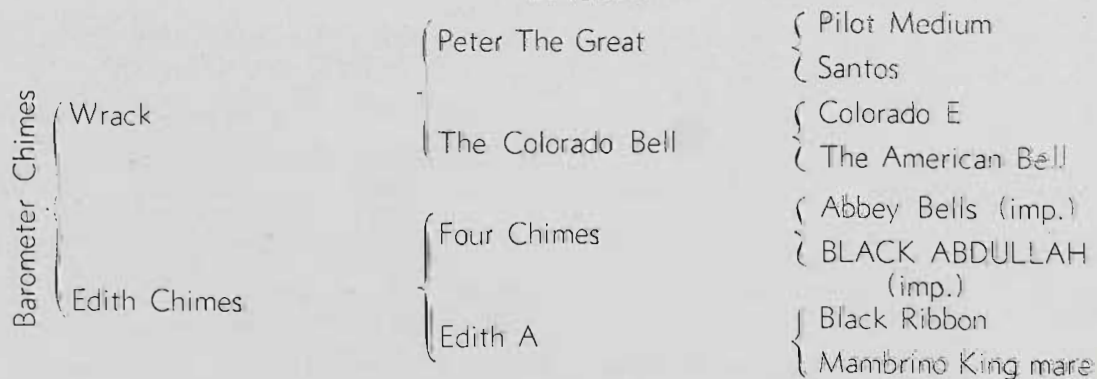

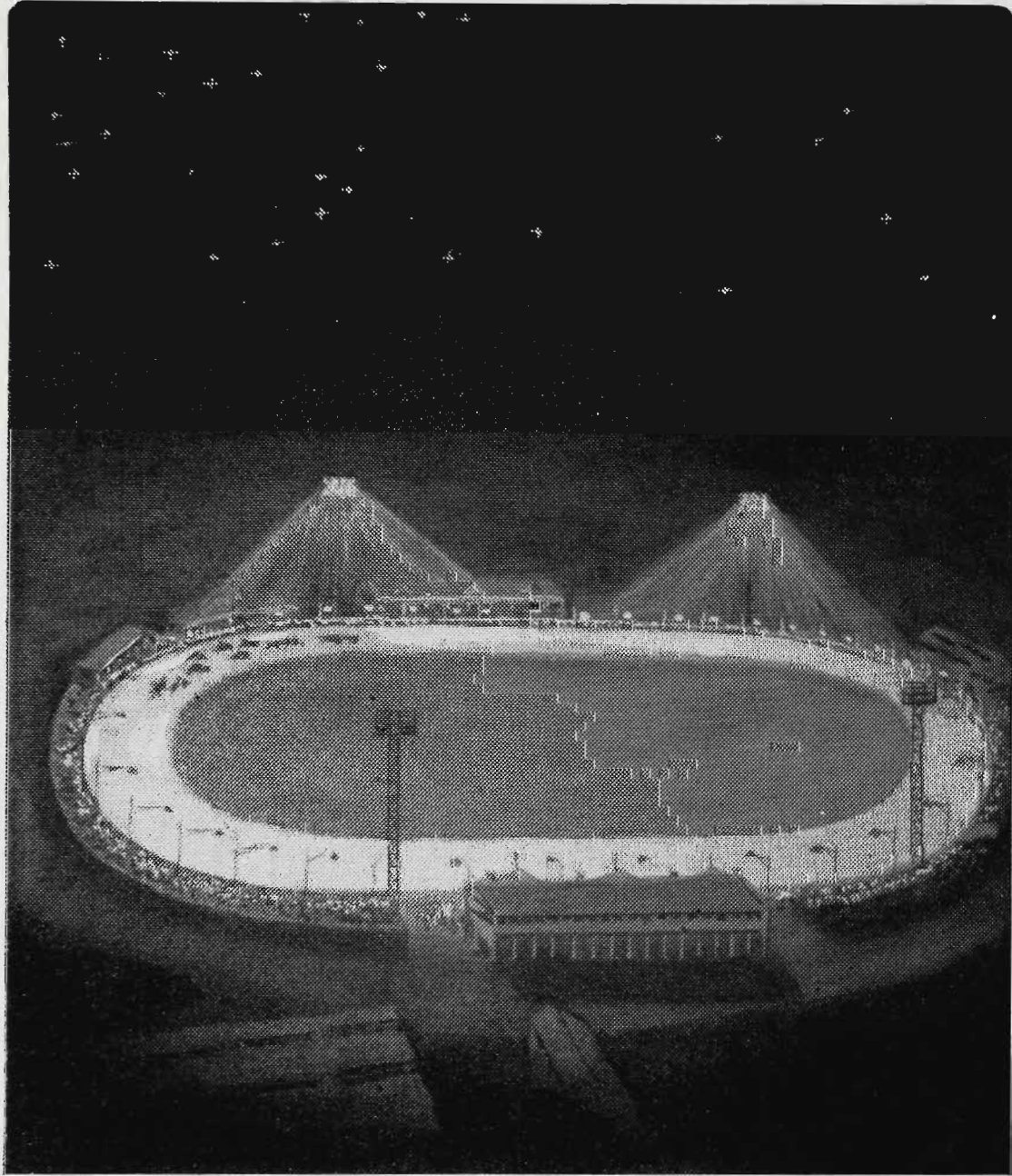
