90 seconds, the competitors changing over as many times as there is reason to do so until they are stopped by the clock.

The horse jumping the course when the whistle for time is sounded must then jump the following obstacle. The time will be taken when the horse's forelegs touch the ground; this obstacle does NOT count in the classification. If for any reason the rider does not jump the obstacle at which the clock is stopped he is gonged and the clock stopped. The team will then be placed last of those gaining an equal number of points.

In the course of the competition the rider will be always gonged at the first fault committed no matter what this may be. The partner takes over immediately and continues the course. If it was a jumping fault, the partner takes over the round and jumps the obstacle following that where the fault was incurred.

If the fault was a disobedience, the partner takes over the round and must jump the obstacle where the disobedience occurred.

Notwithstanding the conditions above, if a rider completes one circuit of the course without fault, the other member of the team MUST take over the jumping. The competition then proceeds in accordance with the conditions as previously detailed. In this competition, two points will be awarded for each obstacle jumped clear and one point for each obstacle knocked down.

In the case of equality of time and points there is a compulsory jump-off for first place only, over the same or a reduced course.

Owners will be allowed to pair and in the event of a pair separately owned winning, the prize will be divided.

TO BE ELIGIBLE TO NOMINATE, HORSES MUST HAVE BEEN PLACED IN A RACE AT A ROYAL SHOW (FINAL) OR PLACED IN A RACE AT A REGISTERED MEETING.

ACCEPTANCES (10/- EACH) WILL BE DECLARED AT THE OFFICE OF THE TROTting CONTROL BOARD IN THE NEW GRANDSTAND, ON THE ROYAL SHOW GROUNDS, ASCOT VALE, W.2, on the day on which the race is to be held. Acceptance times will be 12 Noon for day events and 6 P.M. for night events, at which times acceptance fees must be paid and drivers nominated for all accepted horses. The owners of horses not scratched by then shall be liable for acceptance fees. All competing horses must be on the grounds at the time

of acceptance. SCRATCHINGS SHOULD NOT BE NOTIFIED TO THE SOCIETY, BUT TO THE TROTting CONTROL BOARD AT ITS MAIN OFFICE IN THE NEW GRANDSTAND ON THE SHOW GROUNDS.

Nominations will be confined to horses registered with and approved by the Trotting Control Board, Royal Showgrounds, Ascot Vale, W.2.

All races are framed on inner circle country fronts and conditions.

WINS AT THIS SHOW WILL CARRY PENALTIES ONLY AT AGRICULTURAL SHOWS. NO PENALTIES FOR WINS IN HEATS.

A horse may be nominated for a race of which the front is faster than its assessment at the time nominations close, but should such horse win, it shall incur a penalty from the front of the race won and not from the horse's assessment prior to such win.

Trotters may compete against pacers in all races unless otherwise stated.

The Stewards reserve the right to ensure a field of not fewer than six in each final. The finalists, therefore, will be:—Two heats: Firsts, seconds and thirds. Three heats: Firsts and seconds. Four heats: Firsts and the two fastest seconds. Five heats: Firsts and the fastest second. Six to fourteen heats: Firsts only. In the event of a dead heat, both horses may be permitted to start in the final.

Where the acceptors for a race advertised to be run in heats are sufficient for one race only, such race shall be run at the advertised time of the final.

Heats and finals may be started from behind the mobile barrier at the discretion of the Stewards.

INDEX TO COMPETITORS—TROTTING

The minimum weight for drivers shall be 10 st. (including cushion). Weight 1 lb. may be claimed for the bridle.

All trainers nominating, and drivers competing, must hold current licences or permits issued by the Trotting Control Board.

The registered colours of the trainer or the owner (or, if the horse is leased, then the registered colours of the trainer or lessee) must be stated on the nomination form, and be worn by the driver.

All drivers injured whilst participating in registered trotting races may be granted financial assistance from the Trotting Control Board's non-contributory Driver's Provident Fund.

Exercise on the track will be permitted daily during the Show, between 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. only.

Stallions or mares entered in the trotting races are also eligible to be entered to compete for the Championship awards in the "breeding" classes and if so entered, must be in attendance when judging in Section 4 takes place.

The Society reserves the right to alter the conditions of any race, or to delete any race from the programmes, if the acceptors are considered to be lacking in number or quality, or for any other reason.

2. The winner of the "Open" Event shall be known as the Australian Speed Shovelling Champion.

4. Winners will be the first man in each heat to register one ton on the clock scale attached to his skip.

6. Times for the heats will be taken from the first blast of the starter's signal until the scale registers one ton on the winning skip.

- (C) In the event of the second or third man in any team starting before the preceding contestant in his team has GROUNDED his shovel and stepped clear of the plate, the entire team may be either disqualified or given a time penalty of not less than 10 seconds by the Judges.
- (D) Contestants may shovel from any position that suits their individual style; and may use a shovel of any weight or size.

DRESS: Contestants in both the teams and singles events will wear athletic singlet and shorts or sports slacks.

VENUE and DATE: The contests will be conducted during the last three days of the Royal Show. Contestants will be advised of the exact time and date of the contest and also where it is to be held on the Show Grounds. They will be required to report to the Stewards 30 minutes before the time that they are due to compete.

ENTRY FEES:

Single entry, 5/- per entry per class.

Two cats and/or kittens, 4/- per entry per class.

Three or more cats and/or kittens, 2/- per entry per class.

ENTRIES:

(a) Entries in wrong classes will be outclassed.

(b) The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria's Council reserves the right to refuse any entry.

(c) No entry can be changed after entries close.

(d) Late entries will not be accepted.

(e) All entry fees must accompany entry form. Fees will not be refunded should entries not be exhibited.

VETERINARY INSPECTION (8.15 a.m. to 9.15 a.m.).

All cats/kittens must pass veterinary inspection before being placed in cages. The veterinary surgeon will refuse to allow any cat which, in his opinion, is suffering from any contagious or

infectious disease, or which, in his opinion, is not well enough to enter or to remain in the Show. Any cat thus objected to must be removed from the place of exhibition immediately.

JUDGING will commence promptly at 9.30 a.m.

All exhibits shall be judged in accordance with the latest standards of the Governing Council. Judges will be empowered to withhold any award if an exhibit does not possess sufficient merit.

Governing Council Challenge Certificates may be awarded to the cats obtaining the awards of "Best Male" and "Best Female" in the Open Class in each Section. Certificates may also be awarded for "Best Male" and "Best Female" of the Championship Class of each Group.

Governing Council Award of Merit Certificates may be awarded to the Neuter Cat (9 months or over) obtaining the award of "Best Neuter" in each Section. Certificates may also be awarded for "Best Neuter" of the Premier Neuter Class of each Group.

Judges will be instructed to disqualify any exhibit upon which there is any powder or colouring matter. The Judge's decision shall be final except in cases of fraud, or misrepresentation, or where a mistake has been made *bona fide*.

Judges and Stewards may not officiate in any Section in which they or any member of their household are exhibiting for competition.

A judge may not officiate if he may have had access to entry forms, judges' books, cage numbers or catalogues.

Any cat which cannot be taken out of its cage by the Judge or Steward will not be judged.

Should any exhibitor without reasonable cause not exhibit then the Society reserves the right to refuse further entries from that exhibitor.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

KITTEN: Entire exhibit over 4 weeks and under 9 months on the day of the Show.

CAT: Entire exhibit 9 months or over on the day of the Show.

JUNIOR: Entire exhibit of 9 months and under 18 months on the day of the Show (Champions are not eligible for this class).

NOVICE: Cat that has not won a First Prize (Kitten Class wins excepted) up to day preceding the day on which entries close.

LIMIT: Cat that has not won four First Prizes (Kitten Class wins excepted) up to the day preceding the day on which entries close (Champions are not eligible for this class).

OPEN: All entire cats except those eligible for Championship Honours on the day preceding the day on which entries close.

PAIR: Two entire exhibits of the same breed and colour but of opposite sex.

BRACE: Two entire exhibits of the same breed, colour and sex.

TEAM: Three or more entire exhibits of the same breed and colour.

LITTER: All living progeny of one birth, belonging to one owner or joint owners, over the age of 4 weeks, and under 3 months at the date of Show. In the event of death, accident or injury to one or more kittens, certified by a Veterinary, the exhibit may be staged without the certified kitten or kittens (see also Show Rule No. 7).

STUD MALE: A proven Sire.

BROOD QUEEN: A proven Dam.

NEUTER: A cat or kitten that is not entire.

PREMIER NEUTER: A neuter which, having won three Awards of Merit under two different judges, has been granted the title of Premier Neuter by the Governing Council. (Not eligible to compete in Class V but only against each other in one of the three Groups. Only one award will be made in each of the three Groups provided that the Judge considers such cat worthy of the award.)

GRAND PREMIER NEUTER: A neuter which, having won three Awards of Merit under two different judges in the Premier Neuter Class, has been awarded the title of Grand Premier Neuter by the Governing Council.

CHAMPIONSHIP: A Champion is a cat which, having won three Challenge Certificates under two different judges, has been granted the title of Champion by the Governing Council. Cats in this Class are not eligible to compete in Junior, Limit or Open Classes, but only against each other in one of the three Groups. Only one award will be made in each sex in each of the three Groups, provided that the Judge considers such cat worthy of the award. Champions are eligible to compete with all other cats for the awards of "Best Cat" in each Group.

GRAND CHAMPIONSHIP: A Grand Champion is a cat which, having won three Challenge Certificates under two different judges in the Championship class, has been granted the title of Grand Champion by the Governing Council — as above.

DOMESTIC PET: Unpedigreed cat or kitten, male or female, neuter or entire — excluding Siamese.

REGISTRATION

All cats and kittens over three months of age must be registered with the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy of Australia (fee 2/-) prior to benching. This does not apply to Domestic Pet or Neuter Kitten classes. (Unpedigreed Group.) Interstate and oversea registrations of visiting cats will be recognised.

CONDITIONS

- (a) All exhibits, after passing veterinary inspection, must be placed in their cages in readiness for judging. There shall be no interior nor exterior decorations or distinguishing objects. A piece of white material in the cage is allowed during judging.
- (b) No exhibit shall be removed from the cage before 9 p.m. without the permission of the Show Manager.
- (c) No foodstuffs are allowed in the cages before 5 p.m.
- (d) Cages must be kept clean — and left clean — by the exhibitors.

Sand may be obtained from the Floor Steward.

(e) Any person causing annoyance by adverse comment on the decisions of the Judge, or guilty in the opinion of the Show Manager of unsportsmanlike action while in the precincts of the Show shall after being cautioned by the Show Manager or Show Secretary, be removed from the Show.

(f) Any complaints or protests must be lodged with the Show Manager on the day of the Show except as provided in Governing Council Regulation 29 (b).

GENERAL:

- (a) No kitten under 6 weeks of age may be shown without being accompanied by its dam, which must, in turn, be entered in at least one class. Kittens under 4 weeks of age may not be exhibited.
- (b) Pairs, Braces and Teams must also be entered in separate classes.
- (c) Castrated males and speyed females must be shown in the Neuter Section.

TRANSPORT

For the convenience of exhibitors, a bus will be available from 8 a.m. to 8.45 a.m. on the morning of the Show to transport exhibitors and their cats to the Show Grounds.

(The following competitions are conducted under the Rules of the Australian Sheaf Tossers' Association.)

N.B.—Competitors will be notified of the time and date of each class.

RULES

1. Every competitor must supply a full list of his last six performances.
2. Only three-prong forks shall be allowed to be used. Forks shall not exceed six feet in length.
3. Each competitor is entitled to three throws. If unsuccessful he must then retire.
4. The height for the first toss shall be thirty feet and the bar shall be raised progressively until the winner is declared. Each competitor's handicap will be added to his throw for the purpose of deciding such throw.
5. The bar may be raised (in feet) from time to time during the event as agreed upon by competitors and officials in charge.
6. The limit handicap shall be ten feet for all handicap events, except Novice events which shall be seven feet.

7. Competitors must be properly dressed in white shirts or singlets and white trousers.
8. Entry fees must accompany entries, otherwise they will not be accepted.
9. Entries are subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, and its Council reserves the right to reject any entry without assigning any reason.
10. The competitions shall be conducted under the supervision of officials of the Society.

Special Regulations re
Champion Prizes

(The Gift of the Government of Victoria,
through the Department of Agriculture).

1. All exhibits to be the bona fide property of exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the exhibitor.

2. For Champion Awards to be made, three exhibits must be entered (at least two of which must be duly shown), unless the Judge reports that an exhibit (even though alone) is of exceptional merit and worthy of such award. If, however, in the opinion of the Judge, none of the exhibits are of sufficient merit, he may withhold the prize altogether. Exhibits to be eligible for the award must be entered in an ordinary class.

3. Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered as required by the provisions of the Horse Breeding Act, 1928.

4. The prizes to be awarded by Judges appointed by the Society.

5. In any case where, in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture, any misstatement has been made regarding any exhibit, the prize shall not be awarded.

6. All exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

NOTE.—Separate entries are not required for Champion Prizes.

General Regulations

ENTRIES.

(Also see Special Notes in Each Section.)

1. The Society accepts no responsibility for the loss of, or damage to, any exhibit.

2. In case any live stock, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall be injured or maimed or suffering from any ailment requiring, in the opinion of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon or that of some qualified substitute, immediate veterinary aid, and the owner of such stock is not in attendance or fails to forthwith render such aid, the Secretary or his deputy may provide such aid, and the cost and expense thereby incurred shall in every case be borne by the owner of such stock. If such Veterinary Surgeon or such substitute is of the opinion that such live stock should be destroyed then the Veterinary Surgeon or his substitute may thereupon destroy such livestock either with or without the owner's consent. The owner of such stock and any persons having the control thereof shall indemnify the Council Secretary or his deputy and the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, or such substitute, against all damages, costs, expenses or liability incurred in connection with the same.

3. All competitors and exhibitors shall take part in competitions or attend their exhibits at their own risk, and in case any exhibit, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits, competitors or exhibitors, or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner or owners of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers and members, property and effects from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.

Unless authorised by the Society no live stock will be permitted to enter the Grounds other than those entered for exhibition.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

PRECAUTIONS RE MACHINERY.

4. Exhibitors hereby accept all responsibility for any damage or injury to any person or property which may be occasioned by or arise out of the use of any machinery, implement or apparatus of any nature used in connection with the stand.

AWARDING OF PRIZES.

5. It shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judge, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective exhibits, or address the Judge, unless authorised by the Stewards of the section in which they are competing. Competitors not ready at the appointed time of adjudication will be liable to disqualification.

6. The Judge may award a second or third prize, instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether, where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.

7. The Judge is requested to make a reserve number, by marking it as such, of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which the prizes are awarded in every class where the number of the entries exceeds the number of prizes offered, if, in his opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; he is also requested to give commendations when deserved.

8. The Judge shall award Reserve Champion Sashes in all Horse and Cattle Sections, and Rosettes in all Sheep and Pig Section in which Champion awards are made, and the animal second in the class (special classes excepted) to the Champion shall be allowed to compete for the Reserve Championship.

9. Any exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded, and keep the same on the exhibit during the hours of exhibition, or any exhibitor or attendant altering a Prize Card in any way, will, on proof thereof to the Council, forfeit all prizes awarded to such exhibit during the Show, and may be disqualified from again competing, and no exhibitor will be allowed to display any Ribbon or Prize Card on his exhibit, stall or stand, in addition to those issued by the Society for the year. One Prize Card only is issued for each prize won.

10. Stock exhibits wearing bridles or head stalls, with their names or the names of their owners displayed thereon, are liable to disqualification.

11. The Council may withhold any prize when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit, or when exhibits have been tampered with or improperly dealt with, and may also withhold all prizes awarded

to exhibitors who have been guilty of false statements in relation to any of their exhibits; and exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements, or found guilty of tampering with or improperly dealing with their exhibits, may be debarred from again exhibiting, and if Members, shall be liable to expulsion from the Society. Exhibitors must, if required by the Council, make a statutory declaration regarding their entries.

12. Any person insulting or interfering with a Judge during the Show will be subject to removal from the yards; and the prizes, if any, awarded to such person may be forfeited.

13. Cheques for prizes will be forwarded to exhibitors as soon as practicable after the Show.

14. Any prize or prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for six months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

PROTESTS.

15. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of £1 sterling, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.

16. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judge, shall decide the question.

17. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judge appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits, and in the case of protests, alleging infringement of the regulation, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS.

18. Details relating to the removal of exhibits are printed in the various sections of this publication. In the case of Live Stock, injured or ill, special permission to leave the Show Grounds may be given providing that the injury or illness is certified by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon. Exhibitors wishing to obtain a Veterinary Surgeon's Certificate to permit removal of exhibits from the Grounds must lodge a fee of £1 with each application. Notwithstanding the foregoing, horses and cattle may be removed in accordance with Regulation 19.

19. Any exhibit of Horses or Cattle may be removed from the yards at the close of the Exhibition each day on depositing with the Secretary an approved cheque for £10 as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the yards next morning before 9.30 a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned before the time specified, the deposit, together with all

the prize money (if any) it has won, will be liable to forfeiture; but on the animal's return each day, the cheque will be refunded to the exhibitor.

This regulation does not include dogs. Particulars regarding the removal of dogs will be found at the head of the Dog Section in this schedule.

CARE OF EXHIBITS.

20. The Society accepts no responsibility for the care of exhibits and exhibitors and competitors enter at their own risk.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING SALES BY AUCTION

Sales of exhibits (for the carrying out of which the Society will offer every facility) will be held on the Show Grounds, and the Society reserves to itself the right to decide time and order of sales in all sections. All animals intended for sale must be duly entered and exhibited at the Show.

A commission of 1 per cent. shall be paid to the Society in respect of all stock sold on the Show Grounds.

Whilst on the Show Ground the animal shall at all times be subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society and shall not be removed without the Society's consent.

The animal shall be at the exclusive risk of the Purchaser from the fall of the hammer and pro forma delivery only shall be deemed to have been given to the Purchaser.

Whilst required by the Society to remain on the Show Ground the animal shall be in the custody and care of the Vendor who however shall be deemed to hold as bailee only.

The Vendor may parade the animal as required by the Rules and Regulations or for public or private exhibition or to be photographed but he shall not be liable for any loss or damage to the animal by reason of any act (negligent or otherwise) on the part of any attendant whether in the employ of the Vendor or of the Society or otherwise.

The Vendor shall bear the cost of the feeding and normal tending of the animal whilst in his custody and shall in all respects comply with the Society's requirements.
