THE ANNUAL EXHIBITION will be open on THURSDAY, 21st SEPTEMBER, to SATURDAY, 30th SEPTEMBER (including Sunday 24th at 11.00 a.m.).

Members of the Society, on presentation of their badges, will be admitted to the Grounds and Grand Stands free.

The public will be admitted on Thursday, 21st September, and on the remaining days of the Show, from 9 a.m., except on Sunday, 24th September, when the public will be admitted from 11.00 a.m., on payment of \$1.20 for adults and 20c for children under 14.

No charge is made for admission to public Grand Stands.

PRIVILEGES of MEMBERSHIP

EXTRACT FROM REVISED CONSTITUTION AND RULES

The privileges of a FULL MEMBER shall be:—

- (i) Free admission to the Society's Grounds, Members' grandstand and other grandstands surrounding the main arena during shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society.
- (ii) The right to purchase up to two additional ladies' badges at the price fixed from time to time by the Council.
- (iii) The benefits of any reciprocal arrangement which the Society has with any kindred Society.
- (iv) Such reduced entry fees at shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society as the Council may from time to time determine upon.
- (v) The right to vote at general meetings of the Society subject to any rules herein contained which deal with the right to vote at meetings of the Society.

The privileges of an ASSOCIATE MEMBER shall be:—

- (i) Free admission to the Society's Grounds, Members' grandstand and other grandstands surrounding the main arena during shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society.
- (ii) Such reduced entry fees at shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society as the Council may from time to time determine.
- (iii) If a firm, corporation, society, company or other body, then it shall have the right to pay more than one associate members' subscription in which event it shall be entitled to as many associate members' badges as subscriptions paid.

The privileges of a JUNIOR MEMBER shall be:—

- (i) Free admission to the Society's Grounds, Members' grandstand and other grandstands surrounding the main arena during shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society.

NOTE.—ASSOCIATE AND JUNIOR MEMBERSHIPS DO NOT CARRY ANY RECIPROCAL RIGHT WITH ANY SOCIETY.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Entries will be received in the Horse Section of the Royal Agricultural Society's Show subject to the rules and conditions hereinafter set out and also those appearing at the head of each section or in each class.

2. The Council of the Society or the Director shall have the power without assigning any reason to:

- (i) Reject or cancel any entry at any time.
- (ii) Prohibit the participation by any person or exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered.
- (iii) Cancel any event or class.
- (iv) Alter the time at which any class or event is to take place.
- (v) Alter the conditions of any event.
- (vi) Remove any exhibit from the Show Grounds.
- (vii) Alter the date or time for the closing of entries for any section or class or for any particular entry.
- (viii) Transfer an exhibit or exhibitor from any class to any other class.

3. The Society shall not be responsible for the loss of or for any damage or injury occasioned to any exhibit or the property of any exhibitor from any cause whatsoever.

4. The exhibitor enters entirely at his own risk. In case any exhibit whilst on the Society's Show Grounds shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to any other exhibit or exhibitor or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society its officers officials and members from and against all damages costs claims expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits. The exhibitor shall be liable to the Society and its employees officers and officials for any damage or loss occasioned to any of them by the exhibit or the exhibitor or his agent.

5. The exhibitor shall at all times comply with the directions or requests of the Council of the Society or The Director. This shall without limiting the generality of the foregoing apply to the entry of the horse the exhibitor the conditions of event the conduct of the exhibitor the conducting of the event the decisions of the Judge and the awarding of the prize.

6. The Council of the Society and the Director reserve the right to adjudicate on any entry or upon any question in dispute or doubt and to make any determination upon any matter whether covered by the conditions of entry or not and the decision so made shall be final and binding and the Society shall thereby have sole and absolute control of all matters affecting the conduct of the Show and the exhibits and exhibitors. There shall be no right of appeal to any court of law or other body from any decision made by the Council of the Society or the Director.

7. An exhibit or exhibitor shall not be eligible to compete in any class by reason of the Society's acceptance of the entry and/or the inclusion of the exhibit or exhibitor in the Society's catalogue or by reason of an Exhibit Entry Ticket or number or other document having been printed allotted or issued by the Society.

8. Unless otherwise stated all exhibits in Sections 1 to 14 (excluding Riding Competitions) must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry or be held by him under written lease in existence at the time of entry and the Council of the Society or the Director shall have the power to recognise or reject such lease at it deems fit. The owner or lessee hereby indemnifies the Society against all claims from any cause made against the Society in respect of such animal at the instance of any other person.

9. An exhibit sold after the date of entry and before the time of judging shall not be entitled to compete unless with the approval of the Council of the Society or the Director.

10. No entry can be changed by the exhibitor after entries close. The Director and the Society shall however have the power to do so at any time and in so doing may without limiting the generality of the foregoing alter the class for which the animal is entered.

11. All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society unless otherwise permitted by the Director.

12. Entries in the Horse Section of the Show with the exception of Trotting events must be made at the Society's office at the Administration Building at the Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale 3032, on or before 4.30 p.m. on 21st June, or be delivered by post to the said office on or before the same time viz.: the 21st June, at 4.30 p.m.

13. The appropriate entry fee as set out in the Schedule of Prizes shall be forwarded with each entry. No rebates of fees for withdrawn entries will be made.

14. Entries in Sections 12 and 14 shall be accompanied with a fee of 10 cents per exhibit as a contribution towards the Overseas Fund of The Equestrian Federation of Australia.

15. All entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor or his authorised agent or in the appropriate case by the competitor.

16. No exhibit in Sections 1 to 13 inclusive may be entered in more than one Ordinary Class unless otherwise stated at the head of the Section. Sweepstakes special classes or championships do not count as ordinary classes. Throughout the Schedule Special Classes are designated with a star (*). Should any exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class such exhibit shall compete in the first class in which its name appears in the Society's Catalogue unless the Director otherwise directs.

REGULATIONS

STABLING

17. Exhibits shall be placed where directed by the Director and where a stall or box is allotted the exhibit shall be in occupation of such stall on or before 9 a.m. on Thursday, 21st September, unless otherwise specified. The upper door of the horse boxes outside pavilions shall remain open during the days and hours of the Show. A stabling fee of \$2 shall be paid by the exhibitor for each horse/pony entered.

18. Exhibits shall not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 11 p.m. on Saturday, the 30th September.

STANDARD OF EXHIBITS

19. All male animals competing in Sections 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 shall be entire. Female animals competing in Sections 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 shall not be spayed. In this regard the decision of a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Society shall be final.

20. Exhibits which in the opinion of the Director are not in reasonable Show condition or standard shall not compete in the classes entered for and may at the direction of the Director be removed from the Show Grounds without refund of entry fee.

VETERINARY INSPECTION

21. (a) Stallions three years of age and over owned in Victoria must be registered as required by the Horse Breeding Act 1928.
- (b) Stallions three years of age and over exhibited from States other than Victoria need not be registered under the said Act but must be examined and passed by a Victorian Government Veterinary Officer in respect of both soundness and type. Clydesdales carrying a current certificate of soundness issued by the appropriate authority in South Australia will be accepted for competition on production of such certificate.
- (c) All stallions 3 years of age and over entered in Sections 1 to 9 inclusive (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 2) must be examined by a Government Veterinary Officer and if passed have their neck numbers stamped "Pass to Ring" before entering the judging ring. There shall be no appeal against the Veterinary Officer's decision. The examination by the Veterinary Surgeons will be made on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, September 20th, commencing at 10 a.m. or at the order of the Chief Steward on the morning of Thursday, September 21st.

PERFORMANCES

22. Restrictions or limitations on the number of entries in any Sections may be made by the Society.

23. Entries for horses ponies or galloways (Clydesdales and Farm and Lorry Horses excepted) must be accompanied by a performance form. A performance form for the purpose of conveying the information specified hereunder is to be completed for each horse, galloway or pony (Clydesdales and Farm and Lorry Horses excepted). This form is to be forwarded with the entry form and fees and must reach the Director not later than 4.30 p.m.

on 21st June, 1972. The closing date of entry shall not be extended. Information to be furnished on the performance form is:

- (a) Name of horse or pony (a separate form is to be completed for each exhibit);
- (b) Age of horse or pony (state day, month and year of foaling, if known);
- (c) Prizes gained by the horse or pony nominated, viz.: Name of Show; Date of Show; Prizes — first, second or third, etc. (if a horse or pony was exhibited without gaining a prize, such is to be stated);
- (d) Name of exhibitor;
- (e) Remarks (Briefly to be stated the nature of the class in which the exhibit was entered and/or gained prizes. The approximate number of exhibits in such class to be given).

AGE OF EXHIBITS

24. The breeding year commences on the 1st August in each year. The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision shall be final in regard to age.

HEIGHT OF EXHIBITS

25. Where height is stipulated the exhibit must be measured and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement shall be transferred to its appropriate class. The Society's duly appointed measurer will be in attendance on the Show Grounds on Tuesday, 19th and Wednesday, 20th, commencing at 10 a.m. on Thursday, 21st September, at 8 a.m. and on each remaining day of the Show from 9.30 a.m. to 10 a.m. The measurer shall write the measurement of each exhibit he measures on the neck number of such exhibit.

26. When measuring an exhibit an allowance of half an inch for shoes may be made by the measurer. Should an exhibit be measured with its shoes on the exhibitor may if he so desires have the horse re-measured without shoes. The measurer may in his discretion request the removal of shoes from any exhibit and re-measure the horse without shoes.

27. Should the Society have appointed more than one measurer then an exhibit having been measured and its height written on the neck number by one of such measurers shall not be submitted for measurement or re-measurement to one of the other measurers.

28. Except as provided in the next rule the decision of the measurer shall be final.

29. The judge of a class may request any exhibit to be re-measured. In such case the exhibit shall be re-measured by the Steward in charge of the class and the height then decided upon by the Steward shall be final.

ENTRY TICKETS TO SHOW

30. An entry ticket will be issued by the Society for each exhibit unless the Director otherwise determines. The entry ticket will state thereon the number of the exhibit. The exhibit ticket must be produced whenever required by the Society or the Director or the steward in charge of the judging ring.

NUMBERS (WEARING OF AND COLLECTION)

31. Numbers corresponding to the number in the Catalogue must be worn by each exhibit or competitor when appearing before the Judge.

REGULATIONS

Neck numbers for horses must be collected from the office of one of the horse Superintendents. Competitors' numbers for Riding Competitions Jumping Contests and Novelty Events must be collected from the office of the Horse Superintendent Eastern Area.

HOURS OF OPENING OF PAVILIONS AND CLEANING OUT

32. With the exception of Saturdays, Sunday and Thursday (Show Day) the Horse Pavilion will remain open to the public until 7 p.m. On Saturdays and Show Day they will remain open until 9 p.m., but will close between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. On Sunday, the Horse Pavilion will open at 10.30 a.m. and close at 6.00 p.m. Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Director:

- (i) Keep each stall allotted to them and their stock in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
- (ii) Clean out their stalls or boxes before 8 a.m. each day.

ABSENCE OF EXHIBIT

33. (a) Every animal entered must be exhibited unless a certificate signed by the owner is lodged with the Society prior to the date of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete on one of the following grounds:

- (i) The animal has died.
- (ii) The animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease.
- (iii) The animal has become ineligible for the class entered.
- (iv) Some other cause which the Council or Director of the Society considers reasonable.
- (v) After arrival at the Show Grounds a horse may be scratched from competing in an event if it has become unfit to compete.

TESTS AND SWABBING

34. The Society or the Director may make or cause to be made any test of any exhibit to determine whether any drug or stimulant has been administered to such exhibit and may take possession of any such exhibit for any of the aforesaid purposes and detain such horse for such period as is deemed necessary.

"DRUG" means any substance capable of affecting the performance or behaviour of a horse by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system, or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary-digestive, musculo-skeletal or urogenital systems, and shall include anti-inflammatory drugs, coagulants, analgesics, tranquilisers, all hormones and vitamins provided however that vitamins may be administered orally.

Any exhibit which has been brought to the Show Grounds and is found by the Society or the Director to have had administered to it any drug as defined above may be disqualified for any event or class for which it has competed at the Show.

When any horse which is on the Show Grounds for the purpose of taking part in a class or event at the Show is found to have had administered to it a drug as defined above the owner and any other person who was in charge of the horse may be disqualified or otherwise penalized by the Society.

Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of a horse in any event or class at the Show any drug as defined above or has in his possession any electric or galvanic apparatus or improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalized by the Society.

CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS

35. Should the Council or the Director be of the opinion that

- (a) a fraudulent false or erroneous statement has been made regarding an exhibit or
- (b) that an exhibit has been tampered with or improperly dealt with the exhibit or exhibitor may be dealt with in accordance with Rule 61.

MARSHALLING AND JUDGING

36. Exhibits and/or exhibitors entered in events judged on the arena other than the first day of the Show shall be present in the Marshalling Yard adjacent to the western entrance gate to the arena (next to the Result Board) at least 5 minutes prior to the time specified in the Time Table for the event to take place, and be ready to move to judging ring under direction of the Marshal. The exhibits and/or exhibitors not so presented shall not be permitted to enter the arena or take part in the event.

Riders in jumping events shall be present in the Marshalling Yard and ready to walk the course 20 minutes prior to the time stated in the Time Table for the event to commence.

37. Exhibits shall be ineligible for judging if fitted with bearing reins. No spurs other than dummy spurs not exceeding $\frac{3}{4}$ " in length may be used.

38. The Society or the Director may alter the judge for any particular event at any time it or he deems fit.

39. No person shall in any way consult or interfere with or attempt to interfere with the judge or endeavour to interfere with his freedom of choice or judgement.

Persons in charge of exhibits must not leave their exhibits unattended and such persons or exhibitors shall not address the judge unless authorized by the Steward in Charge of the class or the Judge himself.

40. The Judge may award a second or third prize, instead of a first, or may withhold a prize altogether, where he considers the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.

41. The Judge is requested to make a reserve number, by marking it as such, of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which the prizes are awarded in every class where the number of the entries exceeds the number of prizes offered, if, in his opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; he is also requested to give commendations when deserved.

42. No exhibit or person in charge thereof shall be equipped with, wear or display anything which indicates the ownership of the exhibit.

43. All exhibitors and competitors shall accept the decision of the Judge as final as to the merits of the exhibit or competitor and no appeal shall be allowed therefrom to any court of law or other body on the question of merit of the exhibit.

44. All prize cards awarded at the Show shall be exhibited in the stall or box for the duration of the Show.

REGULATIONS

DRESSAGE CONTESTS

45. Competitors in Dressage must abide by the order of the draw and present themselves before the Judge or his steward at the time nominated. Competitors must be prepared to compete at least 15 minutes prior to scheduled time. Failure to abide by this regulation will entail disqualification, and may entail non-acceptance of entry in subsequent dressage classes at the Show and/or refusal of nomination at any subsequent Show.

PROTESTS

46. An exhibitor or competitor may protest against an award won by an exhibit or competitor in the same class alleging infringement of the rules or ineligibility.

47. Such protest shall be addressed to the Director and be lodged at his office at the 1st Floor, Administrative Building, cnr. DeGraves Street and Plummer Avenue, Show Grounds, before 12 noon the day after the award in question has been made. Such protest shall be accompanied with a deposit of \$5.00 which may be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found to be unfounded or frivolous.

48. Protests and all matters arising therefrom shall be determined by either the Council of the Society or the Director.

49. Should any exhibit which has been awarded a prize be disqualified the next in order of award does not necessarily become entitled to the prize.

VETERINARY SERVICES

(a) The Society will appoint a Panel of Veterinary Surgeons to provide a service to exhibitors.

(b) Should a horse become ill or suffer an injury then one of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons may attend to and treat such animal in the absence of any authority from the owner and the Society or its Veterinary Surgeon shall not be liable in any way for any loss arising out of such treatment.

50. Exhibitors may employ a Veterinary Surgeon who is not a member of the Society's panel but in such instances must inform the Society's Horse Superintendent of the stock concerned.

51. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons may refuse to attend an animal previously examined and treated by a Veterinary Surgeon who is not a member of the Society's Panel.

52. Unless otherwise specifically stated, only members of the Society's Veterinary Panel may give Veterinary Certificates required by the Society.

53. If in the opinion of one of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons an animal on the Show Grounds should be destroyed or removed from the Show Grounds the Society or the Director shall be entitled to have the animal destroyed and/or removed from the Show Grounds or shall be entitled to require the owner or his deputy at the Show Grounds to forthwith remove the animal from the Show Grounds. All costs incurred by the Society in connection with such animal shall be paid by the owner to the Society.

PARADES

54. Each exhibit is required to take part in Parades on the Arena at the times set out in the printed programme. Failure to parade may entail non-acceptance at any subsequent Show.

Led exhibits must not wear any clothing or boots.
55. Each exhibit shall wear its exhibit (neck) number and riders of horses shall wear formal or hacking attire. No ribbons may be worn on exhibits or competitors other than those won during the current Show.

SUITABILITY OF ATTIRE

56. Riders of horses in Grand Parades or any classes (other than jumping and novelty events) must wear formal or hacking attire.

FEED LOCKERS

57. Several feed stalls are available for Exhibitors. Charge \$10 during the currency of the Show. Where feed sheds are shared, the exhibitors concerned shall be required to pay the appropriate share of the charge. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the passageways of the Horse Pavilions.

No bedding other than straw or hay, may be used in any boxes or stalls. For the convenience of exhibitors fodder merchants will be situated on the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc., delivery of which must be made before 9 a.m. each day during the Show.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS

58. Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 11.15 p.m. on Saturday, 30th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds. The Society or the Director shall have the right to remove any vehicle at any time from the Show Grounds.

EXERCISING HORSES

59. Unless otherwise determined, the exercising of all horses, will be allowed on the trotting track only, between 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. on any day of the Show.

On the Sunday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday immediately preceding the commencement of the Show, ridden and driven exhibits will be allowed to exercise on the trotting track from 9 a.m. until 12 noon in accordance with the following schedule.

Horses may only be exercised in the arena at the above times and on the exercise areas provided. They shall not exercise on any other part of the Show Grounds.

FIRE REGULATIONS

60. The use of primus or similar stoves or any heating or lighting appliance of a like nature or any naked light is strictly prohibited in or near any horse stall or pavilion.

The alteration of or interference with any electrical wiring switch or plug is strictly forbidden.

CLYDESDALES

CONTROL OF SHOW

61. Should the Council or the Director be of the opinion that any rule or regulation whether set out in these rules or at the heading of a section or class has been broken or not observed or performed then the exhibit or exhibitor may be disqualified, suspended for any period, fined or otherwise penalized at the discretion of the Council of the Society or the Director.

The whole of the Show the events thereat the exhibits and exhibitors and their agents shall be under the complete control of and subject to the decisions and directions of the Council of the Society and/or the Director. Any decision or direction made by either shall be final and binding and no exhibitor shall have any right or cause of action against the Society or the Members of the Council or the Director or any right to approach or seek relief from any Court because of any decision made by either the Council or the Director.

DEFINITION

62. "Director" means and includes the person holding the office of Director or the Society and includes a Deputy appointed by him.

"Exhibitor" includes competitor and/or rider wherever the contest permits and includes his agent or anyone acting or purporting to be acting on his behalf whether or not he is employed by the exhibitor.

"Society" includes the Council of the Society.

Singular words include plural.

"Class" includes event and "event" includes "class".

"Class" also includes trophy competition or any other award.

No appeal against a Government Veterinary Officer's decision will be entertained.

Stallions will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 20th September, commencing at 10 a.m.

All horses must be paraded. (See Regulation at head of Horse Section.)

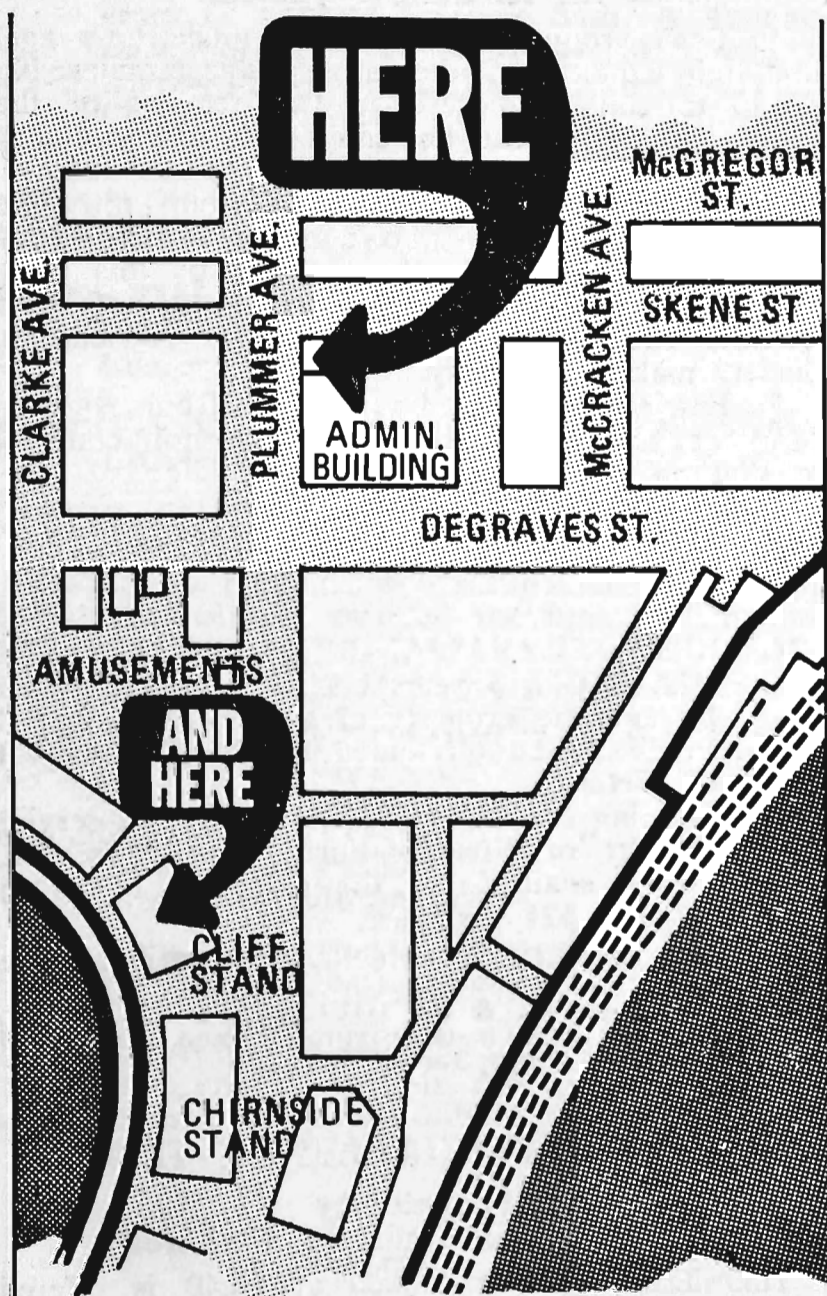

An exhibit must compete and qualify in an ordinary class before becoming eligible for Champion Prizes.

Where height is stipulated, horses must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct Class. Where a definite weight is specified, the horse must, in the opinion of the judge, be suitable for carrying such weight.

Saddle Horses and Saddle Galloways will not be classified prior to judging, but the Society reserves the right to alter the classification of the original entry.

In the Esquire Equestrienne Turnout class ladies must wear black bowler hat, black or dark coat, stock or collar and tie, breeches and black riding boots.

Gentlemen (16 years and over):

In hack classes gentlemen should wear bowler or felt hat or hunting cap, riding coat, collar and tie (not a stock) either breeches and riding boots or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.

Girls and Boys (under 16 years):

In hack classes, girls and boys under 16 years of age, should wear felt hat or hunting cap, riding coat, collar and tie, jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.

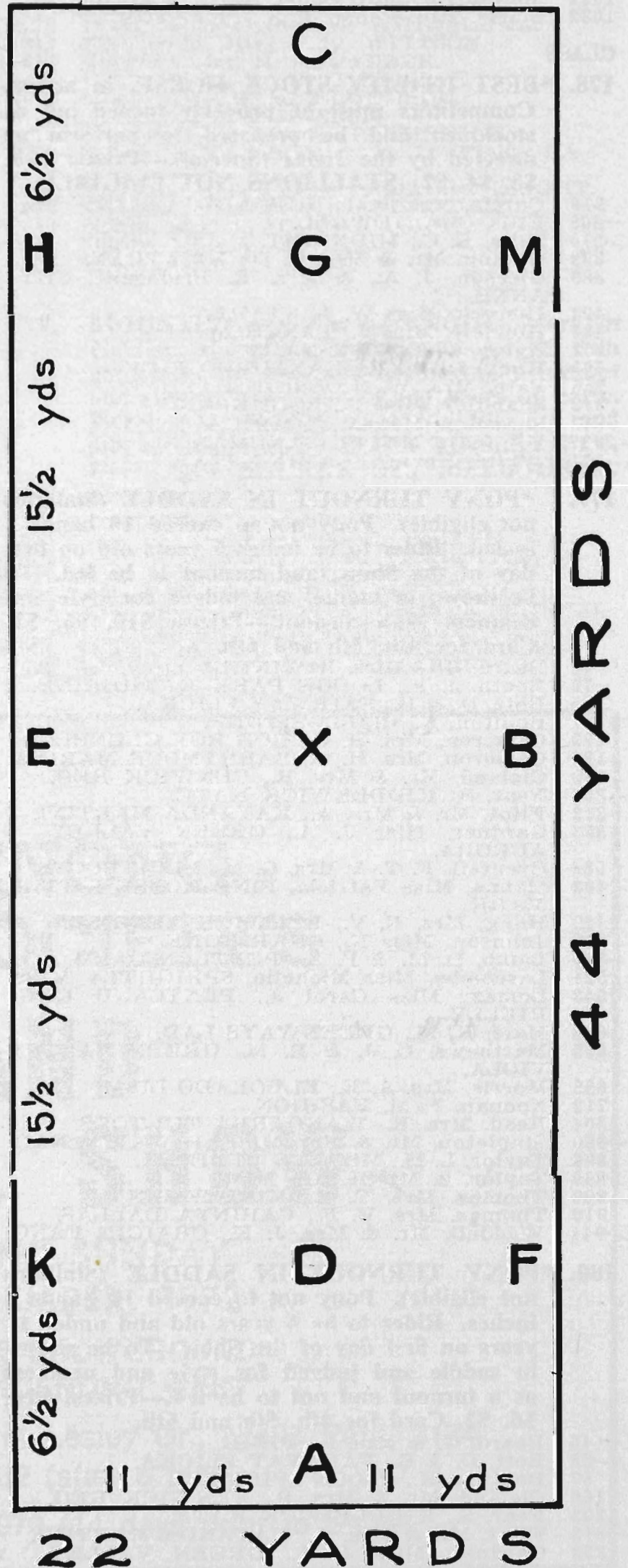

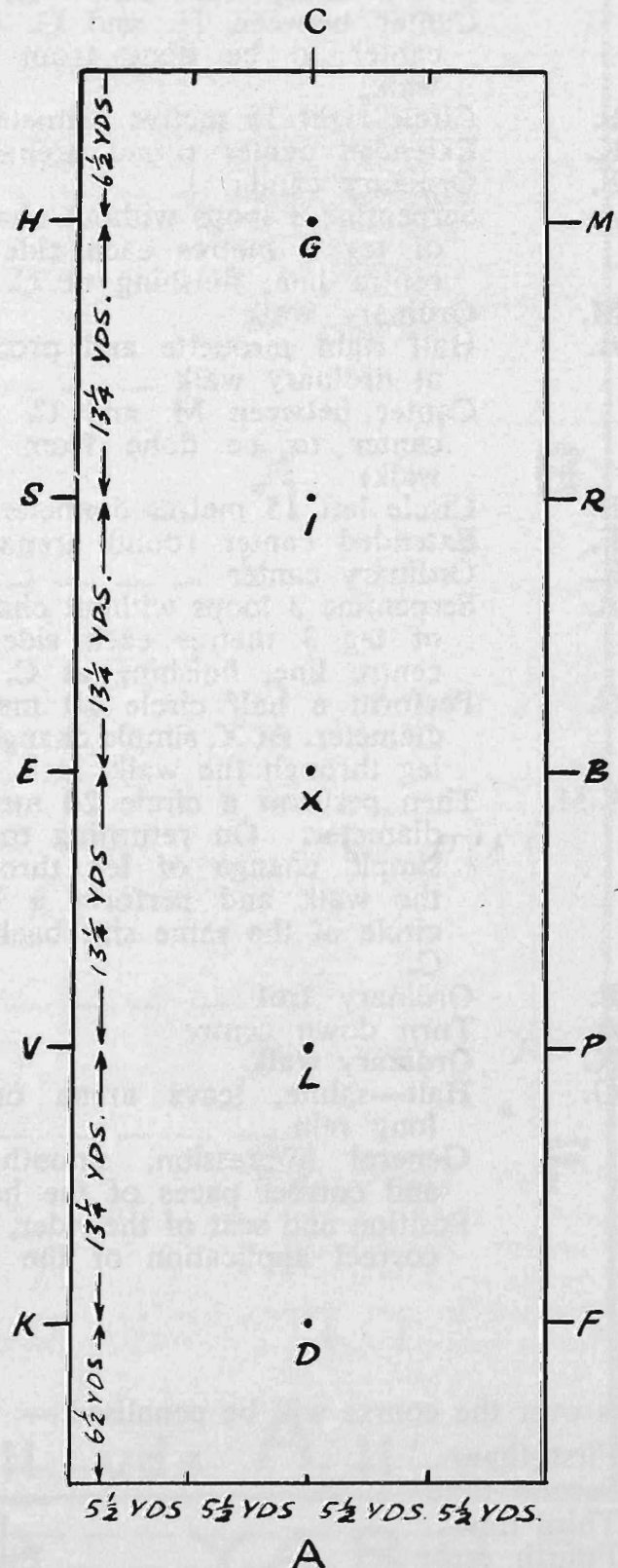

RIDING COMPETITIONS

A horse may be ridden by only one competitor in each Class.

In riding competitions for adults, from 10 to 12 competitors will be tested at a time. Eliminations will follow a preliminary walk, trot and canter. The remaining competitors will be tested at the discretion of the Judges.

In riding competitions for children, the tests will be at the discretion of the Judge.

DRESS

Ladies (16 years and over):

In riding competitions ladies should wear either:—

- Black bowler hat, black or dark coat, stock or collar and tie, breeches and black riding boots; or
- Felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock), jodhpurs and jodhpur boots.

Gentlemen (16 years and over).

In riding competitions gentlemen should wear bowler or felt hat or hunting cap, riding coat, collar and tie (not a stock), either breeches and riding boots or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.

Girls and Boys (under 16 years):

In riding competitions, girls and boys under 16 years of age, should wear felt hat or hunting cap, riding coat, collar and tie, jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.

In competitions, competitors under the age of 21 years must supply proof of age with entry unless—

- A birth certificate has been previously furnished to the Society.
- The age of the competitor was accepted for the 1954 or subsequent Shows.

Proof of age will be accepted in the form of birth certificate, extract of birth entry, statutory declaration, baptismal certificate or school certificate.

Stallions are not eligible for use in Riding Competitions.

SADDLERY

Ordinary snaffle (with or without a dropped nose band), a simple double bridle or ordinary pelham must be used.

3. Such competitions to be named "The Good Hands Qualifying Riding Competitions," and the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria to provide suitable certificates for presentation to the winners.

4. The holder of a R.A.S. Qualifying Certificate, won in the same year, shall not be eligible to compete.

5. The competitors shall be judged solely on their riding ability — mount, saddlery or costume will not be taken into account, but special attention will be paid to hands and seat, general management and control of the horse or pony.

CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION

6. Only holders of qualifying certificates won during the preceding twelve months will be eligible to compete for the Challenge Trophies at the Royal Melbourne Show. No entry fee will be charged.

7. The Championship Competition shall be judged on the same basis as the qualifying competitions, but the Judge, before finally making his award, shall require his six finalists to execute a figure 8 at a canter, ride away from the Judge, return at a slow canter, stop at the Judge's signal and back, all six using the mount or mounts selected by the Society from horses ridden in this competition. (See regulation regarding saddlery in 1.)

8. Eligible competitors are accepted on the condition that they will be prepared to provide the selected mount.

9. The names of the winners will be engraved on the Challenge Trophies, and they will be entitled to hold them until 31st August in the year following their success.

10. Suitably inscribed Championship Sashes will be presented to each successive winner of the Challenge Trophies.

11. The winners of the Challenge Trophies will be eligible to compete in future years, subject to age.

12. The Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria may, at its discretion, vary the conditions governing the qualifying and Championship Competitions.

13. All entries must be lodged with the Society by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 20th September. Note: Winners of Good Hands Championship Competitions are ineligible to compete in Consolation Riding Competitions.

Upon the signal to GO from the starter, competitors will go beyond a given line with their mount, dismount and retrieve ball, and then remount and ride to finish line, placing ball in drum, repeating once if two balls have been placed at end of course.

Length of course will be left to discretion of judge, but barrels should be at Flag Racing distance, 10 yards apart.

If ball is dropped by competitor he must retrieve ball, and be mounted when placing ball in drum.

In this event, competitors will start on the left side of the barrel and turn their horses on the right (off side rein) at the barrel.

APPLE RACE CONDITIONS

Ladies and gentlemen may compete.

Judge will use his discretion as to the number starting in heats.

Competitors and mounts (saddled) will be at the starting line. Upon the starter's signal to GO, they will go beyond a given line to the trough or their respective bucket, which may be held by the competitor as he grabs for an apple with his mouth. He must not touch apples with his hands. If the bucket is knocked over by the competitor he will be disqualified.

After competitor has grasped apple in his mouth from his bucket he must mount and ride to finish line. If apple is dropped on the way to finish line, competitor may dismount and retrieve apple with his mouth, then remount and continue.

JUMPING COMPETITIONS.

(Affiliated Equestrian Federation of Australia)

EXHIBITORS ARE REQUESTED TO NOTE THAT RIDERS MAY NOT RIDE MORE THAN TWO HORSES IN ANY EVENT UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

A surcharge of 10 cents per horse shall be imposed on all horses, galloways and ponies entered in Sections 12 and/or 14. This surcharge, which must be remitted with the entry fees, shall be paid into the Overseas Team Fund of The Equestrian Federation of Australia.

The Steward in charge has been authorised to scratch any horse if it is not ready to compete at the time directed by the stewards.

Owners desirous of scratching their horses for any event must do so with the Horse Superintendent at least two hours before the advertised time of starting. Failure to comply with this regulation will render exhibitors liable to a penalty of \$1 for the first offence and \$2 for second or later offences.

All entrants in jumping competitions must state performances of horse or pony on the entry form. After the close of entries, the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded. In Jumping Contests competitors may be limited as under:

- Group A, Maximum of 40.
- Group B, Maximum of 25.
- Group C, Maximum of 25.

All animals entered for Jumping Competitions Groups A, B, C, D and E, must be registered in the Equestrian Federation of Australia's Register. For particulars regarding registration, apply to the Secretary, Equestrian Federation of Australia (Victorian Branch), Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032.

JUMPING

Owners and riders of horses in Groups A, B, and E, must be members of the Equestrian Federation of Australia.

Competitors in jumping competitions must compete in the order directed by the steward in charge.

Exhibitors will please note that entries should not be made for individual classes except for Section Fours.

The jumping section is divided into groups.

Group A, is for horses over 14 hands 2 inches judged by the Committee to be worthy of inclusion in that Group.

Competitions in Group A will be judged under "TABLE A".

Group B, is for horses over 14 hands 2 inches whose past performances indicate that they are up to the required standard for competitions conducted under Tables B and C and Special Rules.

Competitions in Group B will be judged under Tables B or C (as specified) and Special Rules.

Group C is for ponies and galloways and horses judged by the Committee to be worthy of inclusion in the group to be ridden by riders under 17 years of age on the first day of the Show.

Competitions in Group C will be judged under "TABLE A".

Group D is for qualified hunters.

Group E is for Section fours, trios, and special competitions.

Intending competitors in Groups A, B or C will not enter for classes by number but simply indicate the number of classes in which they desire to compete.

The Committee after studying the performances will grade the horses and allocate them to the various classes.

In Group D, entries will be accepted only from Masters of Associated Hunt Clubs.

Exhibitors wishing to enter in the teams and section four events will enter in the class or classes in which they wish to compete.

(In these classes horses may be made up into teams, irrespective of the group in which they may be graded.)

Horses and galloways competing in Group A are not eligible for Section Fours.

In Group E there will be no grading and intending exhibitors will enter their ponies, galloways and horses for the classes in which they are eligible to compete.

Entry fees must be forwarded with entry forms for jumping competitions. After entries have been graded they will be allotted to classes and refunds made in respect of those not accepted.

WEIGHT

No minimum weights in Classes where age of rider is restricted.

In Classes open to all riders over the age of 15 years all riders must carry 11 st. 11 lbs. (165 lbs.).

The loss of weight during a Competition entails elimination.

Weighing is obligatory after each Competition and must be carried out in the presence of an official especially appointed for this purpose.

It is absolutely forbidden for a rider to dismount until he has received permission from the Steward in charge of the Weighing Enclosure. Any infringement of this Rule entails elimination.

Riders may weigh in with their saddles, weight cloths and numbers, but NOT whips.

In the event of a competitor being unable to make the weight, up to 2 lbs. will be allowed for the bridle, martingale and any other form of equipment carried by the horse.

Riders are responsible for the provision of any necessary weights and weight cloth.

There is no minimum weight provision for competitors in Groups C and D and Section Fours.

All jumping competitions are for amateur or professional riders unless otherwise stated.

Owners entering their horses or ponies do so entirely at their own risk, and it is a condition of entry that no liability of any kind attaches itself to the Society, its Council officers, officials or members in any respect whatsoever, other than the liability for refund of entry fees in the event of abandonment of any competition.

Male or Female riders may take part in all events unless otherwise stated.

All events to be run over course and obstacles as the Council may decide.

IN ALL EVENTS OVER OBSTACLES AND HURDLES OF ANY DESCRIPTION, UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED, RIDERS MUST BE 15 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER.

DRESS**Ladies (15 years and over):**

In jumping competitions excepting Group C, ladies must wear either:—

- (a) Black bowler hat, black or dark coat, stock or collar and tie, breeches and black riding boots; or
- (b) Hunting costume.

Gentlemen (15 years and over):

In jumping competitions excepting Group C, gentlemen must wear:—

- (a) Hunting livery of a recognised hunt club;
- (b) Black coat with stock, white breeches, black boots; or
- (c) Riding coat with tie, fawn breeches, black or tan boots.

Group C riders under 17 years.

Riders must wear hunting cap or hard hat, riding coat, tie, jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.

SPURS OTHER THAN DUMMY SPURS NOT EXCEEDING ¾" IN LENGTH ARE PROHIBITED.

RULES FOR JUDGING COMPETITIONS UNDER F.E.I. RULES.**TABLES OF FAULTS AND ELIMINATIONS**

Faults are counted in penalty marks or in seconds, in accordance with the following tables. (The only faults counted are those committed between the starting and finishing lines.)

TABLE "A"

First disobedience	3 faults
Obstacle knocked down	4 faults
One or more feet in the water, or on the marking lath	4 faults
Second disobedience	6 faults

(Faults for disobedience are cumulative, not only at the same obstacle, but throughout the same round.)

JUMPING

- Fall of horse, or rider, or both 8 faults
(Faults for the fall are in addition to any other faults incurred at the same time.)
- Third disobedience Elimination
- Exceeding the Time Allowed — for each commenced second ½ fault
(Unless it is stipulated in the conditions that this incurs elimination.)

TABLE "B"

This table may not be used if the length of the course is less than 763 yards (700 m.).

- Obstacle knocked down 10 secs.
- One or more feet in the water or on the marking lath 10 secs.
- Third disobedience Elimination
- Exceeding the Time Allowed—for each commenced second 2 secs.
(Falls and the first two disobediences are penalised automatically by the extra time taken.)

ELIMINATIONS

- In all jumping competitions the rider is eliminated for the following occurrences:
- (a) Failure to be ready to enter the arena when called.
 - (b) Jumping any obstacle in the arena before the starting signal, even if it is not included in the course.
 - (c) Crossing the starting line before the starting signal is given.
 - (d) Failing to cross the starting line within 60 seconds of the starting signal.
 - (e) Third disobedience in the whole round.
 - (f) Showing any obstacle to the horse before starting, or after a refusal.
 - (g) Entering or leaving the arena dismounted without the special permission of the President of the Ground Jury.
 - (h) Resistance of the horse during the round at any one time exceeding 60 seconds.
 - (i) Taking more than 60 seconds to jump an obstacle (except in the case of a fall).
 - (j) Jumping an obstacle without having rectified a deviation from the course.
 - (k) Jumping an obstacle not forming part of the course.
 - (l) Jumping an obstacle in the wrong order.
 - (m) Passing the wrong side of a flag, if not rectified.
 - (n) Exceeding the Time Limit.
 - (o) Jumping an obstacle which has been knocked down, before it has been re-set.

- (p) Starting again after an interruption, before the signal to continue has been given.
- (q) After a disobedience or fall at a double, treble or multiple obstacle, failing to re-start jumping over the whole obstacle except for a completely closed obstacle.
- (r) Failing to jump each fence of a double, treble, or multiple obstacle, separately.
- (s) Failing to cross the finishing line mounted, before leaving the arena.
- (t) The rider and/or horse leaving the arena, before the completion of the round.
- (u) Receiving unauthorised assistance, whether solicited or not, at the discretion of the Ground Jury.
- (v) Failing to have the required minimum weight when weighing in after completion of the round.
- (w) Entering the arena on foot after the start of the competition, at the discretion of the Ground Jury.
- (x) Failing to comply with the conditions of a competition stipulating that part of the course is to be ridden at a trot or walk.
- (y) Jumping an optional obstacle more than once in a jump-off.
- (z) All other reasons for elimination set out in the rules.

DEFINITIONS, GENERAL RULES AND PENALTIES

OBSTACLE KNOCKED DOWN:

1. An obstacle is considered as having been knocked down when through the fault of the horse, or rider:
 - (a) Any part, or the whole, of it is knocked down, even when the falling part is arrested in its fall by any other portion of the obstacle.
 - (b) When at least one of its ends is dislodged from its support.
 - (c) Any framework intended to maintain the solidity of the obstacle, and forming an integral part of its support falls. Touches and displacements, in whatever direction, do not count.
2. (a) When an obstacle, or part of an obstacle, is composed of several elements placed one on top of the other and in the same vertical plane, the dislodging of the top element alone is penalised.
 - (b) When an obstacle to be taken in one jump is composed of several elements not fixed in the same vertical plane (oxer, brook, triple bar, water jump or ditch, preceded or followed by another obstacle, etc.), the fall of one or more elements or foot in the water is counted only as one fault, irrespective of the number and position of the elements knocked down.
 - (c) If an obstacle that has been knocked down does not actually fall until after the horse has left the arena, it will not be penalised.
 - (d) If any element of an obstacle that has been knocked down prevents the horse from jumping the next obstacle it must be removed. The time required for doing this is deducted from the total time of the round.
 - (e) All obstacles with water (with the exception of the water jump which is subject to special rules) must be marked by a lath both on the take-off side and on the landing side.
3. The following are considered as disobediences and are penalised as such:
 - Rectified deviation from the course.

DISOBEDIENCE:

JUMPING

Refusal.

Run-out.

Resistance.

Any form of circle or series of circles, in any part of the course for any reason, except that a horse may circle once or more without penalty to re-take the track after a run-out or a refusal. In a course that is not marked by a continuous line, unless there is any indication to the contrary on the plan or notified by the Jury, any circle (whereby the horse crosses its original track), wherever it may be on the course, is penalised as a disobedience. Approaching an obstacle sideways, or zig-zagging, or turning sharply towards it, do not constitute a disobedience, provided the horse has not passed the obstacle.

DEVIATION FROM THE COURSE:

4. There is a deviation from the course when the horse does not follow the plan for the course as shown on the diagram posted up, as when the rider:

(a) Disregards a flag to indicate the course to be followed.

(b) Does not clear the obstacles in the prescribed order.

(c) Jumps an obstacle outside the course, or misses one on the course.

5. (a) To rectify a deviation from the course the rider must resume the course from the spot where the error was committed.

(b) A deviation from the course rectified before clearing an obstacle is penalised as a disobedience.

(c) A deviation from the course not rectified, or rectified only after taking an obstacle, whether this forms part of the course or not, incurs the penalty of elimination. Officials or others in the arena are never allowed to warn the competitor of his error.

REFUSAL:

(a) A refusal consists of stopping in front of an obstacle to be jumped, whether or not the horse knocks it down or displaces it.

(b) Stopping at an obstacle without knocking it down and without reining back, followed immediately by a standing jump, is not penalised.

(c) If the halt is perceptible, or if the horse steps back even a single pace, voluntarily or not, or retakes the track, a refusal is incurred.

(d) If a horse, having knocked down an obstacle in stopping, jumps this obstacle before it has been re-erected, he is eliminated.

(e) If a horse slides through an obstacle, the officiating judge must decide immediately whether it is to count as a refusal or as an obstacle knocked down. If he decides it is a refusal, the bell is sounded at once and the competitor must retrace his steps and re-jump the obstacle. Should he fail to do so and jumps an obstacle, other than another of the same combination, he is eliminated. Should the Judge decide it was not a refusal, he will not ring the bell and the competitor must continue his round. He is then penalised as for an obstacle knocked down.

(f) The action of showing an obstacle to the horse after a refusal and before resuming the course is penalised by elimination.

RUNNING OUT:

7. It is considered as running-out and the horse must be brought back to jump the obstacle again, failing which he is eliminated, when:

(a) The horse, not being properly under control of his rider, avoids the obstacle he should have jumped.

(b) He jumps the obstacle outside the boundary flags which mark it.

RESISTANCE:

8. It is considered to be a resistance when the horse, wherever he may be, refuses to go forward (stops, runs back, turns round more or less completely, rears, etc.).

All horses are eliminated that:

(a) Resist their riders for a period of sixty consecutive seconds during the round.

(b) Take more than sixty seconds to jump an obstacle, except in the case of a fall.

(c) Have not passed the starting line sixty seconds after being given the signal to start.

FALLS:

9. (a) A rider is considered to have fallen when he is separated from his horse, which has not fallen, in such a way as to necessitate re-mounting, or vaulting, into the saddle.

(b) A horse is considered to have fallen when the shoulder and quarters have touched either the ground, or the obstacle and the ground.

10. (a) A fall is penalised wherever it takes place within the course and whatever the cause. After a fall the rider must continue the course from the point where he fell, or from any other point, provided he does not reduce the length of the course.

(b) The penalty to be imposed for a fall is set out in Table "A", "B", or "C".

(c) When the horse or rider falls in knocking down an obstacle the penalties for both occurrences are added together. The same applies to a fall following a disobedience.

UNAUTHORISED ASSISTANCE:

11. Any intervention by a third party, whether solicited or not, with the object of facilitating the task of the rider or helping his horse, is unauthorised assistance and is forbidden under penalty of elimination.

The judges have full powers to decide whether the rider will be eliminated or not.

Bringing back a runaway horse after a fall or helping the rider to re-adjust the saddlery, or to remount, is not considered as unauthorised assistance. The course must be re-taken at the exact spot where it was interrupted.

Handing his whip to a rider who has dropped it during the round is unauthorised assistance.

DOUBLE, TREBLE AND MULTIPLE OBSTACLES:

12. A double, treble, or multiple obstacle is one composed of two, three or more fences or parts, with a minimum inner distance between each of them of 23 ft. (7 metres) up to a maximum inner distance between them of 39 ft. 5 ins. (12 metres), (with the exception for the Hunting Competitions where the distance may be less than 23 ft.), which must be taken in two, three or more successive jumps. The distance is measured from the base of the one fence on the landing side to the base of the next fence on the take-off side.

In double, treble and multiple obstacles, each fence or part of the whole must be jumped separately, on penalty of elimination. When there is a refusal, run-out, or fall, the rider must take the whole obstacle again, or he will be eliminated. Exception is made for completely closed obstacles.

JUMPING

All the faults for mistakes and resistances made at each fence and during the various attempts are counted separately and added together, but should a refusal be due to a fall between two fences it will not be penalised.

BANKS, SLOPES AND RAMPS:

13. Banks, slopes, ramps and sunken roads, irrespective of whether they include any sort of fence and whatever the direction in which they should be taken, will be regarded as double, treble, multiple or closed obstacles. Each part must be jumped separately and faults will be penalised as for these obstacles.

The Jury must decide before the competition whether the obstacle is to be considered as closed or as a double, treble, or multiple obstacle. This decision must be included on the plan of the course.

If this mention is not indicated on the plan, the obstacle must be regarded as a double, treble or multiple obstacle.

14. A bank or platform (-butte-) without the addition of a fence, or with only one pole, can be taken in a flying jump. This way of jumping does not incur any penalties.

OBSTACLES COMPLETELY CLOSED:

(15). (a) If an obstacle is completely closed (such as in-and-out, square or hexagonal) the rule for rejumping the whole obstacle does not apply.

(b) In such cases, if the horse leaves the enclosure on the wrong side, he is considered as having jumped an obstacle that is not part of the course and he is eliminated.

(c) If, on the other hand, once in the enclosure, there is a refusal or fall, the rider is obliged to leave the enclosure by jumping out of it in the correct direction. If he is unable to do so within 60 seconds or after several attempts, making in all three refusals during the round, he is eliminated. He has not the right to displace, or cause to be displaced, or to modify any of the elements of the obstacle.

TIME:

(a) Unless otherwise stated in the conditions of the Class the "Time Allowed" for the course will be announced before each event.

(b) THE "TIME LIMIT" IS TWICE THE "TIME ALLOWED".

(c) FAULTS FOR TIME:—FOR EVERY SECOND OR PART OF A SECOND EXCEEDING THE "TIME ALLOWED" $\frac{1}{4}$ FAULT. EXCEEDING THE "TIME LIMIT". ELIMINATED.

JUMPING-OFF:

In jumping competitions judged under Table A, the winner will be decided by one of the following methods (to be indicated in the competition concerned).

Table "A1". In the event of equality of faults for first place in the second Jump-off the prize will be divided.

Table "A2". In the event of equality of faults for first place in the second Jump-off time will decide.

Table "A3". In the event of equality of faults for first place in the first Jump-off time will decide.

Table "A4". In the event of equality of faults for any award in the first round of the Competition time will decide. In the event of equality of faults and time for first place there may be one Jump-off at the discretion of the Judge.

DEFINITION OF JUMPING ARENA:

The Jumping Arena will, when practicable, be entirely enclosed, but if not, will be clearly marked with flags or some other easily recognised indicator. At all times the Trotting Track will be taken as off the Jumping Arena. It will be the responsibility of all competitors to acquaint themselves with the extent of the arena and its markings before competing.

THE COUNCIL RESERVES THE RIGHT TO INTRODUCE A STANDARD AT ANY TIME.

CRUELTY TO HORSES is forbidden either in the arena, exercise area or elsewhere. A competitor found guilty of committing a definite act of cruelty will be disallowed from taking part in any further competitions at the Show where the offence was committed. The decision rests with the Judge and no appeal will be considered.

GROUP A

Competition in classes in this group is open only to horses over 14.2 hands whose past performances, in the opinion of the committee, warrant their inclusion in the group.

From the entries received, the Council will select the horses with the best performances (up to a maximum of 20 horses) to compete in DIVISION I, and the next best (up to a maximum of 20) to compete in DIVISION II.

DIVISION I—Classes 277 to 283.

DIVISION II—Classes 284 to 289.

Horses in Group "A" may not compete in groups "B" and "C", but they may compete in groups "D" and "E" excluding Section Fours.

All competitions in this Group will be judged under "Table A".

Riders must be 15 years of age or over.

The course will consist of twelve obstacles. Each obstacle is allotted a number of points according to its difficulty, namely, six obstacles valued respectively 100, 90, 80, 70, 60 and 50 points and two sets of obstacles valued respectively 40 and 30, and one obstacle at 20 and one at 10 points.

Each rider is allowed 60 seconds for the course. The obstacle valued at 10 points is designated as the first obstacle and must be jumped in the direction indicated. Thereafter the competitor may jump any obstacle in any order or direction in the time of 60 seconds which begins from the moment when the horse crosses the start line.

A bell will indicate the end of the time allowed. An obstacle will not be considered as having been jumped and points scored until the horse's forelegs touch the ground on landing, within the expiry of the time allowed when the bell will be sounded.

Each obstacle may be jumped twice only for scoring purposes. The jumping of an obstacle for the third time does not entail elimination of the rider concerned; however no points are gained for doing so.

An obstacle refused does not have to be jumped. If, after the refusal the rider wishes to jump this obstacle he is free to do so. If by his refusal he has knocked down the obstacle he must at once proceed to another obstacle. The obstacle will not be rebuilt during the round. There is no elimination for three refusals; these are penalised automatically by loss of time.

The rider gaining the most points is winner of this competition. In case of equality of points, for first place only there will be a single jump-off according to the same formula with time limited to 40 seconds.
